MUNICIPALITY OF FITZ ROY.

BYE-LAW No. 6.—FOR APPOINTING STANDS FOR PUBLIC CARRIERS, CARTERS, WATER DRAWERS, AND PUBLIC VEHICLES.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws, *inter alia*, for the regulation and licensing of public carriages, water drawers, and public vehicles; and whereas it is expedient that certain places be appointed as stands for the aforesaid carriages, carriers, water drawers, and vehicles: Be it therefore enacted, That from and after the date hereof the places appointed from time to time by the municipal council of Fitz Roy, as stands for said carriers, carriages, water drawers, and public vehicles, shall be the only places at which the drivers of such vehicles shall stand or ply for hire within the municipality of Fitz Roy. And if any driver of such vehicle shall stand or ply for hire in any other than one of the places so appointed he shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

SCHEDULE.

Places appointed as Stands by the Municipal Council of Fitz Roy.
CABS AND OMBIBUSES.

Centre of Johnston street, at its junction with Smith street; horses' heads to the east.

Centre of Gore street, at its junction with Gertrude street, and on north side thereof; horses' heads to the south.

Centre of Johnston street, at its junction with Brunswick street, and on the west side thereof; horses' heads to the east.

WOOD CARTS.

That portion of George street lying between Webb and Con-
dell streets, formerly known as Albert street.

CARTERS.

Centre of Napier street, at its junction with Gertrude street, and on the north side thereof; horses' heads to the south.

MUNICIPALITY OF MALDON.

BYE-LAW No. 8.—FOR THE CONDUCTING OF PUBLIC MEETINGS OF THE RATEPAYERS AND OF ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF COUNCIL, AND FOR REGULATING THE PROCEEDINGS AT THE ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

WHEREAS the Municipal Act empowers councils established thereunder to frame bye-laws for (*inter alia*) the conduct of public meetings, the regulation of the election of members of council, and for the election of their chairman: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Maldon, That from and after the assent of His Excellency the Governor of the colony being given to this bye-law, the following regulations shall be in force with respect to municipal elections in this district, viz:—

1. At all public meetings of the ratepayers convened by the council or the chairman, for the election of councillors or other municipal business, the chairman, or in his absence the senior councillor then present, shall preside, and in case of an equality of votes shall have the casting vote.

2. If at any election the chairman of the municipal council for the time being shall be a candidate for re-election, or shall be incapacitated from presiding at such election either from illness, absence from the district, or any other cause, it shall be competent for the remaining members of the council (being a quorum) to appoint some one of themselves to act as chairman for the purpose of carrying out such election, and it shall be lawful for the chairman to appoint, under his hand and seal, such and so many persons as to him may seem necessary, to act as deputy chairman or chairmen, poll clerk or poll clerks, and to appoint such and so many places within the municipal district as he may deem necessary to be the polling place or places, and not being at any hotel, tavern, or inn, and it shall be lawful for him to adjourn the meeting to some hour of the day which shall be the more convenient to the ratepayers, and thereat any ratepayer being on the ratepayers' roll may present himself as a candidate, or any two ratepayers on the roll may propose and second a candidate.

3. If at any election a poll shall be demanded in the manner and form required by the said Act, the chairman shall cause to be provided at the polling place or places a sufficient number of stalls or compartments, together with ink and pens for the purpose of enabling the elector to mark the voting papers as hereinafter provided, in any which polling place no person other than the chairman, the town clerk or his deputy (appointed by him and approved by the chairman), scrutineers, or electors who shall for the time being be tendering their votes, shall be entitled to be present; and any other person than such chairman, town clerk or his deputy, scrutineers, and electors who shall for the time being be tendering their votes, who shall intrude behind the barrier, and upon being required to withdraw by the chairman shall refuse to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the provisions of this bye-law: Provided always that it shall be lawful for the chairman, or the town clerk or his deputy, to summon to his assistance in such compartment or room any member or members of the police force, for the purpose of preserving the public peace, quelling any breach thereof that may have arisen, and for removing out of such room any person or persons who may in his opinion be obstructing the polling or wilfully violating any of the provisions of this bye-law, and upon being convicted thereof, before two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the said district, every such person or persons so offending shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

