The property taken from him consisted of nine £1 notes and some silver, and a grey cotton quilt stitched crossways. The notes were wrapped in a piece of paper, and the silver was in a small bag or purse of dark cloth about five inches long and two inches wide.

AMHERST PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and regulations made by the trustees of the Amherst General Cemetery.

- All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton at the lodge or at the office of the trustees, such notice to be given before Four o'clock p.m. on the day previous to the funeral; if not, an extra charge will be made.
- The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
- Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in

the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock throughout the year.

5. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees or their surveyor, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. By the 8th section of the Act, "it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such cemetery to permit any vault or grave to be dug and made in such cemetery, and any monument or tombstone to be erected or placed on any parts of any such cemetery as they may think proper, upon payment to them by the person desiring to dig and make such vault or grave, and to erect and place such monument or tombstone, of such fees as shall from time to time be established by the said trustees; and any such person so digging and making such vaults or erections, or erecting and placing such monument in such cemetery by and with permission as aforesaid, and upon payment of the fees aforesaid, shall be entitled to have maintained and kept up such vault, monument or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person and his representatives for ever."

8. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission in the form set out in the schedule will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in the schedule.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves and gravestones, to be kept in proper repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act, "to withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected according to the description, size and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner." In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

12. The plans of all fences to be submitted to the trustees; wooden fencing allowed, but must be after a mode to be seen on application, and may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner, if not kept in proper repair.

13. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is to be kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule; and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

16. The ground will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

17. Any person who shall wantonly or willfully destroy or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, shall, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

18. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

19. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

20. No grave to be of a less depth than eight feet.


