MUNICIPALITY OF AMHERST.

BYE-LAW No. II.—FOR THE CONDUCTING OF ELECTIONS AND PUBLIC MEETINGS OF THE RATEPAYERS, THE DETERMINING THE VALIDITY OF DISPUTED ELECTIONS, AND REGULATING THE PROCEEDINGS AT THE ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, section 26, is amongst other things enacted that "it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings;" and whereas by the 33rd section of the said Act it is further enacted that no such bye-law shall have any force or effect until the Lieutenant Governor shall under his hand have signified his assent thereto: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Amherst, That from and after the date of the said Governor's assent hereto, all proceedings of the said council shall be conducted according to the following regulations, that is to say:—

1. At all public meetings of the ratepayers convened by the council or the chairman, for the election of councillors or other municipal business, the chairman, or in his absence the senior councillor then present, shall preside, and in case of an equality of votes shall have a casting vote.

2. When a poll is demanded at any nomination of members of council, the chairman shall appoint one or more place or places within the municipal boundaries as poll booths; and in case of his appointing more than one such polling place, he shall appoint a deputy to preside at each such booth at which he does not himself preside. He shall also appoint a poll clerk or clerks for each booth, and each candidate may if he thinks proper appoint one scrutineer for each booth; and no person shall be allowed to remain within the barrier at such booth except the parties so to be appointed and the candidates, unless for the purpose of voting, or by the chairman or deputy chairman's special authority.

3. Each voter shall be furnished with a paper or card, which shall be signed on the back by the chairman or deputy chairman, and upon which shall be printed or written the names of the candidates placed in nomination; the voter shall strike out the names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and sign his name thereto; and in case such voter shall be unable to write, he shall signify the same to the chairman or his deputy, who, in the presence of the poll clerk and scrutineers, shall thereupon strike out the name of such candidate as the voter may request, and such act of the chairman or his deputy, in the presence of the clerk and scrutineers, shall be deemed to be the act of the voter, and subject him to the penalties of this bye-law; and no voter shall take out of the polling booth any such voting paper either before or after the same shall have been marked; and any voter wilfully infringing any of the provisions of this clause, or obstructing the polling by any unnecessary delay in performing any act, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

4. The chairman or deputy chairman shall, if requested, put the following questions to the voter before voting:—

(1.) Are you the person whose name appears on the ratepayers' roll, numbered — ?

(2.) Have you voted before at this election ?

5. Any personating or attempting to personate any elector or deceased elector, or who shall vote a second time on the same day, shall upon conviction forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

6. No intelligible voting paper shall be rejected or disallowed for want of form, and should more names be left thereon than there are vacancies, the excess in number may be struck out by or under the direction of the voter.

7. For determining the validity of disputed elections the whole council (the member or members whose election is disputed excepted) shall be a committee of elections and qualifications, four to form a quorum, at which the chairman of the council, or if absent at the commencement of proceedings, the senior councillor present, shall pre-side, and in all cases of equality of votes shall have a casting vote.

8. The committee shall meet in the council chamber on days not appointed for the holding of council meetings, and be attended by the town clerk, who shall record the minutes of each such meeting.

9. The chairman, of his own authority, may, or on the written request of three members to him to that effect, shall, convene meetings of committees of elections, &c.

10. The committee shall have power to regulate their proceedings and to adjourn their meetings, which shall be held with open doors, unless during special deliberations.

11. Each member of committee present shall be required to vote.

12. The ratepayers' roll shall be assumed to be correct, and the committee shall enquire into the identity of the electors, their retention of qualification, and whether the votes were *bona fide*. If proved to the satisfaction of the committee that persons by fraud, force, menace, or any undue influence by or on the part of any candidate, or his agent, committee man, or partisan, or any of them, gave, or were prevented from giving, their votes, such votes shall be struck off or recorded as the case may be established.

13. The acts of authorised agents shall be regarded as those of the principal, if it be proved to the satisfaction of the committee that they were performed with his knowledge, power, or consent.

14. The person determined by the committee to be duly elected shall be declared so to be by the chairman.

15. All petitions complaining of an undue election must be signed by a candidate, or by not less than six ratepayers, and be presented within twenty-one days after the election complained of.

16. Ratepayers may be admitted to defend the election or support the petition if it be abandoned by the person or persons originally presenting it.

17. Written declarations of vacancies in the council resulting from disqualification by absence or otherwise, may be made by the chairman and one or more councillors, and countersigned by the town clerk.

