## MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HOTHAM.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, notwithstanding any Act, law, or statute to the contrary, to declare as a municipal district as therein-before mentioned, or to include within the limits and boundaries of any municipal district to be declared as therein mentioned, any locality now included within the corporate limits of the corporation of the city of Melbourne, and upon the publication of any Proclamation defining the limits of any such municipal district, the locality included within such limits should cease to be a portion of or to be or be deemed to be within the corporate limits of the said corporation, or to be in any manner subject thereto, and should belong solely to the municipal district described in such Proclamation, provided that no liability existing at the time of any such Proclamation for any rate, or the means of enforcing the same, should be affected by the said Act or such Proclamation: And whereas a petition numerously signed by the ratepayers and householders of Hotham Ward, situate within the corporate limits of the said city of Melbourne, has been presented to the Governor, praying for the separation of the said ward from the city, and the erection thereof into a distinct municipal district, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in accordance with the said Act: And whereas the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, has, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, determined the proportion of the entire liability to be borne by the municipal district hereby erected in respect of any loan contracted by the corporation of the said city: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:-

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HOTHAM:—Commencing at that point intersected by lines passing through the centre of Victoria street and the centre of Elizabeth street; thence by a line passing through the centre of Victoria street and by a line bearing west to a marked post at the western boundary of the city of Melbourne; thence by a line bearing north to the Flemington road; and thence by a line passing through the centre of the Flemington road and through the centre of Elizabeth street to the commencing point.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Hotham."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

**NOTICE TO MARINERS.—TWO ADDITIONAL BUOYS IN PORT PHILLIP BAY.**

A small ridge of sand having recently formed off the Quarantine Ground, near the western entrance of the South Channel:

Notice is hereby given that a black and white chequered buoy has been placed on the shallowest part of the ridge.

The buoy lies in 19 feet at low water spring tides, with the following compass bearings:—

- Upper Lighthouse N.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.
- Beacon on Point Nepean W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.
- Flagstaff on eastern end of Quarantine Ground S. by W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W.
- Nepean Rock kept open of Point Nepean clears the ridge.

A black buoy has also been placed on the outer edge of the long flat between Shortland's Bluff and Swan Spit.

The buoy lies in 18 feet at low water spring tides, with the following marks and compass bearings:—

- Point Lonsdale flagstaff a little open, to the southward of the lower lighthouse, bearing S.W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W.
- Swan Spit Beacon N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.


