DIVISIONS OF THE MINING DISTRICT OF BEECHWORTH ALTERED.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the thirty-first day of January, 1859.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to split any mining district as thereafter mentioned into any number of divisions, and to define the limits and boundaries thereof respectively, and also to determine the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division, and from time to time to alter any such division and the limits and boundaries thereof, and to vary the number of members which shall be elected within and for every such division, but so that the total number of members elected for such district shall in no case exceed or be less than ten: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the divisions into which the mining district of Beechworth was divided by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing date the fourth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and doth hereby split the said mining district into the eight divisions named in the first column of the schedule hereunto annexed, and doth define the limits and boundaries of each such division to be those set opposite thereto respectively in the second column of the same schedule, and doth determine that the number of members of the mining board of the said mining district which shall be elected within and for each such division shall be that set immediately under the name of each such division respectively in the first column of the said schedule.

THE SCHEDULE.

Names of the Eight Divisions.	Limits and Boundaries of Divisions.
SPRING CREEK ... One member	As described in the Order of the Governor in Council of the fourth day of January, A.D. 1858.
SNAKE VALLEY ... One member	As described in the same Order.
THREE MILE CREEK ... One member	As described in the same Order.
BUCKLAND ... One member	As described in the same Order.
YACKANDANDAH ... One member	As described in the same Order.
OMELO ... One member	As described in the same Order.
WOOLSHED ... One member	Commencing at Mount Pilot; thence westerly by the range dividing the waters of the Black Dog Creek and Reedy Creek, and by a line west, crossing the River Owens to Fuller's Range; thence southerly by that range to a point due west of the junction of Hodgson's Creek and the River Owens; thence east to the said junction; thence by Hodgson's Creek eight miles and forty chains; thence by the range forming the northern part of the basin of Hodgson's Creek, and by a line north to the falls on Spring Creek, below the town of Beechworth; thence by the boundaries of the Spring Creek and Snake Valley divisions to the Yackandandah Gap; thence by a line north-westerly to Mount Pilot, the commencing point.
INDIGO ... Three members	Commencing at Mount Pilot; thence westerly by the range dividing the waters of the Black Dog Creek and Reedy Creek, and by a line west, crossing the River Owens, to Fuller's Range; thence northerly by that range and by a line easterly to the junction of the River Murray and the River Owens; thence easterly by the River Murray to the Indigo Creek; thence southwards by the Indigo Creek and by a line bearing south to Mount Pilot, the commencing point.

And the Honorable John O'Shanassy, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## THE MINING DISTRICT OF SANDHURST ENLARGED.

*At the Government House, Melbourne, the thirty-first day of January, 1859.*

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to erect any portion of the colony into a mining district, and to give to such district some distinguishing name, and to define the limits and boundaries thereof, and also again to abolish any such district, and from time to time to alter and vary such limits and boundaries: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council bearing date the fourth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain portions of the colony were erected into mining districts, and were named and defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to enlarge the mining district of Sandhurst: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order vary and alter the mining district of Sandhurst, and doth hereby define the limits and boundaries thereof as follows, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-western angle of the parish of Lockwood; thence west four miles; thence north thirty-two miles; thence east to the Bendigo Creek; thence southwards by that creek and a line east to a point on the River Campaspe due west of Barrow's Inn; thence southwards by the River Campaspe to a point due west of Mount Camel; thence by a line east to the Corinella Creek; thence northwards by that creek to Lake Cooper; thence by the eastern shores of that lake to the most northern point thereof; thence by a line east to the River Goulburn; thence southward by the River Goulburn to Hughes's Creek; thence by a line south-westerly to the source of the Melvor or Patterson's Creek; thence by a line north-westerly to the junction of the Rivers Coliban and Campaspe; thence westward by the River Coliban, the Myrtle Creek and the Mount Alexander Range to the northern boundary of the parish of Harcourt; thence west seven miles and sixty-four chains; and thence north to the commencing point last aforesaid.

Commencing again at the source of Mollison's Creek; thence by that creek to the Sugar Loaf Creek; thence by the Sugar Loaf Creek to a point due west of the junction of the Dabyminga Creek and the River Goulburn; thence by a line east to the said junction; thence by the River Goulburn to the Muddy Creek; thence by the Muddy Creek to the Main Dividing Range; and thence by the Main Dividing Range to the source of Mollison's Creek, the commencing point last aforesaid.

And the Honorable John O'Shanassy, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to split any mining district as thereinbefore mentioned into any number of divisions and to define the limits and boundaries thereof respectively, and also to determine the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division, and from time to time to alter any such division and the limits and boundaries thereof, and to vary the number of members which shall be elected within and for every such division, but so that the total number of members elected for such district shall in no case exceed or be less than ten: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing date the fourth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the mining district of Sandhurst was split into the divisions therein mentioned: And whereas by another Order of the Governor in Council, bearing even date herewith, the said mining district has been enlarged, and it is expedient to declare the divisions thereof, and the boundaries and limits of such divisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order again split the said mining district of Sandhurst into four divisions, and doth define the limits and boundaries of every such division to be those set opposite thereto in the last column of the schedule hereunto annexed, and doth determine that the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division shall be that set immediately under the name of every such division respectively in the first column of the said schedule, that is to say:—

SANDHURST ... <i>Five members</i>	As described in the Order of the Governor in Council of the fourth day of January, A.D. 1858.
HEATHCOTE ... <i>Two members</i>	As described in the same Order.
WAEANGA ... <i>Two members</i>	As described in the same Order.
KILMORE ... <i>One member</i>	Commencing at the source of Mollison's Creek; thence by that creek to the Sugar Loaf Creek; thence by the Sugar Loaf Creek to a point due west of the junction of the Dabyminga Creek and the River Goulburn; thence by a line east to the said junction; thence by the River Goulburn to the Muddy Creek; thence by the Muddy Creek to the Main Dividing Range; and thence by the Main Dividing Range to the source of Mollison's Creek, the commencing point.

And the Honorable John O'Shanassy, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
