# COAST AND HARBOR LIGHTS, VICTORIA.

WITH reference to the notice published in the *Government Gazette* of the 31st May, 1859, relative to "Coast and Harbor Lights" in Victoria, the following intimation, giving details of the position of, and other matters relating to, the Lighthouses at Portland Bay, Port Fairy, Warrnambool, and Port Albert respectively, is published for the general information of mariners.

# NOTICE TO MARINERS.

## FOUR NEW HARBOR LIGHTHOUSES, VICTORIA.

IN accordance with the intimations contained in two notices to mariners issued from this office, dated respectively 7th May, 1858, and 28th May, 1859: Notice is hereby given that lights were last night exhibited from the undermentioned new lighthouses.

These lights are fourth class catadioptric, and will continue to be exhibited every night hereafter from sunset to sunrise.

## 1. PORTLAND BAY HARBOR LIGHT.

The lighthouse at Portland Bay is situated on Battery Hill; its approximate position is lat. 38° 22' S, long. 141° 39' E.

The light is a *fixed red light*, elevated one hundred and sixteen (116) feet above the mean level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather at the distance of about thirteen (13) nautical miles, allowing ten (10) feet for the height of the eye, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The light will be visible to seaward from N. by W. round easterly to S.E.

The lighthouse is built of stone, and colored *grey*.

The light hitherto shown at the seaward end of the jetty was also last night altered in color from *red* to *green*.

**Caution.**—Vessels from the westward bound to Portland Bay must be careful in rounding the Lawrence Rocks not to bring the light to bear to the northward of N.W. by W. After passing the Lawrence Rocks a course may be shaped for the light, keeping it on the port bow, and not standing in to less than six (6) fathoms. When abreast of the anchorage, the jetty light, colored green, will be visible bearing west.

Bearings taken from lighthouse and the approximate distances:—

Lawrence Rocks, eastern point	S.E., 4 miles.
Whalers' Bluff, extreme north point	N.W. by N., 1 mile.
Whalers' Reef Buoy	N. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., 1 do.

## 2. PORT FAIRY HARBOR LIGHT.

The lighthouse at Port Fairy is situated on the south-eastern part of Rabbit Island, about five (5) yards from high water-mark; its approximate position is lat. 38° 24' S, long. 142° 20' E.

The light is *fixed and flashing, colored red*, showing a *bright flash* every three minutes. At a distance of six (6) miles and upwards it will appear as a *steady light* for a space of one minute and forty seconds, be suddenly *eclipsed* thirty-four seconds, then exhibit a *bright flash* for twelve seconds, and be again *eclipsed* for thirty-four seconds, when the *steady light* will re-appear.

When a vessel is within about three (3) miles of the light the eclipses will be scarcely observable, a continued fixed light being at that distance, in clear weather, visible between the intervals of the bright flashes.

The light is elevated forty-one (41) feet above the mean level of the sea, and is visible to seaward from N. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., round by east and south to S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., at the distance of nine (9) nautical miles, allowing ten (10) feet for the height of the eye, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The lighthouse tower is circular, built of stone, and colored *red*.

Mariners are particularly requested to note the distinctive features of the Port Fairy and Cape Otway lights, the latter being *white*, and attaining its greatest brilliancy once every minute.

**Caution.**—Masters of vessels working in shore to the westward of Port Fairy must be careful not to bring the light to bear to the eastward of E.N.E.

The light should not be approached nearer than one (1) mile until it bears W. by S. when a N.W. by W. course may be steered for the roads. When the light bears S. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. anchor in six and a half (6½) or seven (7) fathoms.

To avoid fouling the moorings, do not bring the light to the southward of S. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.

No strangers should attempt to pick up this light in thick weather, nor enter Port Fairy at night.

Bearings taken from the lighthouse and the approximate distances:—

South end Julia Percy Island	W. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., 13 miles.
S.S.E. extremity of reef off Dusty Miller Island	S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., 2 do.
N.E. extremity of Rabbit Island Reef	N.E. by E., $\frac{1}{2}$ do.
Outer mooring anchor buoy	N. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., 2 do.

## 3. WARRNAMBOOL HARBOR LIGHT.

The lighthouse at Warrnambool is situated on Middle Island; its approximate position is lat. 36° 26' S, long. 142° 32' E.

The light is a *fixed white light* elevated seventy-eight (78) feet above the mean level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather at the distance of about thirteen (13) nautical miles, allowing ten (10) feet for the height of the eye, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The light will be visible to seaward from all points of the compass.

**Caution.**—Vessels from the westward should not bring the light to bear to the southward of E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S., nor to the westward of N.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. if from the eastward.

