WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the more easy Recovery of certain Debts and Demands*; it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden, and that the judge of each court holden under the said Act shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall have directed that such court shall be holden at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order direct that a county court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act at the place and within the interval following, that is to say:—

At WANGARATTA, once at least in every six calendar months. And the Honorable Henry Samuel Chapman, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

APPOINTMENT OF TIME FOR PREPARING JURY LIST FOR THE JURY DISTRICT OF WANGARATTA.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the eighteenth day of July, 1859.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating Juries*, it is enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing even date herewith, it is ordered that a county court should be holden at Wangaratta, the same being a place at which a county court has not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the clerk of petty sessions do issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury district of Wangaratta, on or before Saturday, the 23rd day of July instant; that such list be forthwith prepared, and be published on Sunday the 14th and Sunday the 21st days of August now next ensuing;

that the court of petty sessions do revise such list on Tuesday, the 6th day of September, in the present year; that such list be sent to the sheriff on or before Friday, the 16th day of September aforesaid; and that the jury books be prepared and brought into use on or before Friday, the 30th day of the same month of September.

And the Honorable Henry Samuel Chapman, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS a certain building has been erected at Buckland, in the pastoral district of the Murray, at the public expense, as and for a lock-up for police purposes: And whereas it is deemed expedient to proclaim such building to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction, within the meaning of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the said colony, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said building, called and known as the Police Lock-up, situated at Buckland aforesaid, as and to be a public gaol, prison, and house of correction, within the meaning of the said Act.

TYLDEN AND TRENTHAM ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district, and from time to time to revoke any such Proclamation, and vary and alter the boundary of any such district as may be necessary and advisable: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourteenth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, a certain district, bearing the name or designation of "The Woodend and Tylden Road District," was proclaimed and defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to discontinue such road district, and to include a portion thereof in a new road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation; and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby proclaim and declare that the district hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at the junction of the Coliban and Little Coliban Rivers; thence by the Little Coliban River to the north-western angle of portion 1, in the parish of Tylden; thence east to the Campaspe River; thence southerly by the said river to the south-western angle of portion 111, in the parish of Woodend; thence east to the south-eastern angle of portion 110, in the said parish; thence due south to the Great Dividing Range; thence westerly by the said dividing range to the eastern source of the Coliban River; and thence by the said river to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Tylden and Trentham Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.—WILSON'S PROMONTORY LIGHT.

In reference to a note appended to a notice to mariners respecting the abovenamed light, dated the 28th of May, 1859: Notice is hereby given that the light on Wilson's Promontory will be exhibited, as formerly stated, on the evening of the 15th July next, and on every night thereafter, from sunset to sunrise.

The Wilson's Promontory Lighthouse is situated on the south-eastern part of that headland; its approximate position is latitude 39° 9' S. longitude 146° 23' E.

The light will be a catoptric, first class fixed white light, elevated three hundred and forty-two (342) feet above the mean level of the sea, and will be seen in clear weather at the distance of about twenty-four (24) nautic miles, allowing ten feet for the height of the eye, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The lighthouse tower is circular, built of stone, and painted white.

The light will be visible to seaward from N.N.E. round southerly to W.S.W., excepting that by the intervention of the adjacent islands the light will be eclipsed to vessels upon the undermentioned bearings from it, and for a few degrees on either side of them.

Bearings of islands taken from the lighthouse, and their approximate distances:—

Vessels steering through Bass's Straits, or from Port Phillip, bound eastward round Wilson's Promontory, may first see the light through the gap between Cleft and the adjacent Glennie Island, bearing E.N.E.; as they proceed to the southward and eastward it will be eclipsed for a few degrees by Cleft Island.

When the light bears N.E. the channel between Cleft Island and the Rodondo will be open, and vessels may steer direct for the promontory.

Vessels to the eastward of the Seal Islands, and bound round the promontory, sighting the light bearing to the southward of S.W., will be to the northward of the fairway, and should haul out until the light bears S.W. by W., which bearing will lead them clear of Clifly and the other Seal Islands.

