CUSTOMS DUTIES ON GOODS VIA THE MURRAY.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by *The Customs Act, 1857*, has been pleased to approve of the following arrangements respecting the collection and distribution of the customs duties payable upon goods introduced *via* the River Murray for consumption in the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria.

1. That all customs duties payable upon goods which shall pass through the province of South Australia, by way of the River Murray, for consumption in the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria, shall be collected in the province of South Australia according to the rates specified in the *Tariff of New South Wales in force on the 24th November, 1857*.

2. That the duties thus collected shall be carried to the joint credit of the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria, respectively, in the *Treasury of South Australia*, and shall from time to time be paid over to the first mentioned colonies in equal moieties.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.
HAMILTON.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and sixty householders resident at Hamilton, in the county of Dundas, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident in the township of Hamilton, in the county of Dundas, and they are convinced that its erection into a municipal district will tend materially to advance its interests, and conduce to its improvement and good government.

They suggest that the proposed district be bounded as follows, viz.—"Commencing at the north-west corner of section A, in the parish of North Hamilton; thence running due south to the south-west corner of allotment 3, South Hamilton suburbs; thence in a line running due east to the south-east corner of allotment 63 of the same suburbs; thence due north to the north-east corner of allotment number 2 of section 1; thence due west to the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section 1; thence due south to a point opposite the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section C, in the parish of North Hamilton; and thence in a line due west to the commencing point; and which boundaries comprise sections A, C, and part of section 1, in the parish of North Hamilton, and sections B, 2, and part of section 1, and the South Hamilton suburbs, in the parish of South Hamilton, together with the town of Hamilton reserve."

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that the above described land may be proclaimed a municipality under the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

MUNICIPALITY OF BRUNSWICK.

BYE-LAW No. 12.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE PREVENTION OF GOATS STRAYING.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act to make bye-laws, amongst other things, for the suppression of nuisances, and the general good rule and government of such district: And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law for the prevention of nuisances occasioned by the straying of goats within this municipal district: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Brunswick, that from and after the date of the Governor's assent hereto, it shall not be lawful for any person to suffer any goat belonging to him or her, or under his or her charge, to be at large within the said municipal district, and any person so offending shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings.

And it is hereby further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the owner, occupier or person in charge of securely enclosed lands, to destroy any goat or goats found trespassing thereon. The term "securely enclosed" shall mean by a three-rail fence.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 12, made by the municipal council of Brunswick, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF CRESWICK.

BYE-LAW No. 8.—FOR COMPELLING THE INHABITANTS OF THIS MUNICIPALITY TO KEEP THEIR PREMISES FREE FROM OFFENSIVE AND UNWHOLESOME MATTER, FOR RESTRAINING NOISOME, OFFENSIVE, AND UNHEALTHY TRADES, AND FOR OTHERWISE PRESERVING THE PUBLIC HEALTH.

WHEREAS the health and comfort of the inhabitants of this municipality generally demand that all premises therein should be kept free from obnoxious and offensive matters, and also that offensive trades should be restrained: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Creswick, that any person who shall, from the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency, allow any animal, vegetable, or other matter, or any skins, hides, or any rubbish whatever to accumulate, or permit water or other liquid to stagnate upon or in front of their premises, or in the rights-of-way, lanes, or footpaths bordering or abutting thereon, or who shall burn any bones, rubbish, animal or vegetable matter, or melt tallow or render down fat, offal, or refuse of any kind, so as in any of the

cases aforesaid to be a nuisance to the neighborhood, or who shall throw upon any street, lane, path, or public place within this municipality any bones, rubbish, animal or vegetable matter, or who shall carry on any manufacture, business, or calling whatsoever which shall be deemed by the municipal council or their appointed officer to be offensive to the surrounding neighborhood, or injurious to the public health, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds, excepting only such offensive trades as may be carried on under a special permission from the council.

For the purposes of this bye-law, the occupiers of premises shall be deemed liable to the penalty herein set forth.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—FOR THE CONDUCTING OF PUBLIC MEETINGS OF THE RATEPAYERS, AND OF ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF COUNCIL.

At all public meetings of the ratepayers, convened by the council, or the chairman, for the election of councillors or other municipal business, the chairman, or in his absence the senior councillor then present, shall preside, and in case of an equality of votes shall have the casting vote.

2. If at any election the chairman of the municipal council for the time being shall be a candidate for re-election, or shall be incapacitated from presiding at such election from any other cause whatsoever, it shall be competent for the remaining members of the council (being a quorum) to appoint some one of themselves to act as chairman for the purpose of carrying out such election, and it shall be lawful for the chairman, upon a vote of the council, to appoint under his hand and seal such and so many persons as to the council may seem necessary, to act as deputy chairman or chairmen, poll clerk or poll clerks, and to appoint such and so many places within the municipal district as may seem to the said council to be the polling place or places.

