REWARDS FOR THE DISCOVERY OF ILLICIT DISTILLATION.

IT is hereby notified that rewards in amount from £10 to £50 will be given for such information as may lead to the detection and conviction of persons engaged in illicit distillation.

THE attention of persons using nets in any bay, estuary, or other influxion of the sea, or any river in Victoria, is directed to the second clause of the Act 22 Victoria No. 77, by which it is prescribed that such persons shall register their names, places of abode, &c., at the nearest court of petty sessions. A penalty not exceeding Five pounds is prescribed by the third section in cases in which nets shall be used by persons who do not register themselves.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*, it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within the said colony, which should from time to time be proclaimed by the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments respectively of the place or district where the same are or shall be situated within the said colony, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected in the said colony, and of the prisoners confined within the same: And whereas certain buildings and premises have been constructed and built at Kilmore, in the county of Dalhousie, and it is expedient to proclaim the same in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the buildings and premises situate at Kilmore aforesaid, recently constructed and built as and for a gaol, to be a gaol, prison, house of correction, and penal establishment for the district of Kilmore, for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Act.

PREPARATION OF JURY LISTS FOR THE JURY DISTRICTS OF AMHERST AND WEDDERBURNE.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of July, 1859.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for regulating Juries*, it is enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff: and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing even date herewith, it is ordered that county courts shall be holden at Amherst and Wedderburne, the same being places at which county courts have not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order direct that jury lists shall be prepared for the jury districts of Amherst and Wedderburne, in the manner and within the intervals hereinaft stated, that is to say:—

The clerk of petty sessions at Amherst shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury district of Amherst, on or before Friday, the 29th day of July instant;

such list shall be prepared forthwith, and shall be published on Sunday, the 14th day of August now next ensuing; the court of petty sessions shall revise such list on Tuesday, the 23rd day of August aforesaid; such list shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Friday, the 26th day of August aforesaid; and the jury books shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Friday, the 2nd day of the month of September in the present year.

The clerk of petty sessions at Wedderburne shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury district of Wedderburne, on or before Friday, the 29th day of July instant; such list shall be prepared forthwith, and shall be published on Sunday, the 21st day of August now next ensuing; the court of petty sessions shall revise such list on Tuesday, the 30th day of August aforesaid; such list shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Friday, the 2nd day of September in the present year; and the jury books shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Saturday, the 10th day of September aforesaid.

And the Honorable Henry Samuel Chapman, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the more easy Recovery of certain Debts and Demands*, it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden, and that the judge of each court holden under the said Act shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall have directed that such court shall be holden at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act at the places and within the intervals following, that is to say:—

At AMHERST, once at least in every three calendar months.

At WEDDERBURNE, once at least in every three calendar months.

BALLAARAT MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW No. X.—A BYE-LAW FOR PRESCRIBING THE FORMS, AREAS, ETC., OF CLAIMS WITHIN THE MINING BOARD DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT.—[13th July, 1859.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ballaarat, begun and holden at Ballaarat, in the said district, on the 13th day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

Preamble.—From and after the date upon which this bye-law shall become law, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any previous bye-laws of this mining board, the sizes and forms of claims to which the holders of miners' rights within the mining district of Ballaarat shall be entitled, and the conditions upon which said claims may be held, shall be as follow:

1. **Frontage claims.**—All frontage claims shall be laid off in accordance with the form prescribed by bye-law No. VIII. of this board, gazetted on the 15th day of April, 1859, and in accordance with the extent prescribed in schedule A hereunto annexed; and the area to which one man shall be entitled shall be a claim.

2. **Taking possession of a frontage claim.**—Any miner's right shall entitle the owner thereof to take possession of a frontage claim in accordance with schedule A hereunto annexed; provided always that the owner of such miner's right shall be registered for such claim under this bye-law, by the registrar or surveyor for the district in which such claim is situated.

3. **Block claims.**—Block claims shall mean and embrace all claims other than frontage claims, and shall be laid off in accordance with the sizes and forms prescribed by schedules B, C, D, and E, hereunto annexed; and the area which one man may occupy shall be a claim.

4. **Form and extent of block claims.**—Any miner's right shall entitle the holder thereof to a block claim, in new ground, in accordance with schedule B hereunto annexed; in old or worked and abandoned ground in accordance with schedule C hereunto annexed; or on any recognised quartz reef in accordance with schedule D hereunto annexed; and the occupant of any block claim shall be entitled to all the gold contained within the boundaries of said block claim; provided always that he be registered for such block claim under this bye-law by the registrar or surveyor of the district in which such claim is situated.

