N pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by four hundred and fifty-six householders resident in the locality known as Carlton, being a portion of Smith ward, in the city of Melbourne, praying for the erection of such locality that a mynified district into a municipal district. IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by six hundred and fifty-two householders of Macarthur ward, in the city of Melbourne, commonly called and known as Sandridge, praying for the creetion of their locality into a municipal district under the said Act.

The petitioners state, that they are householders of Sandridge, otherwise called Macarthur ward, of the city of Melbourne:

That they consider that the time has fully arrived for the severance of the ward from the city—firstly, because it is already geographically separated by the intervening municipality of Emerald Hill; secondly, on account of the inability of the corporation of Melbourne to provide for the wants and requirements of Sandridge; thirdly, because they believe that they are better able to understand their own wants and manage their own fiftirs then any other body can possibly understand the convergence. affairs than any other body can possibly understand or manage

That they desire to avail themselves of the means provided by law to share the benefits which have resulted therefrom to other localities, believing that thereby the welfare of Sandridge

will be considerably advanced, and its moral and material prosperity greatly augmented.

They further state that the corporation of Melbourne are about to submit to the Legislature a Bill to define the boundaries of the city including Macarthur ward therein, a measure to which the petitioners are averse, as its effect would be to exclude them from the benefits resulting from local and separate government, which is essential to the full and free development of the capa-bilities of this important sea-port town.

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency would be pleased to extend the operation of the Municipalities Acts 18 Victoria Nos. 15 and 32 and 19 Victoria No. 16 to this locality, and be pleased to proclaim Sandridge a separate municipality under the style and title of 'The Sandridge Municipality;' and that the boundaries of such municipality be as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the Government pier at Sandridge at high-water mark, running westerly to the junction of the River Yarra Yarra with Hobson's Bay; from the said junction up the said river at high-water mark to a point where the boundaries of the Footscray municipality strike the river on the eastern bank of the said river; thence following the boundaries of the Footscray municipality in an easterly direction to the southeast angle of the boundaries of the said municipality; thence following the said boundaries in a northerly direction to a point where the said boundaries strike the south bank of the Yarra Yarra at high-water mark to the junction of Ferrars street, Emerald Hill; with the said river; thence in a south-easterly direction along Ferrars street to the south-east side of the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway line; thence in a south-westerly direction along the proposed line of Bay street to a point where it strikes the present boundary line of the Emerald Hill unnicipality; thence following the said boundary line in a south-easterly direction to the boundary post off the Sandridge road; thence following the said boundary line to the sea-beach at high-water mark; thence in a westerly direction along high-water mark to the Government pier aforesaid, the said boundaries being colored red on the plan submitted herewith..

#### FINANCE.

The amount of rate for 1859, exclusive of arrears of rates for preceding years, is, to the present date, £2503 8s. 6d., with arrears for 1856-7-8, £162 14s., making a total of £2666 2s. 6d. A considerable per centage must be deducted from outstanding rates for those uncollectable from absent owners and other causes. The rate collector reports unprecedented difficulties this year in collecting rates; hence the large balance still outstanding.

this year in collecting rates; hence the large balance still outstanding.

It cannot, however, be too strongly impressed upon the minds of the ratepayers that the legislative grant is regulated in amount by that of the rate collected in this year (1859), for the rate struck in the same. The sum paid will be about 30s. for every pound collected; and, consequently, every pound due in 1859, not paid or collected within that period, will entail a loss of thirty shillings to the municipality.

The town clerk having on the 5th of August last resigned his office of acting municipal treasurer, held it by request of the council until the close of the municipal year, when Thomas Cope, Esq., the chairman, was appointed municipal treasurer for the current municipal year.
