LIABILITIES, ETC.**

THE attention of all Government Officers and others using or having charge of works or buildings, the property of the Government of Victoria, is called to the following Order.

It having been represented to the Board of Land and Works that the Department of Public Works has experienced great inconvenience from the existence of unauthorised and unknown liabilities, frequently not reported until after the expiration of the financial year, and subsequent to the closing of the vote from which they should be paid:

The Board orders that no claim for the defrayal or reimbursement of expenditure which may hereafter be incurred upon public works and buildings without the previous sanction of the Board shall be entertained until a report and justification of the circumstances under which the work was ordered, together with a full account or an approximate estimate of the cost, shall have been forwarded to the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works within fourteen days after the necessity for the expenditure shall have arisen.

It is also ordered that no such claims as the above which may have been incurred previous to the publication of this order will be recognised by the Board, unless they shall be reported to the Commissioner of Public Works on or before the 31st instant.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to establish a Board of Commissioners for the better sewerage and drainage of the City of Melbourne, and for supplying water thereto and to the suburbs thereof*, a board was established by the name and style of "The Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply;" And whereas by another Act passed in the twenty-first year of the same reign, called "The Melbourne Sewerage and Water Amendment Act," it is amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or in the Act first above mentioned, it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, at any time after the passing of this Act, to transfer to the Board of Land and Works all the lands, hereditaments, and property vested in the said Board of Commissioners of Sewerage and Water Supply, and thereupon the said Board of Commissioners of Sewerage and Water Supply shall be dissolved, and all the rights, powers, duties, and authorities thereof shall be vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Board of Land and Works: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order transfer to the said Board of Land and Works all the lands, hereditaments, and property vested in the said Board of Commissioners of Sewerage and Water Supply.

And the Honorable James Service, Her Majesty's President of the Board of Land and Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it was amongst

other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to split any mining district as thereinbefore mentioned into any number of divisions and to define the limits and boundaries thereof respectively, and also to determine the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division, and from time to time to alter any such division and the limits and boundaries thereof, and to vary the number of members which shall be elected within and for every such division, but so that the total number of members elected for such district shall in no case exceed or be less than ten: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing date the fourth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the mining district of Castlemaine was split into the divisions therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to unite the Taradale and Fryer's Creek divisions of the said district into one division: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish the Taradale division of the said mining district of Castlemaine, and doth hereby direct that the limits and boundaries of the Fryer's Creek division and of the other divisions of such district shall be those set opposite to the respective names of such divisions in the schedule hereunto annexed, and doth determine that the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division shall be that set immediately under the name of each such division respectively in the same schedule, that is to say:—

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO FLEMINGTON AND THE VICINITY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign (number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force in the district hereinafter named and described, that is to say:—

THE DISTRICT OF FLEMINGTON (INCLUDING ESSENDON, HAWSTEAD, AND KENSINGTON).—Commencing at a point on the Moonee Moonee Ponds intersected by the southern boundary of section 15, in the parish of Doughta Galla; thence west to the south-western angle of the said section 15; thence south to the south-western angle of portion D of section 6, in the said parish of Doughta Galla; thence west to the Saltwater River; thence southwards by the said river and the north-eastern boundary of the municipal district of Footscray to the north-eastern angle of the town reserve of Footscray; thence east to the western boundary of the municipal district of Hotham; and thence northwards by the said western boundary of the municipal district of Hotham, and by the Moonee Moonee Ponds to the commencing point.

