CUSTOMS DUTIES ON GOODS VIA THE MURRAY.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by *The Customs Act, 1857*, has been pleased to approve of the following arrangements respecting the collection and distribution of the customs duties payable upon goods introduced *via* the River Murray for consumption in the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria.

1. That all customs duties payable upon goods which shall pass through the province of South Australia, by way of the River Murray, for consumption in the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria, shall be collected in the province of South Australia according to the rates specified in the *Tarif* of New South Wales in force on the 24th November, 1857.

2. That the duties thus collected shall be carried to the joint credit of the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria, respectively, in the Treasury of South Australia, and shall from time to time be paid over to the first mentioned colonies in equal moieties.

YACKANDANDAH PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery established at Yackandandah:—

- All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.
- Orders for interment must be given to the secretary, between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m. the previous day.
- The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
- The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from the 1st September to the 30th April; and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months of the year.
- The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.
- By the 7th section of the Act, "Any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs or near relations, for ever."
- Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in the schedule.
- As to ground in which the right of constructing any vault or place of burial has not been purchased. The trustees will cause the grave for the burial of the body of a person of the age of twelve years or upwards to be dug of the depth of 5 feet 6 inches, and the grave for the burial of the body of a child under the age of twelve years to be dug of the depth of 4 feet 6 inches; for any additional depth the trustees will require the payment of three-pence for every cubic foot.
- As to ground in which the right of constructing any vault or place of burial has been purchased.—The trustees will require the vault or place of burial to be dug of the depth of not less than 6 feet, and such digging is to be done, and all mason's or bricklayer's work is to be performed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them, by and at the cost of the person possessing the right of constructing such vault or place of burial.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
- No monument, tombstone, gravestone, or tablet, will be permitted to be erected or placed upon ground in which the exclusive right of burial, or the right of constructing any vault or place of burial, has not been purchased; and every monument, tombstone, gravestone, or tablet, as to its design, and every inscription, must first be approved of by the trustees.
- In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
- Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair must be removed, by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.
- A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the charges set forth in schedule.
- No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault,

tombstone, building, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof is liable to be punished as prescribed by the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria No. 12.

- No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
- The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

## MARKET.

The Government, after repeated applications from this council, have gazetted for the purposes of a market the reserve in Market square. A bye-law has been drawn up to fix the rates of tolls, dues, &c., for the regulation of the Ballarat agricultural and produce market.

## BOTANICAL GARDENS.

The municipal council invited the co-operation of gentlemen of practicable ability and conversant with the knowledge of

botany, in forming a committee for the management of the Ballarat Botanical Gardens; and during the past half-year seven and a half acres of ground has been fenced in, trenched, as also a quarter of an acre for a propagating ground.

The municipal council have great pleasure in acknowledging the receipt of seeds, plants, and shrubs from the Melbourne and Geelong Botanical Gardens, as also donations of plants, &c., from W. H. Bacchus, Esq., and other gentlemen.

The municipal council feel assured, with the valuable assistance of the gentlemen who have given their professional assistance in laying out and planting the grounds, that the nucleus of one of the most valuable institutions of the colony has been favorably established, and its future success will depend upon the amount granted in aid of the institution by the Government.

The municipal council have also availed themselves of the assistance of the botanical committee in planting Sturt street with trees.

## FINANCE.

The statement of the receipts and expenditure shows a large balance due to the Bank of Victoria, which has been caused by the amount expended on the water works during the previous half-year, and the amount voted for public works, in anticipation of the Government grant and the local revenue for the year ending the 16th January, 1860. A strict surveillance has been kept over the various accounts, and the municipal council have in their statement of expenditure given every particular, being desirous the public should have every information of the several items expended out of the revenues of the district, and they have great pleasure in submitting the statement without heavy expenses for contingencies.

## VALUATIONS.

The municipal council have strongly advocated the principle of allowing compensation for permanent improvements in this district, and, after repeated applications, have great pleasure (although not officially informed) in stating the principle has been affirmed, and valuations for improvements will not, as heretofore, be the exclusive privilege of a favored few.

## FIRE BRIGADE.

During the past half-year a volunteer fire brigade was enrolled in this district. The municipal council offered to provide a fire-engine, hose, apparatus, build an engine-house, and also vote a sum annually in aid of the institution. The members of the brigade required the whole of the working expenses to be paid out of the municipal rates; the council declined to accede to such terms, and the Ballarat West fire brigade have in consequence of the refusal disbanded.
