BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

BYE-LAWS.—[4th October, 1859.]

AT a meeting of the Board of Agriculture, holden in the Board Room, at the Public Lands Office, La Trobe street west, in the city of Melbourne, on the 4th day of October, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, it is ordained as follows (that is to say):—

3. No agricultural society which shall in future be established shall receive any portion of the grants-in-aid from the Government if such society's permanent show-yards be situated within twenty miles of the permanent show-yards of any agricultural society in connection with the board; but this rule shall not affect any society which was in connection with the board on the 20th July, 1859.

4. At every meeting of the Board of Agriculture the chairman (or in his absence some other member chosen to preside at such meeting) shall preserve order and check irregularity in the proceedings; state every question, and put it in strict accordance with the true meaning and intent of the proposer; take the sense of the meeting on every such question by a show of hands, or by a division; and to the best of his judgment and ability state how every question has been decided. He shall direct the secretary to take proper minutes of the proceedings, to be entered in a book kept for that purpose; and his first business on assembling at every meeting (if a quorum be present) shall be to cause the secretary to read the minutes of the former meeting, and if they are accurate he shall confirm them and sign his name.

5. Every member proposing any alteration in any bye-law, or wishing to bring forward a motion at the annual general meeting of the Board of Agriculture, shall send notice of the same to the secretary not less than one month previous to the said annual general meeting, and the secretary shall submit such proposed alterations in the bye-laws and motions to the council, by whom the notice paper of the proceedings of the board shall be prepared; and a copy of the notice paper shall be sent to each member with the circular convening the said annual general meeting.

6. Any motion, of which notice has not been given in accordance with Rule 5, may be brought forward at the annual general meeting, with the consent of three-fourths of the members present.

7. Every member bringing forward a motion or amendment shall state the same in writing, and hand it to the chairman.

8. After the question has been put to the meeting a show of hands shall be taken, and if the show of hands shall be considered by any two members present doubtful or unsatisfactory, the chairman shall call for a division, the ayes going to the right and the noes to the left, and the result of every such division and of every uncontested show of hands shall be decisive.

9. The council shall consist of thirteen members, to be chosen by ballot; and it shall have power to give effect to the resolutions of the general meetings, according to their true meaning and intent; to consider all letters, memorials, and correspondence of every kind connected with the Board of Agriculture; to order on the same if of a formal character not requiring the opinion of a general meeting; to consider and prepare questions to be submitted to the general meetings, and generally to sit as the executive committee of the board.

10. The chairman of the council shall preside and keep order at every meeting, see that accurate minutes are kept of the proceedings, and confirm the minutes of the previous meeting on their being read the secretary.

11. The council shall cause to be furnished by the secretary or other officer of every agricultural society in connection with the board, properly certified returns relative to exhibitions, matches, prizes, and other matters and things of value and interest, and it shall prescribe the forms in which such returns shall be made.

12. The council shall prepare and submit to the annual general meeting of the board a report of the proceedings of the board and the council, with such returns from the agricultural societies as it shall deem useful, together with a detailed report of the operations on the Experimental Farm, and those reports shall be printed for general circulation.

13. An annual general meeting of the Board of Agriculture shall be held on the 15th day of July in each year (or if that day shall be Sunday or a public holiday, on the next following day), and the same shall be convened by circulars issued by the secretary fourteen clear days previous to such meeting.

14. A special meeting of the Board of Agriculture shall be convened by the council on its own motion, or on a requisition addressed to the council signed by ten members; and circulars stating the business proposed to be transacted shall be issued by the secretary fourteen clear days previous to any such meeting, and no business other than that of which notice was given shall be transacted.

15. An ordinary meeting of the council shall be held on the third Wednesday (or if that day shall be a public holiday, on the next following day) of the months of August, October, December, February, April, and June, and the same shall be convened by circulars issued by the secretary.

16. A special meeting of the council shall be called on the authority of the chairman, or on a requisition signed by three members of the council, presented to the secretary; and notice of the business proposed to be transacted, and the time and

place of meeting, shall be sent to each member fourteen days previously.

17. The secretary shall convene all meetings by circular, in accordance with bye-laws 13, 14, 15, and 16; keep accurate minutes of all proceedings at general and special meetings of the board and council respectively; conduct the correspondence as ordered by the council; and attend every meeting, and read the minutes and other documents ordered to be read by the chairman.

18. All matters relating to the Experimental Farm shall be under the control of the council, and the council shall invite suggestions from agricultural societies represented at the board relative to any experiments which such societies may recommend to be made.

19. Models, samples of seeds, diagrams, &c., contributed to the Agricultural Museum shall be taken charge of by the secretary until suitable accommodation has been provided for a permanent museum and a curator appointed.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same: &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation

throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Newstead, on the confines of the county of Talbot, the limits whereof are hereinafter defined, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X.

And I do hereby define the limits of the said township of Newstead in manner following, viz.:—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of portion 20 of section I. in the parish of Sandon; thence north one hundred chains and forty links; thence east one hundred and sixty chains and seventy links; thence south one hundred chains and forty links; and thence west one hundred and sixty chains and seventy links to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

For the making the road from Carisbrook to Amherst.—Not yet granted.

For having the Government land in the neighborhood sold here instead of Maryborough.—Not granted.

For a tract of land near Moolort Hill for the purpose of commonage.—Not answered.
