VINCENT'S GULF.**

NOTICE is hereby given that a Rock, awash at low water
springs, has been discovered in the upper portion of St.
Vincent's Gulf, on the eastern shore, within six miles of the
beach.

The following bearings were taken from the position of the
rock, which is marked by a Black Nun Buoy moored outside
the rock in eight feet at low water:—

Mount Lofty S. 40° E.
The Hummocks N. 10° W.

Navigators in beating up or down the Gulf should carefully
avoid this danger and not stand in under three fathoms at low
water, the rise and fall at springs being nine feet.

CEYLON.—The Colombo Light will be under repairs from the
1st of February to the 1st of April, 1860, during which time
there will be a temporary light upon the clock tower, upon
which much dependence cannot be placed. Ships approaching
Colombo by night should therefore be very cautious, and keep
their deep sea lead going. It is worthy of remark, that if
soundings off Ceylon be got between thirty and forty fathoms,
the ship is within five or six leagues of the land, and had
better not near till daylight.

PARTICULARS.

On the 11th of December instant, at Beckwith Court, Clunes,
James Maher, while engaged milking a cow, was struck a vio-
lent blow on the head with a stick or other weapon, by an
Italian named Jules Leffranche, from the effects of which blow
the said James Maher died.

The said Jules Leffranche is about 22 years of age, 5 feet 6
inches high, with dark complexion, dark hair inclined to curl,
dark eyes, heavy eyebrows wide apart, no whiskers, and small
dark moustache. He is of medium build, and has one of his
thumbs stiff and bent inwards.

He wore white moleskin trousers nearly new, an old regatta
shirt, and was without coat or waistcoat.

NOTE.—Dysentery, diarrhoea and cholera, are reported as prevalent in the
Boroondara district, and the six fatal cases returned from that locality were of
infants, one having died of diphtheria. At Brunswick, there were four cases of
children resulting fatally. At Collingwood, eleven cases out of thirteen were of
children, resulting chiefly from diarrhoea. Dysentery and diarrhoea also prevail
at Flemington, the four deaths recorded being of infants. Of the forty-one
deaths in Melbourne, twenty-six were of children; and at Sandridge and
Emerald Hill, eight out of nine fatal cases were of children under three years
old.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

SANDRIDGE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by six hundred and fifty-two householders of Macarthur ward, in the city of Melbourne, commonly called and known as Sandridge, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district under the said Act.

WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state, that they are householders of Sandridge, otherwise called Macarthur ward, of the city of Melbourne:

That they consider that the time has fully arrived for the severance of the ward from the city—firstly, because it is already geographically separated by the intervening municipality of Emerald Hill; secondly, on account of the inability of the corporation of Melbourne to provide for the wants and requirements of Sandridge; thirdly, because they believe that they are better able to understand their own wants and manage their own affairs than any other body can possibly understand or manage them:

That they desire to avail themselves of the means provided by law to share the benefits which have resulted therefrom to

other localities, believing that thereby the welfare of Sandridge will be considerably advanced, and its moral and material prosperity greatly augmented.

They further state that the corporation of Melbourne are about to submit to the Legislature a Bill to define the boundaries of the city including Macarthur ward therein, a measure to which the petitioners are averse, as its effect would be to exclude them from the benefits resulting from local and separate government, which is essential to the full and free development of the capabilities of this important sea-port town.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

“Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency would be pleased to extend the operation of the Municipalities Acts 18 Victoria Nos. 15 and 32 and 19 Victoria No. 16 to this locality, and be pleased to proclaim Sandridge a separate municipality under the style and title of ‘The Sandridge Municipality;’ and that the boundaries of such municipality be as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the Government pier at Sandridge at high-water mark, running westerly to the junction of the River Yarra Yarra with Hobson's Bay; from the said junction up the said river at high-water mark to a point where the boundaries of the Footscray municipality strike the river on the eastern bank of the said river; thence following the boundaries of the Footscray municipality in an easterly direction to the south-east angle of the boundaries of the said municipality; thence following the said boundaries in a northerly direction to a point where the said boundaries strike the south bank of the Yarra Yarra at high-water mark; thence along the south bank of the Yarra Yarra at high-water mark to the junction of Ferrars street, Emerald Hill, with the said river; thence in a south-easterly direction along Ferrars street to the south-east side of the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway line; thence in a south-westerly direction along the proposed line of Bay street to a point where it strikes the present boundary line of the Emerald Hill municipality; thence following the said boundary line in a south-easterly direction to the boundary post off the Sandridge road; thence following the said boundary line to the sea-beach at high-water mark; thence in a westerly direction along high-water mark to the Government pier aforesaid, the said boundaries being colored red on the plan submitted herewith.