18. Resignation of membership of council shall be made in writing, addressed to the chairman of the council, and be presented by him to the council at the next meeting thereafter, for their ordering on the same.

19. The chairman of the council shall be annually elected in the following manner:—Each councillor being supplied by the town clerk with a voting paper, containing the names of the whole of the members of council, shall mark that of the councillor for whom he votes, and deposit the paper in the urn or voting box. On the delivery of the whole papers (it being obligatory upon every member of council present to vote), if the whole council be present, otherwise after one hour, the chairman shall announce the name of each councillor voted for, the number of such votes, and declare the name of the one who has a majority of votes to be duly elected the chairman of the council for the ensuing municipal year, who shall take the chair accordingly.

20. If the result of voting for chairman should be that the highest number of votes is held equally by two or more councillors, then another voting shall take place for those councillors only holding such equality of votes until a majority is recorded; the chairman giving a casting vote in addition to his own, in case of an equality of votes on the final division.

21. Upon the resignation or disqualification of the chairman of the council, at the next meeting of the council thereafter the senior councillor then present shall take the chair *pro tem*, and immediately after the confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting shall proceed to the election of a chairman of council for the residue of the municipal year in manner prescribed by this bye-law, and in the event of an equality of votes being recorded shall have a casting vote in addition to his own.

22. In determining the seniority of councillors for the purposes of this bye-law, it shall be understood to mean those councillors who shall have held office for the longest period without re-election, and having the greatest number of votes when elected.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. II., made by the municipal council of Amherst, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF ARARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 3.—TO REGULATE THE ERECTION OF SHADES OR AWNINGS, AND PREVENT ANY OBSTRUCTIONS UPON, OVER, OR ACROSS, THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the general good rule thereof: And whereas it is expedient to regulate and control the erection of shades or awnings over or across the public footpaths within the municipal district of Ararat, so as to prevent them becoming public nuisances: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Ararat, that any person or persons who shall erect or cause to be erected any shade, awning, or other obstruction, over, upon, or across, any public footpath within the municipal district, without first having obtained in writing the consent of the said municipal council to such erection, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds: And be it further ordered and directed by the authority aforesaid, that every such shade, awning, or obstruction, when such consent to the erection of the same shall have been obtained, shall be erected with the upright posts or pillars thereof immediately at the outside of the kerb stone or other boundary of the footpaths, and in those streets where the footpaths have not yet been formed, at a distance of not less than twelve feet from the surveyed building line; except in the case of Ingor street and Vincent street, where the distance from the building line shall be ten feet; and that no plate, rafter or tie of any such shade, awning, or obstruction, shall be of a less height above the surface of such footpaths than eight feet in the clear to the underside of such rafter, tie or plate: And be it further ordered and directed that it shall be lawful for the said council to direct and require the removal of any shade, awning, or other obstruction erected across, over or upon any footpath of the said municipal district, except the same be in strict accordance with the foregoing directions, whether such shade, awning, or other obstruction shall have been erected prior to the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency

the Governor, or subsequently thereto: And it shall be further lawful for the said council, by their officer, to give notice to any owner or occupier by whom or for whom such shade, awning, or obstruction shall have been erected, to remove the same, and any such owner or occupier who shall neglect or refuse to remove any such shade, awning, or obstruction, within forty-eight hours from the time of such notice of removal being given, shall, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay for every such offence, neglect, or refusal, a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds sterling: And be it further ordered and directed by the said municipal council, that any person found placing any goods or chattels on any footpath for exhibition or sale, so as to obstruct, hinder, or prevent the free passage on such footpaths, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay any penalty not exceeding Five pounds for the first offence, and for the second offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and for any subsequent offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds sterling.

BYE-LAW No. 4.—FOR THE BETTER PREVENTION OF FIRES. WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the prevention and extinguishing of fires, &c.: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Ararat municipal council, that the owner or occupier of any building who shall allow his chimney to ignite may be summoned by any one having authority from this council before any two or more justices of the peace for the said district, and fined in a sum not exceeding Five pounds sterling: And be it further ordered and directed that any person or persons found kindling or using any fire in the open air within fifty yards of any building or fencing, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace for the said district, pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds sterling.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 3 and 4, made by the municipal council of Ararat, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council. Gazetted on the 4th day of February, 1859, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.

