## SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT.—THE COUNTY OF HAMPTON.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to make provision for the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors and of refreshments in certain districts*, it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time, to proclaim any part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called a Special Licensing District, and to define the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation declare the following part or portion of the said colony to be a Special Licensing District subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

The County of Hampton, as the same is defined by a Proclamation bearing date the 29th day of December, 1848.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of March, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

## ELECTRIC TELEGRAPH, VICTORIA.

## REGULATIONS.

1. To lessen as much as possible any liability to error in the transmission of messages from defective manuscript, it is desirable that the use of figures should be avoided, and that words at length be substituted; and the public, in using the electric telegraph, are requested to be particular in giving a full and correct address to every message, so that the least possible delay in delivery may occur.

2. Messages will be transmitted in the order of their reception, and no precedence will be allowed except for special despatches on the service of the Government, the arrest of criminals, and in cases of pressing emergency, sickness, or death.

3. All messages will be held strictly confidential.

4. Payment of charges in advance will be required, except for replies to interrogatory messages, on which the sender may have written the words, "reply will be paid for," but special arrangements may be made for the receipt of messages payable by the receiver, either by depositing security at the receiving office or by furnishing written authority covering the cost of transmission.

5. No charge will be made for the date, address, or signature to any message, and it is particularly requested that the two latter may be as clear and explicit as possible.

6. Messages must be written with ink, in a clear and legible manner, and bear a proper date, address, and genuine signature in the usual hand writing of the sender.

7. Messages will be delivered free of charge within one mile of the office, over that distance cab or omnibus fare will be charged, when incurred; and for messages to be delivered on shipboard, an extra charge to cover the disbursement for boat expenses will be made.

8. Messages may be transmitted in cypher in the English language, on payment of an additional charge of fifty per cent., but cypher words must not average more than two syllables.

9. On special occasions, when the communication may be kept open during the night, an additional charge equal to one-third of the ordinary rate will be required upon all messages received for transmission later than 8 p.m.

10. Every reasonable exertion will be used, and precaution adopted, to secure the greatest promptness, accuracy, and despatch in conducting the business of the telegraph, but no responsibility will be assumed for any errors, omissions, or delays in the transmission or non-transmission, delivery or non-delivery of any message, from whatever cause the same may arise. In order, however, to afford the fullest security for the correctness of a transmitted message, the sender may obtain a copy of the message as repeated back from the receiving office, if within the bounds of this colony, upon payment of one-half the original charge upon such message; but in no case will any pecuniary responsibility be recognized beyond the extent of five pounds.

11. In the event of serious delay occurring to prevent the transmission of a message within a reasonable time, or sufficient to destroy the value of the despatch, notice will be conveyed to the sender should his address be known, and the message, together with the amount paid thereon, be returned if desired.

12. In cases where immediate replies are required, the messenger will be instructed to wait five minutes after the delivery, provided the message may contain the words "Reply by telegraph immediately."

13. Printed forms upon which messages should be written may be obtained upon application at the office; but all messages, whether written upon the prescribed forms, or upon plain paper, will be considered as tendered for transmission, and transmitted to their destination under the several conditions and stipulations above detailed.

14. The offices will be kept open for the transmission of messages by the public generally, between the hours of 8 30 a.m. and 8 p.m. (Sundays excepted).

## CASTLEMAINE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

AMENDED Regulations made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery established at Campbell's Creek, Castlemaine (in lieu of the 4th, 8th, and 12th Regulations gazetted on the 20th of April, 1858), and additions to Schedule A.:

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in the cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or a certificate signed by at least two known and respectable storekeepers or householders, proving to the satisfaction of the trustee applied to that such person was a pauper, and that the friends and relations of deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. throughout the rest of the year,—except on Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five p.m. throughout the year. No funerals will be permitted to take place after Eight p.m. from September to April, nor after Six p.m. during the rest of the year.

12. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees; no wooden fences will be allowed exceeding four feet six inches in height.

## WINCHELSEA.

A PETITION, signed by forty-seven landholders and householders in the neighborhood of Winchelsea, has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, representing as follows, viz.:—

That they are desirous that a road district, to be called "The Winchelsea Road District," be erected under the Act 16 Victoria No. 40.

Aware that the inhabitants of Colac and its vicinity have applied for the formation of a road district to comprise a large portion of the country which the petitioners wish to have included in the Winchelsea District, they desire to express their disapproval of the boundaries asked for, on the ground that the lands of the petitioners would be taxed to make roads through a large tract in which they are not immediately interested.