All bearings are by compass.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 19 B.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE THE DRIVING OF CATTLE INTO OR THROUGH THE TOWNSHIP OF BALLAARAT.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18th No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that every municipal council shall have the power to make bye-laws for the general good rule and government of such municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the seventeenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, from His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, the township of Ballaarat was duly established a municipal district, under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: Be it therefore enacted and directed by the municipal council of the district of Ballaarat, that no cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or transmission, or when passing from one part of the country to another, shall be driven into or through the said township except between the hours of Six (6) o'clock p.m. and Eight o'clock a.m. in the summer, which is meant to extend from the first day of October to the thirty-first day of March in each year both inclusive, and between the hours of Five (5) o'clock p.m. and Nine (9) o'clock a.m. in the winter, which is meant to extend from the first day of April to the thirtieth day of September in each year both days inclusive; and no cattle for the aforesaid purposes will be permitted to be driven through the said township at any hours on Sundays unless such cattle shall be driven beyond or without that portion of the town bounded on the east by the Yarrowee Creek or river, on the south by Urquhart street, on the west by Drummond street, on the north by Webster street, to the Yarrowee Creek aforesaid; and all persons offending against this bye-law shall, upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty (20) pounds. (Nothing in this bye-law to affect oxen in yoke.)

BYE-LAW No. 20.—FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND ON THE HOUSES, LANDS, TENEMENTS, AND ENGINE PLANT WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT, FOR THE YEAR ENDING THE 16TH OF JANUARY, 1860.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the municipal councils are empowered to impose a rate upon all assessable property within their respective municipal districts, according to its fair annual average value, provided that no such rate shall exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of the district of Ballaarat, that a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound be levied upon all lands, houses, tenements, and engine plant within the municipal district of Ballaarat, for the year ending the 16th day of January, 1860, and be due and payable in two instalments in equal proportions on the 1st day of June and the 1st day of November, respectively, in 1859.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 19 B and 20, made by the municipal council of Ballaarat, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF ST. KILDA.

BYE-LAW No. 19.—TO REPEAL BYE-LAW No. 12, AND TO MAKE OTHER REGULATIONS FOR THE ORDERING AND LICENSING OF PUBLIC WATER CARTS AND CARTERS.

WHEREAS it has been deemed expedient by the municipal council of St. Kilda, in exercise and execution of the powers to them given by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the said municipal council, that from and after this bye-law shall have received the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, that bye-law No. 12 shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and that the following be substituted:—

1. That every water carter for hire within the said municipal district shall register his name and abode with the town clerk, and take out a license on which shall be written his name, place of abode, and the number of his license; and every water carter found with his water cart within the said municipal district, who shall not have taken out such license, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

2. The owner's name and number of his license must be legibly painted and conspicuously affixed on the off side of each water cart, and every public water carter shall have his designation as such legibly painted in letters of not less than two inches long and affixed over his door, or other conspicuous part of his dwelling, or on the premises where the said water cart is placed at night, and on neglect thereof he shall on conviction forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

3. And be it further ordered, for the better prevention of accidents by fire, that the owners of all public water carts shall keep the same loaded with water from sunset to sunrise, and if called upon by any officer duly authorised by this council, police constable, or fireman, shall with all due diligence and to the best of their ability, supply water for the extinguishing of any fire that may occur on property within the municipal boundary; and any water carter who shall fail to keep his cart so loaded, or refuse or neglect to supply water to fires when called upon as aforesaid, shall on conviction thereof, before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

BYE-LAW No. 20.—A BYE-LAW TO AMEND BYE-LAW No. 11, FOR PREVENTING DAMAGE TO THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND WATERCOURSES, AND FOR REGULATING THE FORMATION OF CROSSINGS FOR WHEELED VEHICLES OVER FOOTPATHS.

