QUARANTINE OF THE "TUDOR."

SEVERAL cases of Small-pox having occurred on board of the vessel called the *Tudor*, during the passage from Liverpool, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has ordered the said Vessel, and the Crew and Passengers on board thereof, to be detained in Quarantine at the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean until ordered to be released; and all persons are hereby required to take notice accordingly.

The boundaries of the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean are specified in a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of November, 1852.