3. If at any election a poll shall be demanded in the form required by the 19th section of 18 Victoria No. 15, the chairman shall cause to be provided at the polling place or places a sufficient number of stalls or compartments, together with ink and pens, for the purpose of enabling the electors to mark the voting papers as hereinafter provided; in any which polling place no person other than the chairman, the town clerk or his deputy, scrutineers, and electors who shall for the time being be tendering their votes, shall be entitled to be present. And any other person than such chairman, town clerk or his deputy, scrutineers, and electors who shall for the time being be tendering their votes, who shall intrude behind the barrier, and upon being required to withdraw by the chairman shall refuse to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the provisions of this bye-law (provided always that it shall be lawful for the chairman, town clerk or his deputy, to summon to his assistance in any such room or compartment any member or members of the police force for the purpose of preserving the public peace, quelling any breach thereof that may have arisen, and for removing out of such room any person or persons who may in his opinion be obstructing the polling, or wilfully violating any of the provisions of this bye-law), and upon being convicted thereof before two or more justices of the peace shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

4. The chairman in each polling-place shall cause to be provided, for the purpose of such election, a locked-up box, of which he shall keep the key, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the voting papers, which box shall stand in front of the chairman, and each elector shall receive from the chairman a voting paper in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed, and shall thereupon retire to a stall or compartment provided for that purpose, and there strike out the name or names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and then deposit the same in the ballot box in the presence of the chairman, town clerk or his deputy, and scrutineers, and in case such elector shall be unable to read, he shall signify the same to the chairman, who shall thereupon strike out the names of such candidates as such elector shall designate, and no elector shall take out of such polling place any such voting paper, either before or after he has marked the same, and any person wilfully infringing any of the provisions of this clause, or obstructing the polling by any unnecessary delay in performing any act within the polling place, shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted thereof before two or more justices of the peace, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint by writing under his hand, to be delivered to the chairman any time before Eight o'clock in the morning of the polling day, one scrutineer to be present on his behalf in the polling room.

6. It shall be lawful for the chairman, or any scrutineer, to put to any person before he shall have received his voting paper the following questions only.

1. What is your name and surname?
2. Are you of twenty-one years of age?
3. Are you a ratepayer on the ratepayers' roll of this municipality?
4. Have you paid all rates levied upon you except such as shall have become payable by you within six months before this election?
5. Have you already voted at this election?

And if any person shall wilfully give a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and upon being convicted thereof before two or more justices of the peace shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. At every election, it shall be the duty of the town clerk or his deputy to provide himself with the ratepayers' roll, and as each elector comes forward to demand his voting paper, to see whether the name of such elector appears on the ratepayers' roll as a ratepayer within the meaning of the said Act, and as such elector deposits his voting paper within the ballot box to mark off such elector's name as having voted at such election.

8. In case the voting paper as of any person shall have been received, and any other person shall afterwards demand his voting paper as of the same person, the chairman, when such person shall propose to deposit his voting paper in the ballot box shall refuse to allow the same to be put therein, but shall receive and keep the same apart, and at the close of the election decide whether such person has already voted or not, and if for the purpose of such decision it shall be lawful for the chairman to take evidence upon oath or affirmation, and such decision shall be final and conclusive on all parties, and if it shall appear to the chairman that such person has not already voted at such election, such vote shall be added to the number already polled, but if otherwise, such vote shall not be allowed.

9. At the close of the poll, or as soon after as conveniently may be, the chairman, in the presence of the scrutineers, shall count the number of votes polled for each candidate, and if on the state of the poll being announced the number of votes shall have been found to have been equal for any two or more candidates, one or more of whom, but not all, shall, by the state of the poll and the number of members to be elected, be entitled to be declared elected, the chairman shall, by a casting vote or votes, as the case may be, decide which of the candidates for whom the votes may be equal shall be elected, but no chairman shall be entitled to vote at any election except in case of an equality of votes; and the chairman shall then, in the presence of the scrutineers, seal up all the voting papers given during the election, and safely preserve them amongst the records of the council.

10. In determining the seniority of councillors, for the purposes of this bye-law, it shall be understood to mean those councillors who shall have held office for the longest period without re-election, and having the greatest number of votes when elected.

The voter is to strike out the names of each candidate for whom he does not intend to vote, by drawing a line through the same with a pen.

He must be careful not to leave uncanceled more names than are capable of being returned at this election, namely, names, otherwise the ballot paper will be invalid.

The ballot paper so marked is to be dropped by him into the ballot box.

The voter is not permitted to take his voting paper out of the polling place.

MUNICIPALITY OF FITZ ROY.

BYE-LAW No. 8.—FOR REGULATING THE ERECTION OF EXTERNAL PROJECTIONS, VERANDAS, OR AWNINGS.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 19, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for, *inter alia*, the care and management of the public streets: Be it therefore enacted, that from and after the date hereof, no person shall be permitted to erect or fix any external projection, verandah, or awning, from or before any building, upon or over the footways of the public streets, within the municipal district of Fitz Roy, without having first obtained the written permission of the municipal council, or such officer as they may appoint, and having deposited with the town clerk a written undertaking that the proposed external projection, verandah, or awning, shall in every respect conform to such plans and specifications as the council may from time to time direct to be prepared, describing the position, height, width, materials, and other particulars respecting the said external projections, verandahs, or awnings. Further, be it enacted that any person erecting or altering any external projection, verandah, or awning, without having first obtained permission so to do, and having obtained such permission failing to comply in every respect with said plans and specifications, shall be deemed guilty of an infringe-

ment of this bye-law, and shall on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding the sum of Twenty pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 8, made by the municipal council of Fitz Roy, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF MALDON.

