## PROTECTION OF FISHERIES ACT.

THE attention of persons using nets in any bay, estuary, or other influxion of the sea, or any river in Victoria, is directed to the second clause of the Act 22 Victoria No. 77, by which it is proscribed that such persons shall register their names, places of abode, &c., at the nearest court of petty sessions. A penalty not exceeding Five pounds is proscribed by the third section in cases in which nets shall be used by persons who do not register themselves.

## MUNICIPAL EXEMPTION, WILLIAMSTOWN.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public road, cemetery, market, wharf, aqueduct, or any other public work, place, or building of what description soever, not erected, formed, or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal

council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the public work at Williamstown, called and known as the Patent Slip, from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Williamstown: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Williamstown the public work and place called and known as "The Government Patent Slip" and the site thereof hereinafter described, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the north side of Nelson place, Williamstown, at its intersection with the east side of Morris street; bounded by lines bearing north 15 degrees east, 1386 feet; south 63 degrees east, 458 feet; south 15 degrees west, 1386 feet; and north 63 degrees west, 458 feet, to the commencing point

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

#### SECTIONS V. TO X. OF TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CRESWICK.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them, and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declare and appoint that the municipal district of Creswick shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., respectively.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCESSORY.

WHEREAS between the hours of Nine and Ten o'clock in the evening of Saturday, the 30th July last, two carriers named John Gust and Martin Berke, while camped near the Mount Greenock Hotel, in the district of Carisbrook, were attacked by two armed men, who demanded their money, and fired at and wounded the said John Gust and Martin Berke: Notice is hereby given that a reward of Fifty pounds will be paid for such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of each of the offenders.

#### PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

HAMILTON.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and sixty householders resident at Hamilton, in the county of Dundas, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident in the township of Hamilton, in the county of Dundas, and they are convinced that its erection into a municipal district will tend materially to advance its interests, and conduce to its improvement and good government.

They suggest that the proposed district be bounded as follows, viz.:—"Commencing at the north-west corner of section A, in the parish of North Hamilton; thence running due south to the south-west corner of allotment 3, South Hamilton suburbs; thence in a line running due east to the south-east corner of allotment 63 of the same suburbs; thence due north to the north-east corner of allotment number 2 of section 1; thence due west to the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section 1; thence due south to a point opposite the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section C, in the parish of North Hamilton; and thence in a line due west to the commencing point; and which boundaries comprise sections A, C, and part of section 1, in the parish of North Hamilton, and sections B, 2, and part of section 1, and the South Hamilton suburbs, in the parish of South Hamilton, together with the town of Hamilton reserve."

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that the above described land may be proclaimed a municipality under the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

#### PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

EAST ST. KILDA.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by Fifty-five householders, stated to be the majority of the residents in the portion of the Caulfield road district generally known as East St. Kilda, praying that their locality may be annexed to the municipal district of St. Kilda.

The petitioners state, that they are resident householders within the portion of the Caulfield road district known as East St. Kilda, which may be generally described as bounded on the north by the Great Dandenong road, on the south by the Glen Huntley road, on the west by a road or street called Hotham street, and on the east by a road called Barkly road; and that they are desirous of being included within the municipal district of St. Kilda:

That the said locality adjoins the said municipality, and contains an average of at least thirty-six residents to each square mile, of whom the petitioners state that they constitute the majority:

That the municipal council of St. Kilda have expressed their willingness to accede to their proposal for annexation.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"That your Excellency will avail yourself on our behalf of the powers vested in you under the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, section 3, and proclaim the locality described in this petition to be united with and form part of the municipal district of St. Kilda."

**SEVENTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT.**

**R**EPORT of the proceedings of the Municipal Council of Sandhurst for the half-year ending 10th July, 1859.

**PUBLIC WORKS.**

The works completed during the past half-year or now in progress, are the formation of portions of Vine street, Lucan street, road over Golden Gully, Raglan street, Oak street continuation, Short street, Sheepwash road, widening High street B, kerbing and channelling in Williamson street, Mitchell street, Plumridge street, Irishtown, Hargreaves street, Lyttleton terrace, Bull street, Short street, and Rowan street; footpaths and drains in Napier street, Mackenzie street, High street, Bridge lane, Upper Wattle street, Forest street; the erection of an engine-house in High street B, the completion of the town hall, raising Plumridge street bridge, additional lamps, fences, with many other minor works, and the general maintenance of existing works, at a total cost of £7331 15s. 6d. A contract has been made for the excavation of a reservoir on the water reserve in Bridge street without expense to the municipality.

**BYE-LAW PASSED.**

No. 19.—For the further regulation of Sandhurst Market.  
No. 20.—For the suppression of nuisances.

**FINANCE.**

The sum of £3780 10s. 7d. has been received from the Government as an instalment of the grant-in-aid. In February it was deemed advisable to allow the market inspector an additional sum of £150 per annum for the employment of a second assistant, and prevent evasion of market dues and tolls, which amount for the half-year to £1031 4s. 2d. against £642 collected last half-year.

**ELECTIONS.**

At the commencement of the current municipal year, Messrs. McIntyre, Simons, and Strickland, were elected councillors, in the room of the three members retiring by rotation, and councillor W. Vazie Simons was re-elected chairman of the council. In May, councillor Neale resigned, and on 17th June, 1859, councillor T. Carpenter was elected in his place by polled votes.

Mr. J. W. Townsend has been appointed rate collector, *vice* Mr. James Jamieson, resigned; and Mr. George Jarman has been elected town inspector and inspector under the local board of health, *vice* Mr. Townsend, resigned.

**MISCELLANEOUS.**

In consequence of the suspension of the Municipal Court of Petty Sessions by the Government in February, it was deemed advisable to send the chairman as a deputation to the Government on the subject, and the court was re-established at the new town hall. After many repeated applications, the Government has established a pound in the district.

The council have decided on the establishment of a public cattle market, and an application has been made for land for a site; on this being granted, immediate steps will be taken to make it available.

In aid of local public institutions £50 has been voted to the Sandhurst fire brigade, £100 to the Mechanics' Institute, and an annual subscription of £200 to the Bendigo Benevolent Asylum, the latter sum, however, has not been yet applied for. At the urgent request of many parties, the council have allowed miners to work on Pall Mall, which permission, although productive of some expense to the ratepayers, will set at rest the question of the auificious nature of the ground, and prevent any wish to interfere with it when made more presentable in appearance than at present.

Two fire bells have been ordered from England. Many applications have been made to the Government in furtherance of the interest of the town:—The construction of Mount Korong road in View place, raising High street at the foot of Forest street, Police station at the Back Creek, and others, have been acceded to; the substitution of a new bridge for the old King's Bridge, forming Melvor road, straightening High street (A), and others, have been deferred.

The continued absence of regulations for maintenance of the main sludge channels has compelled the council to continue the heavy weekly expenditure in drainage works alluded to in last year's report, and no money being received from the Government during the half-year, at its termination the council had a claim for moneys expended amounting to £4576. A deputation was sent to town on the subject, and the sum of £2202 has been repaid, but the balance cannot be recovered without a special vote for the purpose. It is, however, understood that no difficulty will in future arise in obtaining payment for maintenance monthly, until the new sludge channel now about being con-

structed is available. The sludge maintenance account does not appear in the balance sheet, as the council have always kept it separate and distinct from the municipal funds.
