DOG NUISANCE ACT EXTENDED TO BALLAN.

Its Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has extended the provisions of the Act 6 William IV. No. 4, intituled, An Act for abating the nuisance occasioned by dogs in the streets of certain towns and on highways in New South Wales, to the township of Ballan.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

HAMILTON.

N pursuance of the Act of Council 18-Victoria No.-15, His Excellency the Governor with the adversary L Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and sixty householders resident at Hamilton, in the county of Dundas, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident in the township of Hamilton, in the county of Dundas, and they are convinced that its erection into a municipal district will tend materially to advance its interests, and conduce to its improvement and good government.

They suggest that the proposed district be bounded as follows, viz:—"Commencing at the north-west corner of section A, in the parish of North Hamilton; thence running due south to the south-west corner of allotment 3, South Hamilton suburbs; thence in a line running due east to the south-east corner of allotment 63 of the same suburbs; thence due north to the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section 1; thence due west to the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section 1; thence due south to a point opposite the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section C, in the parish of North Hamilton; and thence in a line due west to the commencing point; and which boundaries comprise sections A, C, and part of section 1, in the parish of North Hamilton, and sections B, 2, and part of section 1, and the South Hamilton suburbs, in the parish of South Hamilton, together with the town of Hamilton reserve."

WHEREAS by the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the execution of any public works within the municipal boundary of such district, by funds obtained in aid from Government or otherwise: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Avoca, that the sum of Five hundred pounds (£500), being the first moiety of Government grant-in aid for 1859 to the municipality of Avoca, be appropriated more or less in the construction of a town pump, and the clearing of stumps and trees from and repairing one chain wide each side of High street, Avoca, its whole length.

The municipal council have great pleasure in acknowledging the receipt of seeds, plants, and shrubs from the Melbourne and Geelong Botanical Gardens, as also donations of plants, &c., from W. H. Bacchus, Esq., and other gentlemen.

The municipal council feel assured, with the valuable assistance of the gentlemen who have given their professional assistance in laying out and planting the grounds, that the nucleus of one of the most valuable institutions of the colony has been favorably established, and its future success will depend upon the amount granted in aid of the institution by the Government.

The statement of the receipts and expenditure shows a large balance due to the Bank of Victoria, which has been caused by the amount expended on the water works during the previous half-year, and the amount voted for public works, in anticipation of the Government grant and the local revenue for the year ending the 16th January, 1860. A strict surveillance has been-keep over the various accounts, and the municipal council have in their statement of expenditure given every particular, being desirous the public should have every information of the several items expended out of the revenues of the district, and they have great pleasure in submitting the statement without heavy expenses for contingencies penses for contingencies

VALUATIONS.

The municipal council have strongly advocated the principle of allowing compensation for permanent improvements in this district, and, after repeated applications, have great pleasure (although not officially informed) in stating the principle has been affirmed, and valuations for improvements will not, as heretofore, be the exclusive privilege of a favored few.

FIRE BRIGADE.

During the past half-year a volunteer fire brigade was enrolled in this district. The municipal council offered to provide a fire-engine, hose, apparatus, build an engine-house, and also vote a sum annually in aid of the institution. This delay has occasioned most serious loss to the municipality in a pecuniary point of view, and has been attended with great inconvenience and even danger in consequence of the traffic having been forced on the natural soil, and heavily laden waggons and draws constantly bogged or overturned. The council is anxiously awaiting the result, having been repeatedly assured by the Government authorities that tenders were out for the completion of these approaches. these approaches.
