POSTPONEMENT OF THE BELFAST, PORTLAND, AND
WARRNAMBOOL GENERAL SESSIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to define and appoint by Proclamation the times at which such courts should be holden, and such times to alter and vary as the said Governor should think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the ninth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain times were appointed at which the several Courts of General Sessions were to be holden: And whereas it is expedient to alter the times appointed for holding the Courts of General Sessions of and for the districts of Belfast, Portland, and Warrnambool respectively during the present year: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the times appointed for holding the said Courts of General Sessions at Belfast, Portland, and Warrnambool in manner following, that is to say:—

At Belfast, from the sixteenth day of July instant, to Monday, the eighteenth day of the same month of July; and from the seventh day of November in the present year, to Friday, the eleventh day of the same month of November:

At Portland, from the tenth day of July instant, to Thursday, the fourteenth day of the same month of July; and from the thirteenth day of November in the present year, to Monday, the fourteenth day of the same month of November:

At Warrnambool, from the second day of November in the present year, to Wednesday, the ninth day of the same month of November.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MUNICIPALITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

THE following report of the several matters and questions decided at a public meeting of the resident householders and landowners within the municipal district of Footscray, held on Friday, the 1st instant, together with the list of votes for seven councillors taken at the poll on the following day, is published pursuant to the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 15.

The Honorable the Chief Secretary, Victoria.

Sir,—In accordance with the Proclamation, and with yours of the 30th of June, I have the honor to inform you that I presided at the preliminary meeting of the residents in the Footscray municipal district, appointed to be held at Twelve o'clock on Friday last, the 1st day of July, at the Junction Hotel, and now do myself the honor to forward a report of the proceedings.

The room in the Junction Hotel being found too small for the assembled people, I adjourned the meeting to an adjoining school room, when Messrs. Jones and Clark were chosen assessors.

It was then unanimously agreed that the number of councillors should be seven, and that they should receive no remuneration.

Ten candidates were then duly proposed and seconded, and upon a show of hands being taken, it was found that there were, for C. J. Harrison 62, W. H. Powell 64, A. Dove 57, W. J. Roland 51, Chas. Gordon 49, John O'Farrell 39, Jos. Coward 38, William Cleverdon 38, Francis Brown 35, and James Long 22. The assessors having declared in favor of Jos. Coward, a poll was demanded by William Cleverdon, Francis Brown, and James Long.

In accordance with the 18th of Victoria No. 15, a poll was held by me on the following day, Saturday, 2nd July, commencing about Eight o'clock in the morning, and closing at Four o'clock precisely, with the following result:—

THIRD REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 10TH JUNE, 1859, INCLUSIVE.

I.—MEETINGS.

DURING the period embraced by this report the council have held 33 meetings, viz.:—24 general and 9 special, of which the chairman, councillor Kenworthy attended 30, councillors Kelly 26, R. D. Thompson 28, Bland 30, Healey 20, Fitzgerald 24 out of 25, and James Thompson 24 out of 25 meetings.

II.—PUBLIC WORKS.

Completed.

Two and a half miles and twelve chains of footpaths.
Three culverts in Epping, Baynton, and Ebden streets.
Culvert at junction of Mollison and Hutton streets.
Purchase and erection of twenty iron lamp-posts and lamps.

In progress.

About two and a half miles of footpaths.
Foot bridge over the Campaspe River, at Rogers and Harper's Ford, in aid of which the Lauriston and Edgecombe District Road Board is to contribute £50.

Certain improvements to the eastern boundary road are being done by the Carlisle Road Board, towards which the council is to pay not exceeding £50.

III.—FINANCE.

The first portion of the Government grant received for the current year is £954 6s. 11d. This will be supplemented by the local rate of One shilling in the pound, amounting to £1188.

The certified statement of the receipts and expenditure for the half-year appears at the foot of this report.

IV.—BYE-LAWS PASSED.

No. 5.—For making an assessment and imposing a rate of One shilling in the pound for 1859. Gazetted.

No. 6.—For appropriating the first portion of Government grant-in-aid for 1859. Not yet gazetted.

VI.—MISCELLANEOUS.

On the 11th December, 1858, councillor Kelly (the late chairman) having declined to accept the office, councillor Kenworthy was elected chairman of the council for the current year.

On the 17th December last, councillors James and Geary resigned, and councillors Fitzgerald and James Thomson were elected in their stead.

F. H. Boulton, Esq., has been appointed solicitor to the council.

The new valuation for the year amounts to £23,660. The council purchased sets of standard weights and measures for the use of an inspector, but owing to the defective state of the law they cannot at present be made available.

The new ratepayers' roll for the year contains 406 names.

The levels and gradients of the principal streets have been adopted, and are in the hands of the town surveyor.

The council are now in treaty with Mr. Praagst for lighting the town with gas.

The council appointed one of a deputation to His Excellency the Governor, from the various inland districts, having for its object the establishment of Local Insolvent Courts, the result of which was considered satisfactory.

The council prepared a memorial and appointed a deputation to the Government urging them to make a survey of the proposed North Deviation Railway, in compliance with which a

survey has been forthwith promised. The council are happy in acknowledging the assistance rendered in this work by the municipality of Castlemaine, the Carlsruhe Road Board, and others.

The council has been in communication with committees formed for the purpose of establishing fairs and a corn market, in which undertakings the council was desirous of rendering every assistance in its power. Legal difficulties have, however, for the present operated to prevent anything being done.
