RATES OF POSTAGE.

THE following revised Rates of Postage chargeable in Victoria on Letters, Newspapers, Packets, Books, &c., are published for the guidance of postmasters and the information of the public.

I. TOWN LETTERS.

For delivery within the limits of the city or town in which letters are posted.

Under half an ounce... Twopence.
Exceeding half an ounce, but not exceeding one ounce ... Fourpence.
And for every ounce or fraction of an ounce fourpence additional.

II. INLAND LETTERS.

For transmission between separate post towns or to any part of Victoria.

Under half an ounce... Fourpence.
Exceeding half an ounce, but not exceeding one ounce ... Eightpence.
And for every ounce or fraction of an ounce eightpence additional.

III. SHIP LETTERS.

Or letters transmitted out of the colony to places not specially mentioned in the subjoined table of rates marked A.

Under half an ounce... Sixpence.
Exceeding half an ounce, but not exceeding one ounce ... One shilling.
And for every ounce or fraction of an ounce one shilling additional.

The above rates must in all instances be fully prepaid by stamps, or the letters will be detained.

IV. LETTERS AND NEWSPAPERS FOR THE UNITED KINGDOM.

Letters for transmission to any part of the United Kingdom.

Via Southampton.

Under half an ounce... Sixpence.
Exceeding half an ounce, but not exceeding one ounce ... One shilling.
And for every ounce or fraction of an ounce one shilling additional.

Via Marseilles.

Threepence per quarter ounce in addition to the above rates.

Newspapers.

Via Southampton... One penny each.
Via Marseilles ... Threepence each.

V. REGISTERED LETTERS.

For the registration of letters (to places not specially mentioned in the subjoined table B), stamps to the value of one shilling must be affixed in addition to the postage chargeable.

VI. LETTERS CONTAINING GOLD.

For transmission by post between separate post towns or places within the colony.

Under half an ounce... One shilling.
Exceeding half an ounce, but not exceeding one ounce ... Two shillings.
And for every ounce or fraction of an ounce two shillings additional.

VII. LETTERS FOR OFFICERS ON BOARD HER MAJESTY'S SHIPS.

Letters forwarded via the United Kingdom for officers on board Her Majesty's ships on any foreign or colonial station.

Under half an ounce... One shilling.
Exceeding half an ounce, but not exceeding one ounce ... Two shillings.
And for every ounce or fraction of an ounce two shillings additional.

VIII. SOLDIERS' AND SAILORS' LETTERS.

From or to any non-commissioned officer, private soldier, seaman, or marine, employed on actual service in the army, navy, or marines.

Under half an ounce ... One penny.

Exceeding half an ounce, but not exceeding one ounce ... Twopence.

And for every ounce or fraction of an ounce twopence additional.

Provided that the postage be prepaid by stamps (unless sent from parts beyond seas), the corps, regiment, detachment, or ship being given in the handwriting, and with the signature of the commanding officer, and otherwise posted in accordance with the requirements of the 10th clause of the Act 17 Victoria No. 30.

IX. EXEMPTIONS FROM POSTAGE RATES.

All letters received from beyond seas, with the exception of letters and packets insufficiently paid, and loose letters and packets.

All official letters on military and naval service (in accordance with the 11th clause of the Act 17th Victoria No. 30.)

All letters containing correspondence of the Registrar and Deputy Registrars of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in the colony, if posted open at the sides and relating exclusively to the execution of the Act 16 Victoria No. 28.

All petitions to Her Majesty, the Governor, Executive Council, or any member of the Legislature, not exceeding sixteen ounces in weight, and without covers, or in covers open at the sides.

X. NEWSPAPERS.

For delivery within Victoria or for transmission out of the colony to places not specially mentioned in the subjoined table of rates, to be prepaid by stamp, 1d. each.

Conditions.

To be sent without a cover or in a cover open at the sides.

Except the name and address of the person to whom sent there must be no other word or communication, letter, character, figure or number, written, printed, or otherwise marked, on the newspapers posted.

Newspapers received from beyond seas will be delivered to their original address free of charge, but if re-posted in the colony 1d. each must be prepaid.

Newspapers put into any post office for delivery at such post office, and directed "To be kept until called for," are exempted from postage.

XI. BOOKS, ETC.

For transmission by post from Victoria to the United Kingdom, and other places.

The book-post system has been extended to—

to which countries or colonies book packets, posted in conformity with the regulations, may be sent at the following rates:—

And so on, adding one shilling for each additional half pound or fraction of half a pound up to three pounds.

