**PROPOSED ROAD.
COUNTY OF BOURKE.**

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a road in the county of Bourke (South Melbourne district), proposed to be opened by the Board of Land and Works, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the name of the owner and occupier thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited at the Crown Lands and Survey Office, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

ROAD PROPOSED TO BE OPENED THROUGH THE PROPERTY OF MR. DUFFETT, IN PORTION 50, PARISH OF BOROONDARA:—Comprising all that piece or parcel of land known and used as a road or right-of-way fifty links wide, situate in the parish of Boroondara, commencing at a point on the south boundary line of portion 11 of the said parish about 14 chains west of the south-east angle of the said portion 11; thence bearing northwards 24 chains to the south boundary of portion 50 of the said parish; and from thence to open up and continue the said road northwards across the said portion 50 to the Government road forming the northern boundary of the said portion.

The quantity of land required for such extension of the said road or right-of-way fifty links wide across the said portion 50 is one rood sixteen perches, more or less; and the estimated cost of effecting such work is, for the land £87 10s., and for 56 rods of fencing £22 8s., making together £109 18s.

BEECHWORTH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS.—[22nd February, 1859.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the 22nd day of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

93. Where the course of a race has been at any time altered or extended, the priority of right to a supply of water theretofore existing in such race shall be taken to be in no way forfeited or prejudicially affected by such alteration or extension; but the same priority theretofore existing in the original race shall be deemed to continue and be in the race as altered or extended: Provided that no existing right is thereby injuriously interfered with; and provided also that no bye-law of the Beechworth Mining Board has been infringed upon by such alteration or extension.

Bye-law No. 80 of the Beechworth Mining Board shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—Any person requiring the aid of steam or horse power on his claim, shall, when steam power is required, be allowed two months; and where horse power is required, one month for procuring the same: Provided that a notice setting forth the name of the claimholder, the date of registration, and miner's right under which the claim is held, be prominently posted upon such claim. But should any dispute arise as to the bona fides of such intention, the onus of proof that such intention is in course of being carried out without evasion or any unnecessary delay shall rest with the person posting such notice, and in failure of such proof the claim shall be deemed absolutely forfeited and abandoned.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-laws.
