NOTICE is hereby given that a Competitive Examination of Candidates for the office of Inspecting Clerk of Works, in the department of Works and Buildings, will be held on the 21st February, at the offices of the Board of Land and Works.

Architects who may be desirous of competing must make their wish known by letter (addressed to the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works), on or before the 14th February.

Candidates will be called upon to produce testimonials, or other evidence as to their character, and their professional experience and attainments, and to answer such questions as may be put to them by the Board of Examiners.

Each candidate will also be required to prepare a design for laying out the grounds, and arranging the buildings which are to be erected in the Public Offices Reserve, near the Houses of Parliament, together with a rough sketch, showing the style of architecture which he would adopt.

Such sailing vessels as may receive the assistance of a steam tug for any intermediate distance will be allowed (if considered just) a proportionate reduction of the rates of postage, on reference to the Pilot Board.

EXEMPTIONS.

All vessels under fifty tons, all vessels belonging to Her Majesty, all ships outfitting to or refitting from the fisheries, all ships employed in the coasting trade, all ships regularly trading between any port of Victoria and any of the colonies of New South Wales, Van Diemen's Land, New Zealand, Western and South Australia (the master of any such ship holding a certificate from the Pilot Board that he is competent to act as trader to such vessel), unless the services of a pilot shall have been actually received, and all ships not having actually received the services of a pilot.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF TOWN AND COUNTRY
POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF
HEATHCOTE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them, and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Heathcote, in the county of Dalhousie, the limits whereof are hereinafter defined, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X.

And I do hereby define the limits of the said township of Heathcote to be the following, viz.:—Commencing at a marked post three chains and forty links, south 31 degrees and 35 minutes east, from the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section 1, town of Heathcote; thence by a line bearing north 58 degrees and 25 minutes east, sixty chains; thence by a line bearing north 31 degrees and 35 minutes west, two hundred chains; thence by a line bearing south 58 degrees and 25 minutes west, one hundred and twenty chains; thence by a line bearing south 31 degrees and 35 minutes east, two hundred chains; and thence by a line bearing north 58 degrees and 25 minutes east, sixty chains to the commencing point.