BYE-LAW No. 14.—TO REGULATE THE ERECTION OF SHADES OR AWNINGS, AND TO PREVENT ANY OBSTRUCTIONS UPON, OVER, OR ACROSS THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the general good rule thereof: And whereas it is expedient to regulate and control the erection of shades or awnings over or across the public footpaths within the municipal district of Maldon so as to prevent their becoming public nuisances, and also to prevent the placing of goods and chattels on the footpaths within the said district: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Maldon aforesaid, that any person or persons who shall erect or cause to be erected any shade, awning, or other obstruction over, upon, or across any public footpath within the said municipal district, without first having obtained in writing the consent of the said municipal council to such erection, shall on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace for the said district forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds. And be it further ordered and enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every such shade, awning, or obstruction, when such consent to the erection of the same shall have been obtained as aforesaid, shall be erected with the upright posts or pillars thereof immediately in a line with the outside of the kerbstone or other boundary of the footpaths, and in those streets where the footpaths have not yet been formed at a distance of not less than twelve (12) feet from the surveyed building line, and that the plate rafter or tie of any such shade, awning, or obstruction shall not be at a less height above the surface of such footpaths than eight (8) feet in the clear to the underside of such rafter, tie, or plate. And be it further ordered and enacted, that it shall be lawful for the said council to direct and require the removal of any shade, awning, or other obstruction erected across, over, or upon any footpath of the said municipal district, except the same be in strict accordance with the foregoing directions, whether such shade, awning, or obstruction shall have been erected prior to the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor or subsequently thereto. And it shall further be lawful for the said council by their officer to give notice to any owner or occupier by whom or for whom such shade, awning, or obstruction shall have been erected, to remove the same; and any such owner or occupier who shall neglect or refuse to remove any such shade, awning, or obstruction within forty-eight (48) hours from the time of such notice of removal being given, shall on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace for the said district forfeit and pay for every such offence, neglect, or refusal, a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds. And be it further ordered and enacted by the said municipal council, that any person who shall place or cause to be placed any goods or chattels on any footpath for exhibition or sale, or for any other purpose, so as to obstruct, hinder, or prevent the free passage on any such footpath, shall on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace for the said district forfeit and pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 14, made by the municipal council of Maldon, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

BYE-LAW No. 12.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE POUNDS TEN SHILLINGS, PORTION OF THE SUM GRANTED OUT OF THE PUBLIC REVENUE FOR THE YEAR 1859.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that every work proposed to be executed by any municipal council by funds raised by aid of Government, whether by endowment or otherwise, shall be the subject of a distinct and separate bye-law: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Portland, that the sum of One thousand two hundred and eighty-nine pounds ten shillings, portion of the sum granted to the municipal council of Portland for the year One thousand

eight hundred and fifty-nine, shall be expended in the works following, namely:—

BYE-LAW No. 22.—To AUTHORISE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF WARRNAMBOOL TO APPLY THE LEGISLATIVE GRANT OF NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-SIX POUNDS THREE SHILLINGS AND ONE PENNY FOR PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTED WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT AFORESAID.

(Under 18 Victoria No. 15.)

THE Parliament of Victoria having granted the sum of Nine hundred and fifty-six pounds three shillings and one penny sterling to the municipality of Warrnambool for the execution of public works therein, the municipal council thereof enact, that the amount of the said grant shall be applied in and towards the execution of such public works as are enumerated in the schedule hereunto appended.

MUNICIPALITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

BYE-LAW No. 43.—To IMPOSE A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND ON AN ASSESSMENT OF ALL PROPERTY IN HOUSES AND LANDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WILLIAMSTOWN, FOR THE CURRENT MUNICIPAL YEAR ENDING 7TH APRIL, 1860.

WHEREAS by an Act of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria and the Legislative Council thereof, 19 Victoria No. 16, intituled, *An Act to amend an Act intituled An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that no toll, rate, or due shall be imposed by the council of any municipal district save by bye-law, subject to the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as in the said recited Act mentioned: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Williamstown, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the provisions of the said Act, the hereinmentioned rate of One shilling in the pound shall be and be taken to be the rate on the assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of the municipal district of Williamstown, for the current municipal year ending 7th April, 1860, to be and remain in force until a new rate be made by the municipal council for the district of Williamstown, as required by the provisions of the 18th Victoria No. 15, section 33.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 43, made by the municipal council of Williamstown, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

DOG NUISANCE ACT EXTENDED.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has extended the provisions of the Act 6 William IV. No. 4, intituled, *An Act for abating the nuisance occasioned by dogs in the streets of certain towns and on Highways in New South Wales*, to the townships of Yackandandah, Leithridge, Bannockburn, Teesdale, Shelford, and Inverleigh.

The boundaries of the said townships are hereinafter described, viz.:—
