MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HEATHCOTE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the householders and landholders at Heathcote, in the county of Dalhousie, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act, and no counter petition has been delivered in opposition to the said petition: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:-

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HEATHCOTE.—Commencing at the south-western angle of suburban allotment 37 (north of Heathcote), in the parish of Heathcote; thence north 13 degrees 4 minutes east twenty chains; thence by a line parallel to and distant twenty chains from the north-eastern side of the main road through Heathcote, from Sandhurst to Kilmore, to a point bearing north 34 degrees east from the south-eastern angle of suburban allotment 14 (south of Heathcote), in the parish of Heathcote; thence south 34 degrees west to a point distant twenty chains from the south-western side of the main road through Heathcote from Sandhurst to Kilmore; thence northwards by a line parallel to and distant twenty chains from the said road to a point bearing south 13 degrees 4 minutes west from the commencing point; and thence by a line to the said commencing point.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Heathcote."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

BYE-LAW No. 5.—To AUTHORISE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF AMHERST TO APPLY THE LEGISLATIVE GRANT OF ONE THOUSAND POUNDS (£1000) FOR PUBLIC WORKS TO BE EXECUTED WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY.

THE sum of One thousand pounds (£1000) having been granted for the execution of public works within the municipality of Amherst, the municipal council thereof enact that the amount of said grant shall be applied towards the execution of such works as are herein enumerated:—

For building council chambers, £750.

For forming and making the footpaths in High street, £100.

For the erection of a bridge at the large waterhole, £150.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 5, made by the municipal council of Amherst, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

HAMILTON.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and sixty householders resident at Hamilton, in the county of Dundas, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident in the township of Hamilton, in the county of Dundas, and they are convinced that its erection into a municipal district will tend materially to advance its interests, and conduce to its improvement and good government.

They suggest that the proposed district be bounded as follows, viz.:—"Commencing at the north-west corner of section A, in the parish of North Hamilton; thence running due south to the south-west corner of allotment 3, South Hamilton suburbs; thence in a line running due east to the south-east corner of allotment 63 of the same suburbs; thence due north to the north-east corner of allotment number 2 of section 1; thence due west to the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section 1; thence due south to a point opposite the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section C, in the parish of North Hamilton; and thence in a line due west to the commencing point; and which boundaries comprise sections A, C, and part of section 1, in the parish of North Hamilton, and sections B, 2, and part of section 1, and the South Hamilton suburbs, in the parish of South Hamilton, together with the town of Hamilton reserve."

"Your petitioners therefore pray that the above described land may be proclaimed a municipality under the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."
