22^d Victoria No. 70.—An Act to amend and consolidate the Laws affecting the Solemnization of Marriage.—[Assented to 24th February, 1859.]

SALE OF SPIRITS, ETC., BY WHOLESALE, IN THE DISTRICT OF SMYTHESDALE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to amend the laws relative to the vending of fermented and spirituous liquors*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to declare the district hereinafter defined to be a district for the purpose and within the meaning of the above recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter named and defined shall be a district wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors in quantities not less than two gallons may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the above recited Act, that is to say :—

DISTRICT OF SMYTHESDALE.—Commencing at the junction of the Emeu Creek and Baillie's Creek; thence by Baillie's Creek and a line east to Lake Burrumbeet; thence by the southern shores of Lake Burrumbeet to the Burrumbeet Creek; thence east five miles; thence south nineteen miles; thence west to the source of the Gnarkeet chain of ponds; thence by a line north to the Emeu Creek; and thence by that creek to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

CASTLEMAINE MINING DISTRICT.
No. LXXXV.—BYE-LAW FOR REGULATING THE MODE IN WHICH THE VALIDITY OF DISPUTED ELECTIONS SHALL BE DETERMINED.
[4th October, 1859.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Castlemaine, begun and holden at the board room, Camp, Castlemaine, in the said district, on the 4th day of October, 1859, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. If any candidate shall dispute the validity of any election, it shall be lawful for such candidate to present a petition to the chairman of the board, stating his reasons for disputing the same, and every such petition must be lodged with the clerk of the board within twenty-one days after the election complained of; and the party so petitioning shall deposit the sum of Twenty pounds to cover any expenses not hereinafter provided for, and should any balance remain after payment of such expenses, the same shall be returned to the depositors.
2. No petition shall be entertained unless the same shall have been signed by a candidate, or by not less than six duly qualified electors, and upon depositing the sum before mentioned.
3. The chairman shall then convene a special meeting of the board within fourteen days from the date of reception of such petition to enquire into the matter; such special meeting shall be held with open doors, unless during special deliberations, and the members present shall have power to adjourn the sittings from time to time as may to them seem expedient. The member or members whose election is disputed may be present, but shall not take any part in the deliberations.
4. On the application of a candidate, or any party interested in such disputed election, the clerk of the board shall issue a summons in the form of the schedule hereto annexed, calling on any person therein named to give evidence relating thereto in the matter of such petition, and to produce any documentary evidence relating thereto which may be in the possession of the party so summoned.
5. No summons shall be issued unless the applicant shall have previously deposited with the clerk an amount sufficient to allow each witness a mileage of One shilling per mile, and a further sum of Twenty shillings for the expense of such witness during the time of his attendance. If any witness neglect to appear such steps shall be taken to secure his attendance as may appear just and expedient.
6. Parties interested in the matter of any disputed election, may appear in person or by authorised agent.
7. The chairman or acting chairman shall have power to administer an oath, in the usual form, to any witness before such witness shall be examined.
8. In the event of the party or parties who originally presented the petition abandoning the same, such sums as may have been deposited by them shall be forfeited, and it shall be competent for duly qualified electors to attend and defend the election or support the prayer of the petition, but in all such cases the board shall have a discretionary power to adopt such measures as may appear just and expedient.
9. The decision of the board shall be arrived at by ballot, and the person or persons so determined to be (or not) duly elected, shall be declared by the chairman, and such judgment shall be deemed final and binding, record of which shall be inserted in the minutes, and signed by the chairman of the board.
