ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the third day of February, 1859.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor
Mr. Chapman | Mr. Horne

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the 21st year of Her Majesty Victoria, No. 32, it was made lawful for the Governor to grant certain leases for any term not exceeding ten years, for mining purposes, of any auriferous Crown Land: And whereas by the same Act it was also made lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make such regulations, not being contrary to the said Act, as should appear to be necessary for prescribing the form of documents and leases to be issued under the same Act, the modes, times, dates, and places of the issue thereof, and the conditions on which such leases should be issued: And whereas an Order in Council was made for regulating mining leases of auriferous Crown Land in the mining district of Ballaarat, on the 20th day of December, 1858, under the said Act, and it is expedient to alter the said Order so far as it regulates the areas for leases of quartz reefs: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that so much of the Order in Council made under 21st Victoria No. 32, sec. 12, on the 20th day of December, 1858, as directs that the area for leases of quartz reefs shall not exceed 800 yards by 100 yards wide, and shall not be less than 100 yards by 80, shall be and the same is hereby altered,—and that the area for quartz reefs in the said district shall be not more than 900 yards in length by 300 yards in width, and lesser areas shall be in the same proportion: but no area shall be less in length than 100 yards, nor less in width than 80 yards, unless in cases provided for by the said Order in Council: Provided that this regulation shall not prejudicially affect applications for leases already made under the said Order in Council.

And the Honorable Richard Davies Ireland, Her Majesty's Solicitor General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CARLSRUHE ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the county of Dalhousie hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the eastern bank of the River Campaspe, being the south-western angle of the said parish; thence east to the south-eastern angle of the said parish; thence north to the north-eastern angle of the said parish; thence west to the north-western angle of the said parish; thence south to the River Campaspe; and thence by the River Campaspe to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be, "The Carlsruhe Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighth day of February, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

CASTLEMAINE MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW.—[2nd February, 1859.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Castlemaine, begun and holden at the Board Room, Camp, Castlemaine, in the said district, on the 2nd day of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

73. *Protection to applicants under leasing regulations.*—When any person or persons shall have applied under the leasing regulations to be hereafter made by the Governor in Council within the provision of 21 Victoria No. 32, for a lease of land for mining purposes, in the manner and form which may be prescribed by the said regulations, no person or persons shall, by virtue of his or their miner's right, be at liberty to occupy, mine, or otherwise interfere with the said land so applied for, unless previously occupied by them in virtue of their miner's right, pending the decision of the proper authority as to whether the said lease shall be issued.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

PROPOSED ROAD.

COUNTY OF RIPON.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a road in the county of Ripon (being a deviation in the road between Ararat and the south-western seaboard), proposed to be made by the Board of Land and Works, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the name of the owner and occupier thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited at the Public Lands Office, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

PROPOSED DEVIATION THROUGH MR. WRIGHT'S PRE-EMPTIVE SECTION AT BURRUMBEEP, IN THE COUNTY OF RIPON.—The deviation commences at a point 14 chains 54 links east from the south-west angle of Mr. Wright's pre-emptive section at Burrumbeep, and bears thence (through the said section) north 3 degrees 30 minutes west 70 chains 20 links; thence by a curve of the said road whose radius is 12 chains 50 links to a point bearing north 5 degrees east 4 chains 27 links; thence north 14 degrees east 16 chains 25 links to the road already laid off by the Survey Department, bounding the said pre-emptive section on the north; the said road just described through the said section being one chain and fifty links wide.

The quantity of land required to be taken for the proposed road is thirteen acres two roods and seventeen perches (13a. 2r. 17p.), and the estimated cost of effecting the said work is Two hundred and ninety pounds eight shillings (£290 8s.)

All persons affected by the proposed road are requested to set forth in writing, addressed to the President of the Board of Land and Works, Office of Roads and Bridges, Melbourne, within forty days from the first publication of this notice, any well-grounded objections that they may have to the said road, failing which they will be thereafter precluded from making any such objections or claiming any compensation whatsoever.