They are of opinion that it will be for their interest that a road district be established, to comprise the following parishes, viz.:—Lake Lake Wollard, Mirnee, Murdeduke, Kargun, part of the parishes of Birregurra and Gellibrand (as described in a plan annexed to the petition), Whoorel, Yan-yan Gurt, and Tutegong.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Wherefore your petitioners respectfully pray that your Excellency will, in pursuance of the powers vested in you by the abovementioned Act, be pleased to proclaim the above named parishes and parts of parishes to be and form a district for the purposes mentioned in the above Act, to be called 'The Winchelsea Road Board District.'"

#### BYE-LAWS, RULES, AND REGULATIONS OF THE MELBOURNE AND SUBURBAN RAILWAY COMPANY.

THE Melbourne and Suburban Railway Company, pursuant to and by virtue and in exercise of all and every the powers, authorities, and privileges given to or conferred on them by an Act of Legislature of the colony of Victoria, passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, *An Act for making and maintaining the Melbourne and Suburban Railway*, and also of all other powers and authorities enabling the said company in this behalf, do hereby make, pass, enact, and establish the bye-laws, rules and regulations following, that is to say:—

1. The accounts of the company shall be made up to the last day of June and the last day of December in each year by the accountant, and be audited by the auditors provided by the Act of Incorporation, and a just and true statement or balance sheet of the moneys received and expended during the previous six months shall be certified by the auditors under their respective hands, which statement or balance sheet shall be printed, and a copy forwarded by the secretary one week before the then ensuing general meeting of the company to every shareholder residing within the colony of Victoria.

2. The common seal of the company shall be kept in the chief office of the company, in the city of Melbourne, in a box having two locks of different kinds thereon, and the secretary shall be responsible for the safe custody and care of the box containing such common seal; and that the key of one of such locks shall be kept by the secretary, and the key of the other of such locks by the chairman or one of the directors.

3. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or document without the authority of the board of directors; and every deed or document so sealed shall be countersigned by one of the directors and by the secretary, or in case of the absence of the secretary by the chairman, and by one other of the directors of the company.

4. Every vote or resolution passed at any meeting of the board of directors or any general meeting of the company, requiring for its legal efficacy the affixing the common seal to any deed or document, shall be deemed a sufficient authority for affixing the common seal thereto.

5. The secretary shall be the chief officer of the company, and shall (subject to the control of the board of directors and of the meetings of the company) have the entire general superintendence and management of the affairs of the company, and be responsible to such board for the due execution and carrying into effect of the resolutions and orders from time to time passed and made by the board of directors and such meetings; and no station master shall obey other instructions or orders other than those of the secretary of the company, and no inferior officer or servant of the company shall obey any instructions or orders than those of his immediate superior or of the secretary.

6. No person will be admitted to the booking office at any station whilst the door is closed for making up and despatching any train; and no passengers will be allowed to take his or her seat in or upon any carriage used on the railway, or to travel therein upon the railway, without having first paid his or her fare and obtained a ticket.

7. Tickets will be issued conditionally, that is to say, in case there shall be room in the train for all the passengers to whom tickets shall have been issued. If there shall not be room for all such passengers, the holders of periodical tickets shall have priority over the holders of return and single tickets; and the fare will be returned, on application to the station master, to the holders of such return and single tickets as shall be unable to obtain seats.

8. Each passenger, on paying his or her fare, will be furnished with a ticket, which he or she is to show whenever required by the station master or porter authorised by him, or by the guard in charge of the train; and if it be a journey or return ticket, he or she must allow it to be marked when required; and every ticket (whether single, return or periodical) must be delivered up on demand of any guard or other servant of the company authorised to collect tickets.

9. Each passenger not producing or delivering up his or her ticket will be required to pay a sum equal to the fare from the place whence the train originally started.

10. Every person attempting to defraud the company by travelling upon the railway without having previously paid his or her fare and obtained a proper ticket, or by riding in or upon a carriage of a superior class to that for which he or she has taken out a ticket, or by altering a return or periodical ticket, or endeavoring to use it after or beyond the time for which it was originally granted, or by attempting in any other manner to evade the payment of his or her fare, shall pay to the company the sum or penalty of Five pounds, or such other less sum or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered shall think fit to order to be paid.

11. No return or periodical ticket will be available for special trains.

12. No passenger will be allowed to ride outside under any circumstances whatever, nor will any person be allowed to get into or upon, or to quit any carriage after the train has been put in motion, and any person doing so, or attempting to do

so, shall pay to the company a sum or penalty of Five Pounds, or such other less sum, or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered shall think fit to order to be paid, and be expelled from the company's premises, and forfeit his fare and ticket, of what kind soever such ticket may be.

13. Dogs will be conveyed and charged for, but they will not on any account be allowed to accompany passengers in the carriages.

