FIRST SESSION OF THE SECOND PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

HEREAS by The Constitution Act it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and (subject to the limitation in the said Act contained) such times for holding the first and every other session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria, and to vary and alter the same respectively as he might think fit: And whereas it is expedient to fix the time for holding the next Session of the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly now called "The Parliament of Victoria:" Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as aforesaid, appoint and proclaim that the First Session of the Second Parliament of Victoria shall commence and be holden for the despatch of business on Thursday, the thirteenth day of the month of October now next ensuing, at Twelve of the clock at noon, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Parliament Place, Spring Street, in the city of Melbourne: And the Members of the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.