No stranger should attempt to enter this harbor at night, nor should the light be approached within one (1) mile.

Bearings taken from the lighthouse and the approximate distances:—

S.E. extremity of reef	S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., 5 cables length
Southern extremity of Hopkins Reef	E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., 2 miles.

## 4. PORT ALBERT HARBOR LIGHT.

The Port Albert lighthouse is situated on the eastern end of La Trobe Island; its approximate position is in lat. 38° 46' S, long. 146° 31' E.

The light is *fixed and flashing*, colored *red*, showing a *bright flash* every three minutes at a distance of six (6) miles and upwards; it will appear as a *steady light* for a space of one minute and forty seconds, be suddenly *eclipsed* thirty-four seconds, then exhibit a *bright flash* for twelve seconds, and be again *eclipsed* for thirty-four seconds, when the *steady light* will re-appear.

When a vessel is within about three (3) miles of the light the eclipses will be scarcely observable, a continued fixed light being at that distance visible between the intervals of the bright flashes.

The light is elevated forty (40) feet above the mean level of the sea, and will be visible to seaward from E. by N. round southerly to S.W. at the distance of nine (9) nautic miles, allowing ten (10) feet for the height of the eye, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The lighthouse tower is built of wood and colored *red*. Bearings taken from the lighthouse and the approximate distances are—

Outer red buoy, old channel	S. E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.	3 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles.
Cliffy Island	S. E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.	13 do.
North Seal Island	S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.	9 do.

Point Townsend	S. W.	3 $\frac{1}{2}$ do.

#### SECTIONS V. TO X. OF TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF YACKANDANDAH.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them, and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Yackandandah, in the pastoral district of the Murray, the limits whereof are hereinafter defined, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X.

And I do hereby define the limits of the said township of Yackandandah in manner following, viz:—Commencing at the northern angle of allotment 1 of section A in the township of Yackandandah; thence by a line bearing south 33 degrees 10 minutes west 23 chains and 20 links; thence by a line bearing south 33 degrees 10 minutes east 52 chains and 80 links; thence by a line bearing south 4 degrees 50 minutes west 34 chains and 10 links; thence by a line bearing east 4 degrees 50 minutes south to the Yackandandah Creek; thence by that creek to its junction with Marcus's Creek; thence by that creek to the northern boundary of the main road from Yackandandah to Albany; thence by a line bearing west 25 chains; thence by a line bearing south 40 degrees west 70 chains and 60 links to the Commissioner's Creek; and thence north-westerly by that creek to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this second day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the more easy Recovery of certain Debts and Demands*, it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden, and that the judge of each court holden under the said Act shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall have directed that such court shall be holden at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order direct that a county court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act at the place and within the interval following, that is to say:—

At Fryerstown, once at least in every three calendar months.

And the Honorable Henry Samuel Chapman, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### PREPARATION OF JURY LISTS FOR THE JURY DISTRICT OF FRYERSTOWN.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of August, 1859.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the year of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating Juries*, it is enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff: and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing even date herewith, it is ordered that a county court shall be holden at Fryerstown, the same being a place at which a county court has not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order direct that jury lists shall be prepared for the jury district of Fryerstown, in the manner and within the intervals hereinafter stated, that is to say:—

The clerk of petty sessions at Fryerstown shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury lists for the jury district of Fryerstown on or before Tuesday, the sixth day of September now next ensuing; such lists shall be prepared forthwith, and shall be published on Sunday, the twenty-fifth day of September aforesaid; the court of petty sessions at Fryerstown aforesaid shall revise such lists on Thursday, the twenty-ninth day of September aforesaid; such lists shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Monday, the third day of October, in the present year; and the jury books shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Monday, the tenth day of the said month of October.

And the Honorable Henry Samuel Chapman, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.**  
HAMILTON.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and sixty householders resident at Hamilton, in the county of Dundas, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident in the township of Hamilton, in the county of Dundas, and they are convinced that its erection into a municipal district will tend materially to advance its interests, and conduce to its improvement and good government.

They suggest that the proposed district be bounded as follows, viz.:—"Commencing at the north-west corner of section A, in the parish of North Hamilton; thence running due south to the south-west corner of allotment 3, South Hamilton suburbs; thence in a line running due east to the south-east corner of allotment 63 of the same suburbs; thence due north to the north-east corner of allotment number 2 of section 1; thence due west to the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section 1; thence due south to a point opposite the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section C, in the parish of North Hamilton; and thence in a line due west to the commencing point; and which boundaries comprise sections A, C, and part of section 1, in the parish of North Hamilton, and sections B, 2, and part of section 1, and the South Hamilton suburbs, in the parish of South Hamilton, together with the town of Hamilton reserve."

