PROTECTION OF FISHERIES ACT.

THE attention of persons using nets in any bay, estuary, or other influxion of the sea, or any river in Victoria, is directed to the second clause of the Act 22 Victoria No. 77, by which it is prescribed that such persons shall register their names, places of abode, &c., at the nearest court of petty sessions. A penalty not exceeding Five pounds is prescribed by the third section in cases in which nets shall be used by persons who do not register themselves.

BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

BYE-LAWS.—[22nd July, 1859.]

AT a meeting of the Board of Agriculture, holden in the board room at the Public Lands Office, La Trobe street west, in the city of Melbourne, on the 22nd day of July, in the year 1859, it is ordained as follows, that is to say:—

1. All societies entitled to the grant in aid of agriculture for the year 1859, shall receive such in proportion to their respective amounts of revenue, until this revenue amounts to the sum of £500 in each case; such societies, however, as possess a revenue exceeding this sum, namely £500, shall receive for the surplus half the rate of grant proportionate to the revenue, or, in other words, each pound of revenue above £500 in each case, shall rate as 10s.

2. Out of the sum of £6000, the amount of the parliamentary grant for 1859, £500 shall be placed to the credit of the council, to be disposed of as circumstances may arise, in furtherance of the objects of the board.

The undersigned members of the said Board of Agriculture concurred in making the foregoing bye-laws.

BEECHWORTH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS.—[15th July, 1859.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the 15th day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty nine, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

122. *Amalgamation of claims.*—Bye-law numbered 89 shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—The holders of adjoining claims of the same class or description may amalgamate to the extent of four or any less number of claims, and in any special case where extraordinary difficulties in the nature of wet or deep ground requiring expensive machinery shall exist, holders of adjoining claims of the same class may amalgamate to the extent of eight or any less number of claims; in either case the same number of men to be kept constantly employed within the limits of the amalgamated claim as would have been necessary for the holding of the same extent of ground if the claims were wrought singly. All such amalgamations to be registered with the warden of the district in which such claims are situated, except in the case of claims held under the frontage bye-laws, the amalgamation of which will be registered with the mining surveyor of the division.

123. *Supply of water, how gauged.*—Bye-law numbered 88 shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—The occupier of a race shall be entitled to the use of the following quantity of water, namely, in the Spring Creek, Snake Valley, and Three-mile Creek divisions of the mining district of Beechworth, to a stream of water running for twelve hours on each day, to be gauged by a box six feet long, twelve inches wide, and six inches deep in the inner measurement, with an opening of a uniform depth of one and one-eighth inch across the bottom; in the Woolshed, Buckland, Yackandandah, and Omeo divisions, to a stream of water running continuously for the whole twenty-four hours, to be gauged in the Woolshed, Buckland, and Omeo divisions by a box of the same length, width, and depth as beforementioned, with an opening of a uniform depth of three inches across the bottom; in the Yackandandah division to be gauged by a box of the same length and width as beforementioned, but only three inches and a half deep in the inner measurement, and with an opening of a uniform depth of three inches across the bottom. In all cases the box to be fixed on a dead level in the race immediately below the spot where the race receives its last supply; the race to be made perfectly level for a distance of not less than twelve feet immediately above the box, where an overshot shall be formed extending one entire side of a corresponding height with the sides of the box, and in races conveying more than one head of water the box to be increased in width twelve inches for every additional head of water the race may be permitted to carry.

124. *Extent of frontage measurement that may be occupied.*—Bye-law numbered 113 shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—The extent of frontage measurement that may be occupied by each claimholder shall be on the course of the lead. 
