MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BUNINYONG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the householders and landholders at Buninyong, in the county of Grant, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act, and no counter petition has been delivered in opposition to the said petition: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

The MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BUNINYONG.—Commencing at a point in the centre of the Government road due north from the north-eastern angle of country allotment 51, in the parish of Buninyong; thence west by a line passing through the centre of that road three miles; thence south to a point fifty links due south of the south-western angle of suburban allotment 123 B, parish of Buninyong; thence east by a line passing through the centre of the Government road three miles; and thence north to the commencing point.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Buninyong."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

BALLAARAT (WEST) MARKET.

A RESOLUTION in favor of establishing a Market in the municipal district of Ballaarat (West) having been adopted at a public meeting of the inhabitants of the district, convened in manner and form as directed by the Act of Council 3 Victoria No. 19, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the establishment of such market, the site thereof to be as follows:—

Commencing at a point one chain and fifty links due north from the north-western angle of allotment 10 of section III, in the municipal district of Ballaarat (West); thence north six chains and fifty links; thence north fifty-one degrees fourteen minutes east, one chain and ninety-eight links; thence south fifty-one degrees thirty minutes east, four chains and forty links; thence south five chains; and thence west five chains to the commencing point.

## BYE-LAWS.

No. 9. For regulating the mode of voting at the election of councillors.

No. 10. To regulate the erection of shades and awnings, &c.

## PUBLIC WORKS.

Repairing bridge over Burnt Creek.  
Completion of footpaths, Broadway.  
Completion of contract, Tweedale street.  
Various minor improvements about Bull and Thompson streets.

The council have devoted their energies and a considerable outlay of money in the endeavor to procure the erection of a gaol, and the sittings of the supreme court, at Dunolly, in preference to Maryborough, the former place being by far the most central point in the north-western gold fields. The council had the cordial support of the ratepayers in their unavailing attempts. The gaol has been or will be erected at Maryborough, inasmuch as such had been promised to that place regardless of the report of a gaol commission recommending Dunolly as the proper site.

\* On 6th May, councillor Cook was elected in place of councillor Quinlan (the chairman), resigned. Councillor Day became chairman on 8th April.

By representations made by a deputation sent to Melbourne on the gaol question, the vote of £2000 for a bridge at Carisbrook over the Deep Creek was disallowed. These representations were not made from any invidious or obstructive reasons, and the success depended upon the contrast ably shown by Mr. Sitwell, of the unequal and partial expenditure of public money, considering the relative importance of this and the Maryborough district.

The amounts on the estimates for the two districts were as under:—

Being a difference in favor of Maryborough of £16,450.

Originating from this council, the ratepayers principally have incurred an expenditure towards the opening of a direct communication between Dunolly, Tarrangower, and Castlemaine, by building bridges over the Bet-bet and Wild Dog Creeks. The erection of a bridge over the Loddon would be too much for individual enterprise, but this council have already applied for such an outlay from Government, and will continue to urge such an expenditure, so that this town and district may reap a deserved advantage by lessening the distance to Melbourne fifteen miles, and acquiring a naturally better road.