4. The chairman in each polling place shall cause to be provided for the purpose of such election a locked-up box, of which he shall keep the key, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the voting papers, and which box shall stand in front of the chairman, and each elector shall receive from the chairman a voting paper in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed, and shall thereupon retire to a stall or compartment provided for that purpose, and there strike out the name or names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and deposit the same in the before-mentioned box in the presence of the chairman, town clerk or his deputy, and scrutineers; and in case such elector shall be unable to read, or be blind, he shall signify the same to the chairman, who shall thereupon mark or strike out the names of such candidates as such elector shall designate; and no elector shall take out of such polling place any such voting paper, either before or after he has marked the same; and any person wilfully infringing any of the provisions of this clause, or obstructing the polling by any unnecessary delay in performing any act within the polling place, shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint by writing under his hand, to be delivered to the chairman at any time before Eight o'clock in the morning of the polling day, one scrutineer to be present on his behalf in the polling place.

6. It shall be lawful for the chairman or for any scrutineer to put to any person on his applying for and before he shall have received his voting paper, the following questions only:—

1st. "What is your christian name and surname?"

2nd. "Are you of twenty-one years of age?"

3rd. "Are you a ratepayer on the ratepayers' roll of the municipal district of Maldon?"

4th. "Have you paid all rates levied upon you except such as shall have become payable by you within six months before this election?"

5th. "Have you already voted at this election?"

And if any person shall wilfully give a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay the sum or penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. At every election it shall be the duty of the town clerk or his deputy to provide himself with the ratepayers' roll, and as each elector comes forward to demand his voting paper to see whether the name of such elector appears upon the roll as a ratepayer within the meaning of the said Act, and as such elector deposits his voting paper within the before-mentioned box to mark off such elector's name as having voted at such election.

8. In case the voting paper as of any person shall have been received, and any other person shall afterwards demand his voting paper as of the same person, the chairman, when such person shall propose to deposit his voting paper in the aforesaid box, shall refuse to allow the same to be put therein, but shall receive and keep the same apart, and at the close of the election decide whether such person has already voted or not; and for the purpose of such decision it shall be lawful for the chairman to take evidence upon oath or affirmation, and such decision shall be final and conclusive on all parties; and if it shall appear to the chairman that such person has not already voted at such election, such vote shall be added to the number already polled, but if otherwise, such vote shall not be allowed.

9. At the close of the poll, or as soon afterwards as conveniently may be, the chairman, in the presence of the scrutineers, shall count the number of votes polled for each candidate; and if, on the state of the poll being announced, the number of votes shall have been found to be equal for any two or more candidates, one or more of whom, but not all, shall by the state of the poll and the number of members to be elected, the chairman shall by a casting vote or votes, as the case may be, decide which of the candidates for whom the votes may be equal shall be elected; but no chairman shall be entitled to vote at any election except in the case of an equality of votes. And the chairman shall then, in the presence of the scrutineers, seal up all the voting papers given during the election, and hand the same over to the town clerk for safe custody amongst the records of the council.

10. That all places within which polling is conducted shall be deemed public places.

11. The chairman of the council shall be annually elected in the following manner, namely:—At the first meeting of council after the annual election, which meeting shall be convened by the retiring chairman or the person presiding at the annual election, the senior councillor then present shall take the chair at the hour mentioned in the notice calling the meeting, provided the whole council is present, otherwise at the expiry of half an hour thereafter, and the councillors shall proceed by open voting, on motion as usual, to elect a chairman for the current year, and the councillor in whose favor the show of hands shall be, shall be declared by the acting chairman to be the chairman of the council for the current year, and shall take the chair accordingly.

12. If the result of voting for chairman should be that the highest number of votes is held equally by more than two councillors, then another voting shall take place for those councillors only holding such equality of votes until a majority is recorded, and the chairman shall be elected by the majority of the members of the municipal council.

13. Upon the resignation or disqualification of the chairman of the council, at the next meeting of the council thereafter, the senior councillor then present shall take the chair *pro tem.*, and immediately after the confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting, shall proceed to the election of a chairman of the council for the residue of the municipal year, in manner prescribed by this bye-law.

