PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the county of Evelyn hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at the north-western angle of section XX. in the parish of Morang; thence by the northern boundary of the said section to the north-eastern angle of the said parish of Morang; thence by a line to the confluence of the Back and Diamond Creeks; thence southerly and westerly along the boundary of the Eltham road district to the river Plenty; and thence by that river to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be, "The Greensborough Road District."

EPHING ROAD DISTRICT ENLARGED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-first day of July, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, a certain portion of the county of Bourke, therein defined, was declared to be a road district under the designation of "The Epping Road District." And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable to vary and alter the boundary of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the boundaries specified in the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the publication hereof the boundaries of the said Epping road district shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of the village reserve of Pentridge; thence by the southern boundary of section 144. in the parish of Jika Jika, to the main road from Melbourne to Epping; thence along the eastern boundary line of section 139, in the parish of Jika Jika, to its south-east corner at the junction of the Epping and Upper Plenty roads, and on the east a straight line commencing at the junction of the Epping and Upper Plenty roads, bearing north 18 degrees east for a distance of about three miles and eight chains to the south-east corner of section 14, in the parish of Keelbundora; thence by the Darbin Creek to the south-western angle of section 1, in the parish of Morang; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that section, and by the eastern boundaries of sections 8, 9, 16, and 17, in the said parish of Morang, to the north-eastern angle of the said section 17; thence by the northern boundary of section 17, and by a line west to the Merri Creek; thence southwards by the Merri Creek to the northern boundary of section 148, in the parish of Jika Jika; and thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that section and by the eastern boundary of the village reserve of Pentridge to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the county of Taibot hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of portion 63, in the parish of Ballarat; thence north to the north-eastern angle of portion 112, in the parish of Spring Hills; thence west to the north-western angle of the parish of Addington; thence north to McCullum's Creek; thence by that creek to McCullum's home station; thence north-easterly by the road from Lexton to Mount Franklin to Glengower or McLauchlan's Creek; thence by that creek to its source; thence south to the sources of the Bullarook Creek; and thence by a line westerly to the commencing point; excluding the municipal district of Creswick.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be, "The Creswick Road District."
