POLLING DAY ALTERED, MURRAY DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the nineteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, *An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively*, it is amongst other things enacted, that no election shall be held to be void in consequence of any delay in the holding of the election at the time appointed, or in the taking the poll, or in the return of the writ, such delay not extending beyond the day named for the return of the writ, or in consequence of any impediments of a technical or formal nature, and it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to cause to be adopted such measures as may be necessary for removing any obstacle, or the doing of, or the omission to do, any act of a technical or formal nature by which, or the want of which, the due course of any election may be impeded: Provided that the measures so taken as aforesaid shall be forthwith declared by the Governor by a Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas in consequence of the failure to take the poll on the day appointed for one of the divisions of the Murray District for the election of a member to serve in the Legislative Assembly, it has been found necessary to appoint another day for such purpose: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, appointed the day named in the third column of the schedule hereunto annexed to be the day for taking the poll at the polling places for the division of the Murray District mentioned in the first column of the same schedule, in lieu of the day previously appointed, viz.:—

Division.	Polling Places.	Day of Polling.
Omeo	Omeo and Snowy Creek	20th September.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.
