## MUNICIPALITY OF CARISBROOK.

BYE-LAW No. 15.—FOR COMPELLING THE FENCING IN OF PURCHASED LAND ABUTTING UPON THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CARISBROOK.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of every municipal district have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths,

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&c., within such municipal district: And whereas it is necessary for the due preservation of the paths and water-tables in this municipal district that all purchased property abutting upon such paths should be fenced in so as to prevent damage to such paths and water-tables by horses, carts, drays, or other vehicles passing across the same: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Carisbrook, that after the expiration of one calendar month from the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, section 33, every person or persons being the owner or occupier of any land abutting upon any path which now is or which may hereafter be made within the said municipal district, shall, on receiving a notice from the council or their officer appointed for that purpose, fence in or cause to be fenced in with a good and substantial fence the frontage of such land abutting upon such path, so as to prevent horses, carts, drays, or other vehicles, from crossing over the same; and in case such owner or occupier shall not within twenty-one days after the receipt of such notice so fence in or cause to be fenced in the frontage of such land, such owner or occupier shall, on conviction thereof before any two of Her Majesty's justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay for every such offence, refusal, or neglect, a sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ST. KILDA ENLARGED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, if he should think fit, on the receipt of a petition signed by the householders purporting to be the majority resident within an area adjoining to any proclaimed municipal district containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile thereof, praying that such locality by a general description might be united with and form part of such previously proclaimed municipal district, to declare by Proclamation, with the consent of the council of such proclaimed district, such locality to be united with and form part of such previously proclaimed municipal district, and also by the same or any other Proclamation to define the limits and boundaries of such locality, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be and be deemed to be united with and should form part of such previously proclaimed municipal district: Provided that no such Proclamation be issued as above until the substance and prayer of such petition should have been published for at least one month previously in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of February, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, the municipal district of St. Kilda was defined as therein mentioned: And whereas a petition in conformity with the said Act was addressed to His Excellency the Governor, praying that the said municipal district might be extended and enlarged so as to include the land occupied by the petitioners: And whereas the substance and prayer of the said petition have been duly published, and the council of the said municipal district acquiesce in the prayer thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, with the consent of the municipal council of St. Kilda, declare that the piece or portion of land in the said petition referred to shall be united with and form part of the municipal district of St. Kilda, and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare and appoint that from henceforth the district hereinafter described shall be and constitute the municipal district of St. Kilda aforesaid, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the shores of Port Phillip Bay, being the south-eastern angle of the municipal district of Emerald Hill; thence by a line bearing north twenty-six degrees fifteen minutes east, sixteen chains and ninety links to a marked post; thence by a line bearing north fifty-seven degrees east, fifty-eight chains to a marked post on the west side of the Main Brighton road; thence by a line easterly and by a line passing through the centre of High street, parish of Prahran, to the Punt road; thence by a line passing through the centre of the Punt road to Wellington street; thence by a line passing through the centre of Wellington street, and through the centre of the Main Dandenong road to the centre of a Government road forming the eastern boundary of portion 176 B, in the parish of Prahran; thence by a line passing through the centre of the said Government road to the Glen Huntly road; thence by a line passing through the centre of the Glen Huntly road to the Punt road; thence south by a line passing through the centre of the Punt road to the shores of Port Phillip Bay; and thence by the shores of Port Phillip Bay to the commencing point aforesaid.

## SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF AMHERST.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the municipal district of Amherst shall come under the operations of the sections of the said Act, numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X.

The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately.

At stations where oats and bran cannot readily be procured, the tenders may be for hay or straw only; when all the supplies are included in one tender, it will, if advisable, be accepted for hay or straw, and not for the other articles.

Contractors will be allowed to deliver a quarter's supply on the 1st January, a six months' supply on the 1st April for a winter's stock, and the remainder on the 1st October, subject to the provisions contained in clause 2, Conditions of Contract.

The price must be per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel for oats and bran, including delivery at the stations, and all charges.

The net weight only after deducting the tare is to be charged.

No tender will be entertained unless accompanied by a certificate from two responsible persons that they are willing to become bound as sureties for the due fulfilment of the contract in one-third the estimated cost of the entire supply at the station tendered for; and in the event of the tender being accepted, the bond must be executed within twenty days, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted. No bond will be required if the whole supply in value will not amount to £150.

The names and addresses of the tenderers, and of their proposed sureties, must be stated at full length.

1. The hay to be oaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats and bran also to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in the schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will, however, in no case exceed 50 per cent.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage when delivered must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account, monthly, in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Government Stores, Melbourne, or the Treasury Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department, should circumstances require it, to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage, as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a Board of Survey, composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th April, 1860.