SALE OF SPIRITS, ETC., BY WHOLESALE, AT TERANG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend the laws relative to the vending of fermented and spirituous liquors*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any city, town, district or place in Victoria, a city, town, district or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to declare the town hereinafter defined to be a town for the purpose and within the meaning of the above recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the town hereinafter named and defined shall be a town wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two

gallons, may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the above recited Act, that is to say:—

TERANG TOWN RESERVE.—Commencing at a point on the eastern shore of Lake Terang, intersected by the northern boundary of suburban allotment 16, in the parish of Terang; thence east to a point due south of the south-western angle of suburban allotment 15, in the said parish; thence north to the southern boundary of suburban allotment 6, in the said parish; thence west 106 chains; thence south to the northern boundary of suburban allotment 39, in the said parish of Terang; thence east to the shore of Lake Terang; and thence by the western, northern, and eastern shores of that lake to the commencing point.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

CARLTON.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by four hundred and fifty-six householders resident in the locality known as Carlton, being a portion of Smith ward, in the city of Melbourne, praying for the erection of such locality into a municipal district.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

SANDRIDGE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by six hundred and fifty-two householders of Macarthur ward, in the city of Melbourne, commonly called and known as Sandridge, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district under the said Act.

The petitioners state, that they are householders of Sandridge, otherwise called Macarthur ward, of the city of Melbourne:

That they consider that the time has fully arrived for the severance of the ward from the city—firstly, because it is already geographically separated by the intervening municipality of Emerald Hill; secondly, on account of the inability of the corporation of Melbourne to provide for the wants and requirements of Sandridge; thirdly, because they believe that they are better able to understand their own wants and manage their own affairs than any other body can possibly understand or manage them:

That they desire to avail themselves of the means provided by law to share the benefits which have resulted therefrom to other localities, believing that thereby the welfare of Sandridge will be considerably advanced, and its moral and material prosperity greatly augmented.

They further state that the corporation of Melbourne are about to submit to the Legislature a Bill to define the boundaries of the city including Macarthur ward therein, a measure to which the petitioners are averse, as its effect would be to exclude them from the benefits resulting from local and separate government, which is essential to the full and free development of the capabilities of this important sea-port town.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency would be pleased to extend the operation of the Municipalities Acts 18 Victoria Nos. 15 and 32 and 19 Victoria No. 16 to this locality, and be pleased to proclaim Sandridge a separate municipality under the style and title of 'The Sandridge Municipality'; and that the boundaries of such municipality be as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the Government pier at Sandridge at high-water mark, running westerly to the junction of the River Yarra Yarra with Hobson's Bay; from the said junction up the said river at high-water mark to a point where the boundaries of the Footscray municipality strike the river on the eastern bank of the said river; thence following the boundaries of the Footscray municipality in an easterly direction to the south-east angle of the boundaries of the said municipality; thence following the said boundaries in a northerly direction to a point where the said boundaries strike the south bank of the Yarra Yarra at high-water mark; thence along the south bank of the Yarra Yarra at high water mark to the junction of Ferrars street, Emerald Hill, with the said river; thence in a south-easterly direction along Ferrars street to the south-east side of the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway line; thence in a south-westerly direction along the proposed line of Bay street to a point where it strikes the present boundary line of the Emerald Hill municipality; thence following the said boundary line in a south-easterly direction to the boundary post off the Sandridge road; thence following the said boundary line to the sea-beach at high-water mark; thence in a westerly direction along high-water mark to the Government pier aforesaid, the said boundaries being colored red on the plan submitted herewith."

NOTE.—The mortality of the week has been 102 against 74 registered in the previous week. The increased temperature and its excessive variability have, as usual, chiefly affected infantile life. In the Brunswick district, diarrhoea is reported as prevalent among children. Fifteen out of the nineteen cases of death in Collingwood were of children under three years of age, resulting generally from diarrhoea and dysentery. At Flemington, dysentery, scarlatina, and sore throat, prevail. Of the forty-seven deaths registered in Melbourne, thirty-one were of children under three years of age; and at Richmond, six cases out of seven were also of infants. At Sandridge and Emerald Hill, there were fifteen deaths registered, and fourteen of these were of children; the fatal cause being mostly dysentery: thirteen out of the fifteen died under the age of twelve months, and ten of these cases occurred at Emerald Hill alone.