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that the above described land may be proclaimed a municipality under the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

**COUNTER PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.**  
HAMILTON.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the counter petition hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and sixty-four householders, resident at and near Hamilton, in the county of Dundas, opposed to the erection of their locality into a municipal district, as prayed for in the petition published on the 5th of August and at subsequent dates.

The counter petitioners state that the application for a municipality was instigated by a few individuals in opposition to the wishes of the majority of the people of Hamilton and its vicinity, who, they state, are averse to incorporation.

That the most prominent among the applicants possess no property at Hamilton, and are therefore supposed to be influenced by motives apart from local interests such as municipal institutions can alone legitimately further.

That some of those who were induced to sign the petition, desirous now to testify their dissatisfaction, have affixed their signatures to this counter petition.

They further state that the local road board allocated a sum of £300 for the repair of their streets, but that this was refused through the instrumentality of some of the petitioners for a municipality.

That they are of opinion that incorporation will not tend to the advantage of Hamilton, which, nevertheless, they admit is retrograding rather than in a progressive condition, and they express apprehensions that the rates levied by a municipal council will exceed those of the local road board.

And the counter petitioners pray as follows:—"Your petitioners most humbly and earnestly solicit your Excellency not to grant a municipal council to the late petitioners of Hamilton."

**MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.**

BYE-LAW No. 22.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE AND FIX THE RATES OF TOLLS AND DUES TO BE LEVIED IN THE BALLAARAT AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE AND CATTLE MARKET.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of markets, market dues, &c.:

And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the seventeenth day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the township of Ballaarat was duly established a municipal district under the provisions of and within the meaning of the said Act:

And whereas the said market was duly approved of by the Governor, and with the advice of the Executive Council, and gazetted for that purpose, bearing date the eleventh day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine:

Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Ballaarat, that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, the following tolls and dues shall be levied in the said market.

## RULES FOR THE REGULATION AND GOVERNMENT OF THE MARKETS OF MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT.

1. That the market shall be open for the receipt and delivery of all agricultural produce, and for any of the cattle named in the foregoing schedule, every day during the year from sunrise to sunset, excepting on Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday, on which days no business will be transacted therein.

2. There shall be appointed an officer or officers, to be called the market inspector or inspectors, whose duties shall be generally as follows:—

1. To see that the market regulations are duly observed in and with respect to the said market or markets.
2. To preserve order and regularity in the market, and to apprehend or cause to be apprehended and lodged in the police station any person making a riot or disturbance, or cursing, swearing, or using indecent language, or offending against decency, or in any manner or way provoking to a breach of the peace within the precincts of such market.
3. To allot the pens or yards to the use of parties bringing stock to the market for sale, in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient.
4. To inspect all articles exposed for sale in the market, and to prohibit the sale of any articles in such markets which such inspector or inspectors may consider noisome or offensive.
5. To take charge of the market weighbridge, and of the scales and standard weights and measures of such market, and to receive for weighing any article or articles on the market weighing bridge or scales, the several amounts specified in the schedule of tolls and dues annexed to these regulations.

3. That hay and all other agricultural produce shall be sold only between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. in summer, and 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. in winter, and each load to be weighed as it enters the market.

4. The cattle sold in this market will be delivered subject to the bye-law of the municipal council of Ballaarat, No. 19 B, for regulating the driving of cattle, &c., into or through the township of Ballaarat.

5. The market for the sale of milch cows, calves, pigs, sheep, and lambs, will be open from 5 o'clock a.m. to 12 o'clock noon in summer, and from 7 o'clock a.m. in winter to 12 o'clock noon.

The summer month is meant to extend from the 1st day of October to the 31st of March in each year, both days inclusive; the winter months is meant to extend from the 1st day of April to the 30th day of September, both days inclusive, in each year.

6. That any person who may resist the inspector or inspectors in the discharge of their duty, shall, independently of any other penalty which he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

7. That the party or parties placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all market dues and tolls accruing thereon, and in no case shall any stock be taken out of the market until all dues, tolls and charges demandable on such stock under these regulations shall have been first fully paid and satisfied.

8. Any person or persons who may place stock in the market for sale, and neglect for two whole days to supply such stock with sufficient food and water, shall upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## CORN EXCHANGE.

1. The corn exchange shall be open for the sale of all grain produce free of charge on Thursdays and Saturdays of each week, from 11 o'clock a.m. to 1 o'clock p.m.

2. That all sales shall be effected by samples, of which the inspector of the market shall take charge, and shall deliver them up only at the joint request of buyer and seller.
