WHERFAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, An Act to enable the Postmaster General to issue Money Orders in the colony of Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time order and direct what shall be deemed "separate post towns or places" within the meaning of the 3rd section of the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, initiuled, An Act to amend an Act initualed "An Act to amend an Act initualed "An Act to amend the Law relating to the Post Office:" Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the municipalities of Brunswick and Footscray, and the township of Northcote, shall be deemed as within the limits of the city in which the General Post Office is situated, for the purposes of the above recited Act, and that all letters delivered through the several Post Offices of Brunswick, Footscray, and Northcote, within the boundaries of the municipalities and town-hip aforesaid, shall be subject to the nuncipalities and township aforesaid, shall be subject to the town rate of postage, viz:—Two pence per single rate of half an ounce, and so on in proportion.

By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act, for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description seever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor. And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the premises hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of East Collingwood: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of the municipal situate in Wellington street, in the said district, belonging to and used for the purpose of Divine Worship by the members of the Charch of Particular Baptists and the land whereon the same is built, and any future erection on the same site, for so long a time as the present building or such future erection shall be applied to purposes of Divine Worship.