14. Smoking is strictly prohibited in the carriages, and in and upon the company's stations and premises, and every person smoking in a carriage, or in or upon any station or other premises of the company, after having been warned to desist, shall pay to the company a sum or penalty of Five pounds, or such other less sum or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered shall think fit to order to be paid; and in addition to such penalty be immediately, or, if travelling, at the first opportunity, expelled from the company's premises, and forfeit his fare and ticket, of what kind soever such ticket may be.

15. Any person found in a carriage or station, or upon the company's premises in a state of intoxication, or committing any nuisance, or wilfully interfering with the comfort of the passengers, shall pay to the company a sum or penalty of Five pounds, or such other less sum or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered shall think fit to order to be paid; and shall immediately, or if travelling, at the first opportunity, be expelled from the company's premises, and forfeit his fare and ticket, of what kind soever such ticket may be.

16. Any passenger cutting the linings, removing or defacing the number plates, breaking the windows or otherwise wilfully damaging or injuring any carriage on the railway, shall pay to the company a sum or penalty of Five pounds, or such other less sum or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered shall think fit to order to be paid in addition to the amount of damage done.

17. No gratuity is, under any circumstances, allowed to be received by the company's servants, on pain of immediate dismissal.

18. No drayman, porter, carter, or other person will be allowed to come into or upon the company's premises for the purpose of removing luggage, either with or without a dray or hand cart or truck (unless required by a passenger, and specifically engaged by him for the express purpose); and no person will be allowed to come into or upon the company's premises for the purpose of touting or soliciting custom or hire of whatsoever kind, and any drayman, carter, porter, or other person evading or attempting to evade this regulation, or refusing or neglecting to quit the company's premises when thereto required by the station master or other servant of the company, shall be expelled from the company's premises, and, in addition thereto, shall pay to the company a sum or penalty of Five pounds, or such other less sum or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered shall think fit to order to be paid.

19. The directors of the company may from time to time issue and give such regulations and directions for the observance, conduct, and guidance of the officers and servants in the employ of the company in the performance and discharge of their respective duties as the board of directors shall approve of.

The foregoing bye-laws, rules and regulations, were made, passed, enacted and established at the general half-yearly meeting of the Melbourne and Suburban Railway Company, held on the twenty-fourth day of February, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine: in testimony whereof the said company have hereunto affixed their common seal.

##### BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have received the assent of His Excellency the Governor since the publication of last report, viz:—

- No. 14. To fix the levels of Sydney street, Kilmore.
- No. 15. For the appropriation of a sum of One thousand three hundred and sixty-four pounds thirteen shillings and sevenpence, granted out of the public revenue for the year 1858 to the municipal district of Kilmore.
- No. 16. For the assessment of all property within the boundaries of the Kilmore municipality for the year ending the 8th of August, 1859.
- No. 17. A bye-law for the levying of a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current municipal year.
- No. 18. To regulate the conducting of the election of members of the municipal council.

##### PUBLIC WORKS FINISHED OR IN PROGRESS.

The contract for the formation, making, pitching, and metalling twelve chains of Foot street has been completed from Church street to John street, and a substantial culvert erected thereon. The contract for kerbing and channelling the west side of Sydney street, from Foot street to Mitchell street, is now nearly completed, and adds materially to the comfort as well as to the convenience of the inhabitants, especially in wet weather. The bridges on Union and Mill streets having been considered dangerous to travellers, more particularly on dark and clouded nights, the council ordered the erection of two lamps and lamp-posts, one on each of these bridges, to be lit on

dark nights only. The extirpation of thistles within the municipality early engaged the attention of the council. The reserves have been for some time cleansed from this destructive weed, the expense being borne by the council. It is to be hoped that all owners of property within the municipality will be compelled to destroy any thistles growing upon their respective properties, and that the inspector will use his best endeavors to accomplish that purpose. A culvert has been constructed in Andrew street, and the water channels thereto for some distance paved. Two culverts, a paved crossing, and one chain of road metalled have been constructed in Tootal street. A contract has also been entered into for the removal of a culvert at the junction of Clarke and Sydney streets; for repairs to and extension of a culvert at the junction of Mitchell and Sydney streets, and for cutting a drain therefrom to the creek; and for the cleansing of a culvert and approaches at the junction of Routledge and Powlett streets; together with the construction of three dams across the Kilmore Creek, with the view of retaining sufficient water, if not for culinary, at least for washing purposes.

#### THE COMMONAGE RESERVE.

The inhabitants of the municipality need scarcely be informed that the resumption of the Kilmore Commonage Reserve by the Government has caused no small amount of dissatisfaction. The council, upon learning that the Commissioner of Crown Lands had granted a license for the occupation of the reserve, at once put themselves in communication with the Honorable the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey in reference to the matter, but, strange to say, no reply has yet been received. From information derived from other sources, the council are inclined to believe that the reserve will be restored to the free use of the public in terms of the order of His Excellency the Governor in Council.
