## PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HEATHCOTE.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign (Number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Heathcote.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

**PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.**

CARLTON.

**I**N pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 16, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by four hundred and fifty-six householders resident in the locality known as Carlton, being a portion of Smith ward, in the city of Melbourne, praying for the erection of such locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners represent themselves as residing in and around the portion of Smith ward north of Grattan street, North Melbourne, called Carlton, and within the area hereinafter described.

They request that the substance and prayer of their petition may be published, in order that in due time their locality may be proclaimed as the Carlton Municipality, with the following boundaries, namely:—Bounded on the south by a line running east along the centre of Grattan street; from thence along the centre of Grattan street to its intersection with Nicholson street; thence by a line running north along the centre of Nicholson street to its intersection with the centre of Reilly street; thence by a line running east along the said centre of Reilly street to its intersection with the centre of Smith street; thence by a line running north along the said centre of Smith street to its intersection with the southern side of the Heidelberg road; thence by a line running easterly along the said southern side of the said road to its junction with the west side of the Merri Creek; thence by a line running up the said creek to its intersection with the south boundary line of the Brunswick municipality; thence west along the said boundary line to its intersection with the centre of Lygon street; thence by a line running southerly down the centre of the said Lygon street; thence by the centre of the road bounding the south-east corner of the Melbourne General Cemetery to its intersection with the centre of Madeline street; thence along the centre of Madeline street to the commencing point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"May it therefore please your Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, to take the premises into your gracious consideration, and cause the advertisement of the substance and prayer of this petition to be made in the *Government Gazette* as required by statute; and in due time thereafter, if there be no counter-petition signed by a greater majority (sic) of the householders of Carlton, and delivered, then, in pursuance of the aforesaid statute, to proclaim the locality presently known as a portion of Smith Ward to be a municipal district, to be known by the name and style of the Carlton Municipality, or such other name as your Excellency shall adopt, all within the meaning of the said statute; or to do, order, and proclaim otherwise in the premises, as it may seem meet to your Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council."

**PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.**

SANDRIDGE.

**I**N pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by six hundred and fifty-two householders of Macarthur ward, in the city of Melbourne, commonly called and known as Sandridge, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district under the said Act.

The petitioners state, that they are householders of Sandridge, otherwise called Macarthur ward, of the city of Melbourne:

That they consider that the time has fully arrived for the severance of the ward from the city—firstly, because it is already geographically separated by the intervening municipality of Emerald Hill; secondly, on account of the inability of the corporation of Melbourne to provide for the wants and requirements of Sandridge; thirdly, because they believe that they are better able to understand their own wants and manage their own affairs than any other body can possibly understand or manage them:

That they desire to avail themselves of the means provided by law to share the benefits which have resulted therefrom to other localities, believing that thereby the welfare of Sandridge

will be considerably advanced, and its moral and material prosperity greatly augmented.

They further state that the corporation of Melbourne are about to submit to the Legislature a Bill to define the boundaries of the city including Macarthur ward therein, a measure to which the petitioners are averse, as its effect would be to exclude them from the benefits resulting from local and separate government, which is essential to the full and free development of the capabilities of this important sea-port town.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency would be pleased to extend the operation of the Municipalities Acts 18 Victoria Nos. 15 and 32 and 19 Victoria No. 16 to this locality, and be pleased to proclaim Sandridge a separate municipality under the style and title of 'The Sandridge Municipality,' and that the boundaries of such municipality be as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the Government pier at Sandridge at high-water mark, running westerly to the junction of the River Yarra Yarra with Hobson's Bay; from the said junction up the said river at high-water mark to a point where the boundaries of the Footscray municipality strike the river on the eastern bank of the said river; thence following the boundaries of the Footscray municipality in an easterly direction to the south-east angle of the boundaries of the said municipality; thence following the said boundaries in a northerly direction to a point where the said boundaries strike the south bank of the Yarra Yarra at high-water mark; thence along the south bank of the Yarra Yarra at high-water mark to the junction of Ferrars street, Emerald Hill, with the said river; thence in a south-easterly direction along Ferrars street to the south-east side of the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway line; thence in a south-westerly direction along the proposed line of Bay street to a point where it strikes the present boundary line of the Emerald Hill municipality; thence following the said boundary line in a south-easterly direction to the boundary post off the Sandridge road; thence following the said boundary line to the sea-beach at high-water mark; thence in a westerly direction along high-water mark to the Government pier aforesaid, the said boundaries being colored red on the plan submitted herewith.

"Your petitioners humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased, on consideration of the grounds brought forward, to grant the prayer of this petition."

No. XIII.—BYE-LAW SUPPLEMENTARY TO BYE-LAW No. 13, OF 9TH NOVEMBER, 1858, REGULATING WATER RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES FOR SLUICING PURPOSES.—[6th December, 1859.]

**A**T a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the mining board room, Ararat, in the said district, on the 6th day of December, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Amalgamation.*—To give increased facility in working sluicing claims, and to prevent unnecessary waste of water, any two or more water rights may be amalgamated, provided the rights amalgamated follow in rotation as to priority. All such amalgamations must be registered with the warden.

2. *Hired labor.*—No hired miner shall have any right or title to any interest in any race or sluice claim in consequence of working therein.

## MUNICIPAL ELECTION.

The Hon. T. T. a'Beckett, Esq., the chairman, being detained in the country on public business, was unable to preside, and the council, pursuant to Bye-law No. 5, elected councillor Turner presiding returning officer.

The nomination meeting was held on the 11th October, 1859, on the municipal site, Johnston street, to supply the vacancies occasioned by the retirement by rotation of councillors the Hon. T. T. a'Beckett, Samuel Ramsden, and John Wood.

The following gentlemen were proposed as candidates, and received the number of votes affixed to their respective names on the close of the poll held on the 12th October, 1859. The returning officer gave his casting vote in favor of Mr. B. Jarvis. This decision was disputed, a petition against it presented by Mr. John Newlands, with a deposit of £50. The council was convened under Bye-law No. 5, and sat as a committee of elections and qualifications thereon, resolved only to examine the voting paper disputed, when they determined the election to be, as declared by the returning officer, in favor of Mr. Benjamin Jarvis.

## FINANCE.

The amount of rate for 1859, exclusive of arrears of rates for preceding years, is, to the present date, £2503 8s. 6d., with arrears for 1856-7-8, £162 14s., making a total of £2666 2s. 6d. A considerable per centage must be deducted from outstanding rates for those uncollectable from absent owners and other causes. The rate collector reports unprecedented difficulties this year in collecting rates; hence the large balance still outstanding.

It cannot, however, be too strongly impressed upon the minds of the ratepayers that the legislative grant is regulated in amount by that of the rate collected in this year (1859), for the rate struck in the same. The sum paid will be about 30s. for every pound collected; and, consequently, every pound due in 1859, not paid or collected within that period, will entail a loss of thirty shillings to the municipality.

The town clerk having on the 5th of August last resigned his office of acting municipal treasurer, held it by request of the council until the close of the municipal year, when Thomas Cope, Esq., the chairman, was appointed municipal treasurer for the current municipal year.