##### PUBLIC WORKS COMPLETED.

Forming and metalling portions of Fyans street, cutting down Pakington street hill, filling up the base and forming and metalling portions thereof.

Repairing footway in Aphrasia street, and making double stone culvert in same.

##### PUBLIC WORKS IN OPERATION.

Rough channelling the western side of the West Melbourne road, from the Newtown Hotel to the Great Western road, at a cost of £120.

Quarrying and breaking 300 cubic yards of bluestone metal, for the general maintenance of the metalled streets, at a cost of 6s. per yard.

Cutting down portions of pathways, and raising others, in Pakington street, Austin street, Prospect road, and Clarke street, and rough channelling the west side of Pakington street from Prospect road to Nicholas street, at a cost of £197 10s.

Three men with horse and cart are constantly engaged for the purpose of clearing the water channels, carting and spreading metal, for the maintenance and repairs of streets, and any other work required to be done for the maintenance of the streets in the municipality.

##### CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNCIL.

At the first meeting of the council, held 5th April, Charles Nantes, Esq., was unanimously re-elected chairman of the council for the current year.

##### ELECTION OF THE COUNCILLORS.

On the 6th of August Mr. Thomas Harris was elected a councillor to fill the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of Mr. Robert Garrett.

## CITY COUNCIL OF MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14 Victoria No. 20, intitled, *An Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of Streets, Courts, and Alleys, on Private Property, within the city of Melbourne*, it is amongst other things enacted, that where any street, court, or alley on private property in the city of Melbourne shall not be, or shall not have been, sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, to the satisfaction of the council of the said city, it shall be lawful for the said council, at any time, and from time to time, by any order under the hand of the mayor or town clerk of the said city for the time being respectively, to order that any such street, court, or alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner and within such time as to the said council may appear expedient, and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon such street, court, or alley, on each side thereof, shall in such manner and within such time as shall be expressed in such order, at their respective costs, charges, and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and sufficiently pave, flag, and macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair so much of the said street, court, or alley, to the centre thereof, as may be opposite to and co-extensive with their respective tenements, adjoining or abutting on such streets, courts, or alleys respectively:

And whereas the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, have not been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and

sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, to the satisfaction of the council of the city of Melbourne:

Be it now ordered by the council of this the said city, that the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, shall, within ten days from the date of this order's coming into operation, be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, in such manner as is expressed in the schedule to this order annexed, and marked B; and it is hereby notified to the owners respectively of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, that if they or any of them shall neglect or omit to remove the obstruction, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain and sewer, or otherwise complete and repair the street, court, or alley on which their respective tenements adjoin or abut, in the manner and within the time expressed in this order, then the council of the said city will remove all obstructions in the said streets, courts, and alleys, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, sewer, and otherwise complete or repair the same, or such parts thereof as shall not have been so done pursuant to this order, and will thereupon ascertain, determine, and charge such respective owners with their several proportionate parts of the costs, charges, and expenses thereof, according to and co-existent with their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley, having regard in such apportionment to the state and condition of the pavement, flagging, macadamising, levelling, draining, and sewerage in such streets, courts, or alleys respectively, or any part thereof, as shall or may be at the time of making this order.

## SCHEDULE B, REFERRED TO IN THIS ORDER.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys, enumerated in schedule A, referred to in this order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered:—

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole right-of-way shall in no part have an inclination of less than 1 in 120, and where practicable the entire length is to form one incline. In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick. The transverse section of the right-of-way is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and in the fall from the crown of the water-channels is to be at the rate of 1 in 25.

On either side of the roadway there is to be a water channel eighteen inches wide, consisting of two rows of bluestone pitchers, nine inches deep, and not less than nine inches by fourteen inches on the surface, with upright sides, set in loam and rammed with a rammer weighing forty pounds, so as to subside four inches.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven inches below the top of the kerbs.

On either side of the roadway there is also to be a footway not more than three feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a red gum plank or kerb ten inches by three, set on edge, and fastened with five-inch spikes to piles four inches by four of red gum, three feet long, driven into the soil.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of 1 in 10. The roadway is to be covered with a coat of broken metal, broken to a two and a half inch gauge, and laid on seven inches thick at the channels, and eight inches at the crown, and this when necessary is to be covered with a coat of loam one and a half inches thick.

Wherever private entrances lead from the rights-of-way they are to be paved to the full width with bluestone pitchers, in the same manner as the channels. Paving is to be extended from the channels towards the line of houses or fences, so as to cross the entire footway.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection and subject to the approval of the city surveyor, who is authorised to order any deviation from these general principles which the particularities of any case may require. No. 1543