WHEREAS for the better protection of the public footpaths and watercourses of this municipality it is deemed expedient to make the following orders and regulations: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of St. Kilda, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, that bye-law No. 11 shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and that the following be substituted:—

1. That all persons having or that may hereafter have roadways for carts and other wheeled vehicles across the footpaths now formed, or that may hereafter be formed by the municipal council of St. Kilda, shall at their own cost provide, construct, and maintain a crossing-place over the water-channel and footpath in the manner following: In streets where a stone or wood kerb is now or hereafter may be laid, the crossing shall be paved with stone or wood pavement the whole width of the footpath from the interior edge thereof to the pavement of the water-channel; and the pavement shall be inclosed with stone or wood kerbing of the same size and description as the street kerbing, which it must join closely at the angles. The water-channel must not in any way be altered or obstructed, and it must be maintained at all times in as good repair, at the cost of the person having the crossing, as the other part of the water-channel immediately adjoining.

2. In the streets where a footpath and side channel is or may be hereafter formed, and where no kerbing is laid, suitable wood planks or scantlings shall be provided and fixed over the water-channels, so as to leave free passage for the water underneath, and to project into the public roadway not less than five feet from the outer edge of the footpath; and the crossing-place over the footpath shall be paved, metalled, or gravelled, in such manner that it shall at all times be as clean and dry as the footpath itself is immediately adjoining such crossing-place.

3. The materials used for such crossing-places and kerbing, and the manner of laying the same, shall be subject to the approval of the municipal council or their duly appointed surveyor; and in cases where the material or manner of laying the same, or forming the crossing-places, shall be deemed objectionable by the said council or their surveyor, it shall be lawful, after the expiration of seven days from any day on which such council or surveyor shall give notice of objection to the person forming or causing to be formed such crossing-place, to proceed in the manner hereafter stated as against parties refusing or neglecting to comply with the provisions of this bye-law.

4. All persons forming crossing-places over footpaths shall give notice in writing of their intention, and submit a specification of the manner in which the work is to be performed to the town surveyor, who shall give permission for the same to be proceeded with as specified, provided the specified manner is not objectionable and the same shall be formed without delay. And any person neglecting or refusing to comply with any of the provisions of this, or any of the foregoing clauses of this bye-law, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

5. It shall also be lawful for the said municipal council, whenever it appears that carts or other wheeled vehicles frequently cross any formed channel or footpath to any right-of-way, yard, or other premises without a crossing-place having been made as hereinbefore stated, to form such crossing-place; and any person refusing or neglecting to pay the amount or proportion of amount owing for such construction in the manner aforesaid, shall be liable to the penalty hereinbefore stated for a breach of this bye-law.

6. Any person who shall ride or drive any horse, beast, cart, or other wheeled vehicle across any of the public footpaths and water-channels, or cause such to be crossed with any horse, beast, cart, or other wheeled vehicle, excepting the channels in the carriage-ways at the intersections of the public streets, unless over or by means of a crossing-place formed in one or other of the ways hereinbefore stated; and any person so offending shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds for the first offence, and not exceeding Ten pounds for the second or subsequent offences.

7. The owner or occupier of any building, premises, or land who shall cause or suffer any water to be discharged or to overflow from any building, premises, or land, into, on, or over

any public footpath or highway within the said municipal district, shall, upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds; provided that if such owner or occupier shall make and maintain such drains leading through and under the adjoining path as shall be necessary to discharge the rain-water from such building, premises, or land into the public water tables, channels, or gutters at the expense of such owner or occupier, or respective owners or occupiers, and under the superintendence and to the satisfaction of the surveyor or other officer appointed by the council for that purpose, he or they shall not be liable to the penalty imposed in this clause.

8. The owner or occupier of any building or premises who shall cause or suffer any water other than rain-water to be discharged from his premises into the public water tables, channels, or gutters, shall, on conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 19 and 20, made by the municipal council of St. Kilda, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council. Gazetted on the 19th day of July, 1859, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.
