## MARYBOROUGH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW REGULATING WATER GAUGES.—[8th January, 1859.]

**A**T a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Maryborough, begun and holden at Maryborough, in the said district, on the 8th day of January, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

Water gauge to mean the number of square inches of water allowed for a sluice head at the origin of each race; the gauge-box to be twelve (12) feet long, having a fall of half an inch to the foot. For a race less than ten miles,  $18 \times 3 = 54$  square inches; for a race more than ten and less than twenty miles,  $20 \times 4 = 80$  square inches; for a race more than twenty and less than thirty miles,  $22 \times 6 = 110$  square inches. The gauge-box must not be fixed below the level of the creek or other water-source.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

# WILFUL MURDER.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD FOR EACH OFFENDER.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCESSORY.

WHEREAS about half-past Nine o'clock in the evening of Saturday, the 8th instant, Joseph Hartwig, or Hartwick, a servant in the employment of Dr. Gemmell, of Wooragee, when returning from the Indigo gold fields, after disposing of a dray load of vegetables, was attacked on the Black Dog road, distant about half a mile from the camp, Indigo, and shot dead, by some person or persons unknown: Notice is hereby given that a reward of Fifty Pounds will be paid to any person giving information which will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the murderer or of each of the persons (if more than one) guilty of the murder abovementioned.

His Excellency the Governor will also extend Her Majesty's free pardon to any person implicated in the murder who will give the required information, provided such person did not fire the shot which caused death.

# TICKET-OF-LEAVE REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct that the Ticket-of-Leave Regulations, dated 12th January, 1853, and published in the *Government Gazette* of that year (pages 56 and 866), shall be abrogated, and that the following Regulations for the conduct and supervision of Ticket-of-Leave Holders shall take effect from this date, viz.:—

1. Whenever His Excellency the Governor may approve of the issue of a ticket-of-leave to any prisoner, the usual parchment certificate will be issued by the Inspector General of Penal Establishments, and will specify the police district in which the holder is authorised to reside.

2. Whenever a ticket-of-leave is issued, the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments will notify to the Chief Commissioner of Police the name and description of the holder, and the district in which he is authorised to reside.

3. Every ticket-of-leave holder shall without delay after the receipt of his ticket-of-leave present it for registry at the office of the superintendent of detective police; he must then at once proceed to the district in which he shall be authorised to reside, and immediately on arrival report himself to the sergeant or constable of police in charge of the station nearest to his intended place of residence; he must also report every change he may make in his place of abode to the same officer, together with the name of his employer and the nature of his employment.

4. Every ticket-of-leave holder must report himself personally during the months of June and December in each year to the sergeant or constable in charge of the police station nearest to his authorised place of residence.

5. Any superintendent, inspector or sub-inspector of police, or any justice of the peace, may grant a pass for any period not exceeding one month to a ticket-of-leave holder desirous of proceeding to another district; but no ticket-of-leave holder is to remove permanently from the district in which he is authorised to reside without obtaining permission of the Chief Commissioner of Police.

6. Every pass granted under the authority of the last section must be exhibited by the holder before he leaves his district, and immediately on his return, at the police station at which he is required to report himself.

7. Every ticket-of-leave holder proceeding to another district on pass shall immediately on arrival report himself and exhibit his pass at the nearest police station in the district to which he has permission to proceed, when his pass will be counter-

signed, and an entry of the particulars made in the occurrence book of the station.

8. Every ticket-of-leave holder is to produce his ticket whenever required to do so by a magistrate or constable.

9. Every ticket-of-leave holder is required to aid and assist any constable in the execution of his duty when called upon, and any assistance afforded to the police, or information given which will lead to the detection or prevention of crime, will render the ticket-of-leave holder deserving of favorable consideration when applying for further indulgence.

10. Every ticket-of-leave holder found out of his district without a pass, or failing to return at the expiration of his pass, or being in a public house after nine o'clock in the evening, unless he is actually employed or is a lodger therein, or who may infringe any of these regulations, or in any other way seriously misconduct himself, will be liable to be apprehended and taken before any justice of the peace, who is hereby authorised to enquire into the circumstances, and if he shall see fit to forward the prisoner to a penal establishment with a recommendation (to be transmitted to the Inspector General) that his ticket be cancelled or suspended for such period as the justice may think to be commensurate with the offence.

11. Whenever a ticket-of-leave holder shall be returned to a penal establishment under the authority of the last preceding clause, the circumstances of the case are to be reported immediately by the prosecuting officer or constable or police, through the usual channel, to the Chief Commissioner of Police, who will forward such report for the information of the Inspector General.

12. Every instance of meritorious conduct on the part of a ticket-of-leave holder is also to be made known in the same manner, that it may be recorded in the man's favor.

13. Ticket-of-leave holders will be eligible to apply for free pardons when they shall have held their tickets-of-leave for a period equal to one-third of the time they may have served prior to obtaining that indulgence, and must forward their application through the Police Department to the Inspector General of Penal Establishments.

14. Entries will be made in the occurrence book at each police station of the name, residence, and occupation of each ticket-of-leave holder resident in the vicinity; all reports of arrivals, departures, and changes of residence of ticket-of-leave holders; all passes issued to or exhibited by them; all instances of misconduct or of services rendered by them, and generally of any circumstances affecting their characters and conduct which may become known; and these particulars are to be communicated to the officer in charge of the police district, who will cause a register to be kept of all ticket-of-leave holders in the district, the object being to place these men under the general supervision of the police authorities, so that the Inspector General of Penal Establishments may be enabled to ascertain at any time on reference whether they continue deserving of the indulgence which has been granted to them, and whether any further mitigation of sentence may be safely extended to them. But while it is desirable that this object should be accomplished, any interference with them beyond that which is absolutely necessary for that purpose is to be carefully avoided, as ticket-of-leave holders are entitled to all the privileges of free subjects while they comply with the conditions on which they hold their ticket, and while their general conduct continues undeserving of censure.

15. The foregoing regulations, although written in the masculine gender, will equally apply to female as to male prisoners.

## THE GOVERNOR'S VISIT.

On Friday, 17th September, His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, K.C.B., arrived in Warrnambool, and was entertained at a public breakfast the same morning, after which an address was presented to him from this council; and in the evening His Excellency attended a public ball. Early on the morning of the 18th, he took his departure for the station of Niel Black, Esq.

## MISCELLANEOUS.

The Government have accepted tenders for two lighthouses at this port, and one is now in course of erection on the middle island.

The wooden rails originally laid down on the tramroad being found unsuitable for its efficient working, the lessee undertook to cover them with flat iron; but the council, preferring iron rails as being more substantial and durable, agreed to advance £300 toward the difference of cost, the lessee paying interest for same, and subscribing to certain conditions. A contract has been accepted for the work, and the alteration is expected to be shortly completed.

The municipal council forwarded to the local members in the Legislative Assembly a remonstrance against the proposal to allow the corporations of Melbourne and Geelong to participate in the grants-in-aid to municipalities, and requested those gentlemen to use their influence in preventing any reduction in the amount of aid originally intended for the municipalities only.

During the half-year the council have held twenty-six ordinary and four special meetings.