Book packets may be forwarded to the United Kingdom, via Marseilles, upon payment of the following rates:—

Not exceeding 4 oz.	Above 4 oz. and not exceeding 8 oz.	Above 8 oz. and not exceeding 1 lb.	Above 1 lb. and not exceeding 1½ lb.	Above 1½ lb. and not exceeding 2 lbs.

And so on, adding one shilling and fourpence for each additional half pound or fraction of half a pound up to three pounds.

REGULATIONS.

Every book packet must be sent either without a cover or in a cover open at the ends or sides.

No book packet must exceed two (2) feet in length, breadth, or depth, or three (3) pounds in weight.

A book packet may contain any number of separate books, almanacks, maps, or prints, and any quantity of paper, vellum, or parchment (to the exclusion of letters, whether sealed or open), and the books, maps, papers, &c., may be either printed, written or plain, or any mixture of the three.

On the cover or outside of the packet, in addition to the name and address of the person to whom the same is to be delivered, the sender thereof shall be at liberty to subscribe a statement of the contents thereof, together with his name and address.

The books, &c., may be in any binding, mounting or covering, whether such binding be loose or attached. In the case of prints or maps, rollers may accompany them; and markers, whether of paper or otherwise, may be sent with books or other printed papers.

If a book packet be found to contain any enclosure which is sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, or any letter whether sealed or not, the letter or other enclosure will be taken out and forwarded to the address on the packet, charged with the full postage as an unpaid letter, together with an additional rate equal to the amount chargeable on a book not exceeding half (½) a pound in weight. The remainder of the packet, if fully prepaid, will be forwarded without any extra charge.

If a packet addressed to the United Kingdom, India, Ceylon, Mauritius, Hong Kong, Malta, Gibraltar, Tasmania, and Western Australia, South Australia, be not sufficiently prepaid according to its weight, but, nevertheless, a single book rate be prepaid, it will be forwarded charged with the deficient book postage, and with an additional book rate. This does not apply to book packets addressed to New South Wales and New Zealand, which must be fully prepaid.

In the event of a book packet addressed to any place being posted altogether unpaid or prepaid less than a single rate, it will be detained and sent to the Dead Letter Office.

Packets correctly posted will be delivered according to their addresses without further charge.

XII. PACKETS, ETC.

(With the exception of book packets for transmission to the places enumerated above.)

Not exceeding four (4) ounces, 6d.

Every additional two (2) ounces or fraction of two ounces, 3d.

1. Bankers' packets containing notes, orders, cheques, or passbooks, sent by or to any bank or banker.

2. Patterns or samples of merchandise.

3. Prices current and catalogues of merchandise, open at each end.

4. Writs and proceedings of courts of justice, deeds of conveyance, affidavits, letters of attorney, depositions of recognizances, sent by or to any justices of the peace or coroner.

5. Votes and proceedings of Parliament and Colonial Legislature, open at each end.

6. Pamphlets, magazines, reviews, or periodical publications (newspapers excepted).

7. Maps or plans sent by or addressed to the Department of Land and Works, or returns made to or from any branch of the public service.

8. A single printed book—weight not to exceed one pound (1 lb.); dimensions not to exceed fifteen inches in length, six inches in breadth. There shall not be in or upon them any letter or epistolary communication or intelligence, and on the outside, in addition to the name and address, the sender must subscribe, with his name and address, a statement of the contents thereof as follows:—

Banker's packet,
Patterns of merchandise,

or other proper description of the contents, with the words *packet without letter or writing*.

The Postmaster General may refuse to transmit by post to any place to which the mail is conveyed on horseback any such packet.

ERECTION OF TOLL-BARS.

On the 16th August a conference took place at the Town Hall, on the subject of erecting a toll-bar near the new bridge over the Barwon, and one at the breakwater. The Commissioner of Roads and Bridges attended on behalf of Government, His Worship the Mayor of Geelong for the corporation, His Worship the Chairman of this municipality on behalf of this council, and C. J. Denny, Esq., J.P., as chairman of the Barrabool Hills Road Board. A long discussion took place, in which His Worship the Mayor of Geelong opposed the erection of the proposed toll-bars altogether, but the Commissioner having signified that the Government thoroughly recognized the necessity of carrying out the proposal, His Worship the Mayor claimed a participation in the tolls by the corporation. His Worship the Chairman of this municipality and also the chairman of the Barrabool Hills Road Board were opposed to the corporation of Geelong receiving any portion of these tolls. The Commissioner having taken minutes of the various opinions expressed by the three representatives, stated that he would report the same to the Government. After some further correspondence on the subject, a bye-law, No. 8, for the erection of the toll-bars, was duly gazetted by the Government, and this council is only awaiting the completion of the approaches to the New Barwon Bridge to carry the bye-law into effect, and which they anticipate will be early in the month of April.