5. **Taking possession of block claims.**—Any person taking possession of a block claim shall immediately define the boundaries thereof by posts firmly fixed in the ground at each corner of said claim, and standing not less than two (2) feet above the surface, and shall within forty-eight (48) hours inform the district surveyor or registrar of his having done so, and shall at the same time apply to be registered for the same; and such possession shall be deemed a good and sufficient title to such claim until the aforesaid registration shall have been effected.

6. **Forfeiture of claim.**—In the event of any person failing to comply with the conditions set forth in section 5 of this bye-law, he shall forfeit all right and title to such claim.

7. **Registration of claims.**—Upon the receipt of the notice and application, as provided in section 5 of this bye-law, the district surveyor or registrar shall enter such notice and application in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, and shall inform the applicant that he will on a certain day (to be fixed by such surveyor or registrar) be on the claim for the purpose of making a correct measurement of such claim, and after having made such measurement the district surveyor or registrar shall register the applicant for such claim; but in no case shall the surveyor or registrar register any person for a claim until he has surveyed the same, and satisfied himself that such claim will not interfere with the rights of others.

8. **Class of mining defined by the surveyor or registrar.**—It shall be competent for the surveyor or registrar of the district to elect under which of the schedules to this bye-law he will register the applicants.

9. **Non-registration, &c., conditions of forfeiture.**—In the event of any person failing to have his claim surveyed, or failing to get registered for the same at the time or times appointed by the district surveyor or registrar, as provided in section 7 of this bye-law, he shall forfeit all right and title to such claim.

10. **Plurality of claims.**—Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this bye-law, any person owning a miner's right shall be entitled to take possession of any number of claims not exceeding twelve (12); provided always that the number of men employed upon such claims be equal to the number of claims so taken possession of; but no one person shall be entitled to use more than one miner's right for the purpose of taking possession of claims.

11. **Claim owners may unite as one company.**—Any number of persons holding claims may unite as one company for the purpose of working said claims as one claim; provided always that such persons be registered as one company by the district surveyor or registrar.

12. **Persons holding claims under previous bye-laws may take advantage of this bye-law.**—Any person or persons holding a claim or claims under any previous bye-laws of this board shall be entitled to take advantage of all and every of the benefits conferred by this bye-law, provided he or they be registered for the same under this bye-law by the district surveyor or registrar; and he or they shall also continue in the enjoyment of all and

every of the privileges and advantages to which he or they would be and continue legally entitled under any such bye-law; but no person or persons shall be entitled to any of the advantages conferred by this bye-law unless he or they shall be registered for the same under this bye-law by the district registrar or surveyor.

13. **Subject to conditions imposed by bye-law No. 3.**—All persons who shall have been registered under this bye-law shall be subject to all the conditions imposed by bye-law No. III. of this board, gazetted on the 15th day of June, 1858, save and except such of those conditions as are opposed to the general wording and spirit of this bye-law.

14. **Unregistered block claims.**—The area of unregistered claims shall be of the form and size specified in schedule E hereunto annexed, and every owner of a miner's right shall have power to take possession of such area, to hold, to occupy and enjoy the same for the purpose of mining, and it shall not be necessary for the legal holding, occupying, and enjoying of such claims for the occupants thereof to be registered for the same; provided always that no person shall have power to take possession of a claim upon a recognised frontage head, excepting in accordance with the bye-laws in that case made and provided.

15. **Taking possession of unregistered claims.**—No person or persons shall be deemed to have taken possession of an unregistered claim until he or they, as the case may be, shall have defined the boundaries thereof either by a V trench, at least six inches deep and six inches wide at the top, that is to say, at the surface; and such trench shall be cut as nearly as practicable at right angles at each and every corner of the claim, and continued on each line of such right angle to a distance of not less than six (6) feet from the vertex of the angle (that is to say, from the corner of the claim), or by a corner post at each corner of the claim, firmly fixed in the ground, and standing not less than two (2) feet above the surface; and such trenches or posts, as the case may be, shall be kept visible at all times by the occupants of such claims.

16. **Forfeiture of unregistered claims by abandonment.**—Every unregistered claim or share in such claim shall be deemed to be abandoned, and shall be absolutely forfeited by the owner or owners thereof when such claim or share of such claim shall have been neglected for a period of three consecutive days, unless good cause can be shown for such neglect, and the warden of and for the district in which such claim is situated shall be the proper judge as to what is such good cause for neglect.

17. **Interpretation clause.**—The words "surveyor or registrar" shall mean and be interpreted to mean the surveyor or registrar of the district in which any claim taken possession of under this bye-law may be situated.