14. In determining the seniority of councillors for the purpose of this bye-law, it shall be understood to mean those councillors who shall have held office for the longest period without re-election, and having the greatest number of votes when elected.

15. And it is hereby further enacted by the said municipal council, that any person convicted, before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, of a breach of this bye-law, or of any of its regulations or provisions to which breach no particular penalty is hereinbefore attached, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

DIRECTIONS.

The voter is to strike out the name or names of the candidate or candidates for whom he does not intend to vote, by drawing a line through the same with a pen.

He must be careful not to leave uncancelled more names than are capable of being returned at this election, namely names, otherwise the voting paper will be invalid.

The voting paper so marked is to be dropped by him into the ballot box.

The voter is not permitted to take his voting paper out of the polling place.

MUNICIPALITY OF MALDON.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONTROL OVER AND CLEANSING OF PLACES USED FOR SLAUGHTERING SMALL ANIMALS WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF MALDON.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws (*inter alia*) for the suppression of nuisances: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Maldon aforesaid, That the owner or occupier of every place now used or hereafter to be used for the slaughtering of small animals within the municipality of Maldon, shall forthwith or previously to the use thereof cause the same to be registered at the town clerk's office, and shall permit the inspector of nuisances at all times, with or without servants or assistants, to enter into and inspect any such place. And if any such owner or occupier or any other person shall use or permit to be used any such place without registering the same in manner by this bye-law required, or shall obstruct or prevent, or cause to be obstructed or prevented, the said inspector from entering into or inspecting any such place, he or they shall on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds. And the owner or occupier of every such place shall cause all the offal and garbage arising from the slaughtering of any animal to be put in tubs or other moveable vessel, or into a depository properly constructed for that purpose. And such offal and garbage, together with all accumulations of manure, shall be removed and carried away twice at least in each week, that is to say, on Wednesday and Saturday, and at such other times as the said inspector shall direct, and the tubs, vessels, or depositories shall at those respective times be well and thoroughly cleansed. And every such owner or occupier shall remove and carry away such offal, garbage, manure, and blood to such place as shall be approved of by such inspector. And every such owner or occupier infringing any of the provisions of this clause shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 9, made by the municipal council of Maldon, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

PROPOSED ROAD.
COUNTY OF EVELYN.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a road in the county of Evelyn, proposed to be made by the Board of Land and Works, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the name of the owners and occupiers thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited at the Public Lands Office, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

DESCRIPTION OF LAND REQUIRED FOR APPROACHES TO THE BRIDGE OVER THE RIVER PLENTY AT GREENSBOROUGH, THROUGH SECTION XIII, PARISH OF NILLUMBIK, COUNTY OF EVELYN, THE PROPERTY OF — SMITH AND — CAFFERY:—Commencing at a point on the north bank of the River Plenty bearing E. 8° 30', and distant 1 chain 35 links from a point on the north bank of the River Plenty, being the intersection of the eastern boundary of the surveyed road with the River Plenty; thence N. 20° E., distance 45 links; thence by a curve, the chord of which bears N. 14° W., distance 5 chains 50 links; thence by a curve, the chord of which bears N. 28° W., distance 70 links, to a point on the surveyed line of road bearing N. 3° W., and distant 6 chains 35 links from the commencing point.

CHANGES IN MEMBERS AND OFFICERS.

On the 13th August, Alexander Matthews, Esq., was duly elected in the place of Councillor Hay, resigned. On the 7th September, the town surveyor's salary was reduced from £350 per annum to £200.

The annual election to supply the places of William Froomes, Henry Christophers, and Alexander Matthews, Esquires, was held on the 20th January. The poll was taken on the following day, when William Froomes, Henry Christophers, and Daniel Wallace, Esquires, were duly elected; and at the first meeting of council on the 25th January, Councillor Froomes was unanimously elected as chairman for the ensuing year.

WATER SUPPLY.

The question of a permanent water supply has continued to engross much of the attention of this council. Several sources have been visited by the councillors individually; but from the want of a scientific report from thoroughly practical men, no decision has yet been arrived at. The Government have been memorialized on the subject, but no action has as yet been taken.

The council has entered into an engagement with Messrs. Hlastic and Co. to bore for water in Market square, and they are now busily engaged in boring.