MUNICIPALITY OF ARARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 6.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF HOUSE AND LAND PROPERTY WITHIN THIS MUNICIPAL DISTRICT FOR THE YEAR 1859.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make an assessment on all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district, according to its fair average annual value: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Ararat municipal council, that the assessment on the annual value of property within the municipality of Ararat, estimated at £21,432 7s. sterling, as approved of by the justices of the peace in petty sessions assembled, shall be the value on which the rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound shall be levied, and shall be legal and in force for the municipal year, commencing the 20th day of September, 1858, and ending the 20th day of September, 1859.

BYE-LAW No. 7.—FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND THREEPENCE IN THE POUND ON THE RATEABLE PROPERTY OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ARARAT FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within such district, according to their fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Ararat, that a rate of One Shilling and threepence in the pound for the current year be levied on all property in houses and lands within this municipal district, and be due and payable in two equal sums, the first on the 15th day of February, and the second on the 3rd day of May, 1859.

The foregoing Bye-laws, No. 6 and 7, made by the municipal council of Ararat, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council. Gazetted on the 4th day of February, 1859, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.

MUNICIPALITY OF MALDON.

BYE-LAW No. 7.—FOR THE PREVENTION OF NUISANCES ARISING FROM THE DEPOSIT OF OFFENSIVE MATTERS IN ANY STREET, ROAD, OR PUBLIC PLACE WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF MALDON.

WHEREAS it is expedient to prevent the deposit of dirt, litter, ashes, quartz-tailings, sludge, night-soil, carrion, offal or rubbish, on any street, road, or public place within the

said municipal district of Maldon, in order that the same shall not become a public nuisance: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of the district of Maldon aforesaid, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the provisions of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, section 33, every person who throws or lays any dirt, litter, ashes, quartz-tailings, sludge, night-soil, carrion, offal, or rubbish, on any street, road, or public place within the said municipality, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds. And be it further enacted that the words "public place" shall, for the purposes of this bye-law, mean and include all unsold lands within the said municipal district of Maldon.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 7, made by the municipal council of Maldon, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council. Gazetted on the 4th day of February, 1859, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.

MUNICIPALITY OF PORTLAND.

No. 10.—A BYE-LAW TO PREVENT SLAUGHTERING CATTLE, SHEEP AND LAMBS, FOR SALE, AT ANY PLACE WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT, EXCEPT AT THE PUBLIC SLAUGHTER-HOUSE.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for regulating the killing of butchers' meat, and the establishment of slaughter-houses: Be it therefore enacted as follows:—That no person shall slaughter any cattle, sheep or lambs, within the municipal district of Portland, for the purpose of sale, at any place, except at the public slaughter-house erected by the said council for such purposes; and any person who shall kill any cattle, sheep or lambs, for the purpose of sale, at any place within the said municipal district, except at such public slaughter-house, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Fifty shillings.

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

BYE-LAW No. 18.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SUM OF NINE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED AND THIRTY-SIX POUNDS AND ONE PENNY, GRANTED OUT OF THE PUBLIC REVENUE FOR THE YEAR 1858 TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SANDHURST.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that every work proposed to be executed by any municipal council by funds raised by aid from the Government, shall be the subject of a distinct and separate bye-law: And whereas by the Act of Council for the appropriation of the Revenue for 1858, the sum of £9636 0s. 1d. is granted to the municipal council of Sandhurst, subject to the conditions of the first recited Act: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Sandhurst, that the said sum of £9636 0s. 1d. be thus expended, namely:—

On Friday, 17th September, His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, K.C.B., arrived in Warrnambool, and was entertained at a public breakfast the same morning, after which an address was presented to him from this council; and in the evening His Excellency attended a public ball. Early on the morning of the 18th, he took his departure for the station of Niel Black, Esq.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The Government have accepted tenders for two lighthouses at this port, and one is now in course of erection on the middle island.

The wooden rails originally laid down on the tramroad being found unsuitable for its efficient working, the lessee undertook to cover them with flat iron; but the council, preferring iron rails as being more substantial and durable, agreed to advance £300 toward the difference of cost, the lessee paying interest for same, and subscribing to certain conditions. A contract has been accepted for the work, and the alteration is expected to be shortly completed.

The municipal council forwarded to the local members in the Legislative Assembly a remonstrance against the proposal to allow the corporations of Melbourne and Geelong to participate in the grants-in-aid to municipalities, and requested those gentlemen to use their influence in preventing any reduction in the amount of aid originally intended for the municipalities only.

During the half-year the council have held twenty-six ordinary and four special meetings.