“Your petitioners humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased, on consideration of the grounds brought forward, to grant the prayer of this petition.”

4. A site for a manure depot.
5. A site for a Church of England.
6. Survey of the cricket ground.
7. Survey and sale of Rutherford street.
8. Survey of Gold street, with additional lots.
9. £1000, grant-in-aid.

In accordance with a petition of the ratepayers, application was made to Government for a "commonage," but the present law did not admit of a compliance with their request; they, however, urged the necessity of a change in the law, and were assured the subject should receive careful consideration.

The public works executed consists in the clearing High street, two chains wide, one mile and a quarter, and metalling the holes; but others are in process of being carried out, and consist of—

- Erecting a town pump,
- Erecting cattle yards,
- Erecting municipal baths.

The use of the town pump is intended to be free to the ratepayers. From the cattle yards and baths the council anticipate a handsome revenue.

The subject of a weighbridge was carefully considered, and its further consideration postponed, as it did not appear to the council that its usefulness would be so general as to warrant them in laying out about £300 in erecting it; the more so as it was calculated the expense of its management would be greater than the fees derived from its use.

MUNICIPALITY OF KYNETON.

FOURTH REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 10TH DECEMBER, 1859, INCLUSIVE.

MEETINGS.

DURING the half-year the council have held twenty-three general and two special meetings; and three meetings lapsed for want of a quorum. The late chairman, councillor Kenworthy, attended twelve meetings; councillors Bland, twenty; J. Thomson twenty-five; Kelly, twenty-three; Fitzgerald, twenty-three; Healy, nineteen; R. D. Thompson, five; and Dickinson and Douglas (elected to supply vacancies) eight each out of ten meetings.

PUBLIC WORKS.

Completed.—Two miles of footpaths, making in all nearly seven miles of footpaths now completed.—Eleven channelled street crossings—two chains of road in Epping street, and a culvert at the junction of Mollison and High streets.

In Progress.—Metalling of thirty-two chains of road in Baynton street, and twenty chains in Ebden street—Formation of about twenty-three chains of road in Ebden street, and twenty-one chains in Hutton street, and placing quarry rubbish thereon as a temporary substitute for metal; and fencing the Botanical Garden Reserve.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

Renewed applications for Gaol, Post Office, Money Order System, &c.—A Government Post Office has been opened in Mollison street, and the Money Order System established.

For the Mollison street bridge, over the Campaspe River.—£2500 placed on the estimates.

For grant in aid of Mechanics' Institute.—To be considered when estimates prepared.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The office of inspector of nuisances has been abolished, as being unnecessary.

The various unproclaimed streets in the municipality have been gazetted.

The council have used every endeavor to bring the north deviation railway question to a successful issue, by deputations to the Government and otherwise, and with every prospect of the wishes of the inhabitants being granted.

On the 1st September last B. Kenworthy, Esq., resigned the chair and his seat in the council. Councillor Kelly was appointed chairman in his stead.

On the 3rd of October last councillors Dickinson and Douglas were elected to fill the vacancies in the council occasioned by the absence of councillor R. D. Thompson, and the resignation of the late chairman, councillor Kenworthy.

Mr. Praagst having failed to carry out an agreement, the terms of which had been definitely arranged for lighting the town with gas, a fresh treaty has been commenced with the directors of the gas company for the like purpose, but the agreement has not yet been concluded.

The council has been in communication with Mr. Hadley, M.L.A., with a view to induce the Government to establish waterworks for the town, and also to obtain its proper share of the Government grants for 1857 and 1858, of which it was unjustly deprived. The result is not yet known.

The annual election in the place of councillors J. Thomson, Dickenson and Douglas retiring by rotation, took place on the 10th instant, when councillors Menzies, Dickenson, and Kenworthy were elected.
