BEECHWORTH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS.—[26th August, 1859.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the 26th day of August, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:-

125. *Supply of water to be held under permit, how gauged.*—Bye-law No. 123 shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—The occupier of a race shall be entitled to the use of the following quantity of water, namely—in the Spring Creek, Snake Valley, and Three-mile Creek divisions of the mining district of Beechworth, to a stream of water running for twelve hours on each day, to be gauged by a box six feet long, twelve inches wide, and six inches deep in the inner measurement, with an opening of a uniform depth of one and one-eighth inch across the bottom; but in cases where the occupier of a race claims under the written permission of any commissioner or warden of the gold fields to be entitled to a supply of water for any longer period than twelve hours, and has continued to occupy under such permission, the occupier of such race shall be entitled to the full supply set forth in the written permission of such commissioner or warden, to be gauged nevertheless as aforesaid; in the Woolshed, Buckland, Yackandandah, and Omeo divisions, to a stream of water running continuously for the whole twenty-four hours, to be gauged in the Woolshed, Buckland, and Omeo divisions by a box of the same length, width, and depth as before mentioned,

with an opening of a uniform depth of three inches across the bottom; in the Yackandandah division to be gauged by a box of the same length and width as before mentioned, but only three inches and a half deep in the inner measurement, and with an opening of a uniform depth of three inches across the bottom. In all cases the box to be fixed on a dead level in the race, immediately below the spot where the race receives its last supply; the race to be made perfectly level for a distance of not less than twelve feet immediately above the box, where an overshot shall be formed extending one entire side of a corresponding height with the sides of the box, and in races conveying more than one head of water the box to be increased in width twelve inches for every additional head of water the race may be permitted to carry.

126. *Time allowed for procuring machinery.*—Bye-law No. 94 shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—Any person requiring the aid of steam or horse power on his claim, shall, when steam power is required, be allowed two months, and when horse power is required, one month for procuring the same; provided that a notice, setting forth the nature of the power required, whether steam or horse power, the name of the claimholder, and the date of registration under which the claim is held, be prominently posted upon the claim. But in the event of any other person claiming to occupy such claim before the expiration of the period allowed to the original claimholder for procuring machinery, the onus of proof that the person claiming the protection of this bye-law is *bona fide* engaged in procuring the necessary machinery without any unnecessary delay or evasion, shall rest with the person posting such notice, and on failure of such proof the claim shall be deemed absolutely forfeited and abandoned.

127. *Defining extent of ground to be occupied for residence or business purposes.*—Bye-law No. 53 shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—Every miner's right or business license shall entitle the holder thereof during the continuance of such right or license to occupy for residence or business purposes a portion of ground not exceeding twenty perches in extent.

128. *Registration of tail races and tunnels.*—Bye-law No. 69 shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—Any miner desirous of cutting a tail race or tunnel for any mining purpose, shall first register the same, showing the point from which it is proposed to cut or drive such tail race or tunnel, also showing the claim or claims to which it is in the first place proposed to be carried.

129. *Diversion of water.*—Bye-law No. 64 shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—When the water of any unoccupied creek is not required in the bed of such creek, or when the water of any occupied creek may happen to be in excess of the mining requirements of that creek, any person may, subject to any bye-law regulating the supply of water, divert such water for mining purposes; but in the event of the water in either case being required in the bed of the creek from which it has been diverted, it shall be imperative upon the person so diverting the water, upon receiving a notice in writing from any person requiring the water for mining purposes within the bed of such creek, within three days from the receipt of such notice to cause such diversion, or return the water at a point so as to be made available to the person giving the notice; but the compliance with such notice shall in no way affect the priority of right existing in the person diverting the same upon any future occasion, when the water may happen not to be required in the bed of the creek.

MARYBOROUGH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS.—[1st August, 1859.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Maryborough, begun and holden at Maryborough, in the said district, on the 1st day of August, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

CLASS K.—GENERAL BYE-LAWS.

No. 123. *Surveyors' fees.*—That a competent practical mining surveyor be appointed to each division of the Maryborough district, and that the district be divided into five divisions. The duty of the mining surveyor shall be to make, when required, engineering plans and reports of ground or privileges applied for under these bye-laws, measure and mark off claims, survey in all cases of encroachment or alleged encroachment, see that the mining regulations of the division under his charge are strictly carried out, and furnish to the mining board a quarterly report of the progress and condition of mining operations within his division. He shall keep a book in which he shall register all transactions, with the dates, names of parties, and all matters connected with his duty as a surveyor, such book to be produced when required by the warden or mining board; and further, in all cases of disputes or grants, the miner who shall desire any information from such transaction book may obtain the same on payment of One shilling. He shall also keep a correct account of the moneys received and transmit the same, when called upon, to the clerk of the mining board, and that the scale of fees to be paid shall be as follows:—

124. *Old ground.*—Old ground or ground previously worked and abandoned shall be understood to mean only such ground on which a number of shafts have been sunk, and which for the greater part has been undermined or otherwise worked out. Where any dispute arises as to whether ground should be considered "old ground," the warden or other authorised person and four assessors shall decide the question.

CLASS C.—WET ALLUVIAL SINKING.

26 A. *Day water baling.*—All parties having sunk their shafts to the water shall bale the water from their shafts for at least eight hours daily, if not sooner exhausted; and it shall be competent for the majority of claimholders to fix the minimum capacity of the bucket or other vessel used in such water baling. The non-compliance with this bye-law shall, on the decision of

the warden or other authorised person and four assessors, be deemed a forfeiture of the right to the claim.
