whether the same have been employed by me directly, or indirectly through my agents and sub-contractors, have been paid their wages in full, in money, being the current coin of the realm, up to the latest date at which such wages or claims were due, and in accordance, in every respect, with the provisions of clause No. 15 of the General Conditions of the Contract.

### "TRUCK SYSTEM NOT ALLOWED.

"15. The workmen, tradesmen, and laborers of every class, employed on the works of this contract, shall be paid their wages in full, in money, being the current coin of the realm, at least once in every fortnight; and no ticket or other system of payment by provisions, liquors, or goods, will on any pretence be allowed; nor shall the contractor, or any person or persons employed by him, or in any way connected with him, establish any shop for the supply of provisions, liquors, or goods; nor shall the contractor oblige his workmen to take provisions, liquors, or goods of any kind from any person appointed by him. The workmen of every class shall be paid on the works, if it be possible, or in a building adjoining; and in no case shall they be paid at a public-house, or other place where liquors are sold. Any violation, either direct or indirect, of this clause, will be treated and considered as a breach of contract."

#### MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF AVOCA.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the householders and landowners at Avoca, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF AVOCA.—Commencing at the south-western angle of country allotment S, in the parish of Avoca; thence northerly by the western boundaries of allotments S, T, U, and V to the north-western angle of allotment W; thence north 1 chain and 50 links to the southern boundary of suburban allotment 137, in the said parish of Avoca; thence west to the south-western angle of the said allotment; thence north by the eastern side of a Government road, and by a north

line to the north-western angle of country allotment 2 of Section C, in the said parish of Avoca; thence northerly by the western boundaries of allotments 3 and 4 to the north-western angle of the said allotment 4; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the said allotment to the River Avoca; thence across the said river to the north-western angle of allotment 8 of section B, in the said parish of Avoca; thence easterly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 7 of the said section; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 7 and 6 of section B aforesaid, allotments 10, 7, and 6 of section A, and by a line to the north-eastern angle of the town reserve of Avoca; thence south to the south-eastern angle of the said town reserve; thence southerly by a line to the north-eastern angle of country allotment A, in the said parish of Avoca; thence south-westerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment D, in the said parish of Avoca; thence by the southern boundaries of allotments E, F, G, and S, to the commencing point aforesaid.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Avoca."

#### PROPOSED ROAD. COUNTY OF BOURKE.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a road in the county of Bourke (required for forming the approach from Melbourne to Hawthorn Bridge), proposed to be made by the Board of Land and Works, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the name of the owner and occupier thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited at the Crown Lands and Survey Office, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

LAND REQUIRED FOR ROAD PURPOSES AT RICHMOND, BEING A PORTION OF ALLOTMENT 31, THE PROPERTY OF AND OCCUPIED BY WILLIAM OSWIN:—Bounded by a line commencing at the north-east corner of allotment 31, and running due west one hundred and ninety (190) links; thence by a line running in a south-easterly direction one hundred and ninety-five (195) links; and thence by a line running due north thirty-two (32) links to the commencing point.

The estimated value of the portion of land above described is Forty-six pounds seven shillings and sixpence, calculated at the rate of £1500 per acre. The house marked A on the plan forms a portion of the Bridge Inn, and is estimated to be worth Four hundred and fifty pounds.

All persons affected by the proposed road are requested to set forth in writing, addressed to the President of the Board of Land and Works, Office of Roads and Bridges, Melbourne, within forty days from the first publication of this notice, any well-grounded objections that they may have to the said road, failing which they will be thereafter precluded from making any such objections or claiming any compensation whatsoever.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF FITZ ROY.

BYE-LAW No. 3.—FOR REGULATING BUILDING OPERATIONS  
WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF FITZ ROY.

WHEREAS under 18 Victoria No. 15, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted that every municipal council shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, &c. and shall and may make such bye-laws for carrying out these objects: Be it therefore enacted, That, from and after the date hereof, no builder or other persons shall commence erecting or pulling down any building, or placing any materials for or from the same, in or abutting on any public street, lane, court, or alley to which the public may have access within the municipality, without first obtaining a license, in form set forth in schedule A. hereunto annexed, from the said council, to authorise him to deposit such building materials. Before any such deposit shall be made, a good and sufficient hoarding shall be erected, to be placed round such materials, to the satisfaction of the council, their surveyor or other officer, and a light, or so many lights as the case may require, shall be kept in a conspicuous place thereon, burning from sunset to sunrise. No such material shall encroach more than the one-third of the width of the roadway, or so as to render any road impassable to vehicles, and the footways and gutters or drains shall in all cases be kept free.

The license shall remain in force for twenty-one days from the date thereof, and no longer, but may be renewed upon application to the council.

Any builder or other person refusing to show his license when required to do so by the town surveyor, or other authorised officer of the council, shall be deemed and dealt with as an unlicensed person; and any person producing such license which has been in any way altered, shall be deemed an unlicensed person.

Any person depositing building materials without being licensed so to do, or exceeding the powers by such license, or in any other way failing to comply with the provisions of this bye-law, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20); and any person failing to remove any scaffolding, hoarding, &c., as aforesaid, on being called on to do so by the proper authority, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5) per day for every day that it may continue and not be removed: Provided always that such cumulative penalty shall not exceed on the whole the sum of Fifty pounds.

The council or their surveyor may, however, call as frequently as he or they may deem necessary or proper on any person contravening this regulation to remove forthwith the cause of offence, and the refusal or delay to obey any and every such call shall be and be deemed to be a separate and distinct offence under this bye-law, and shall subject the offender to the penalty hereinbefore set forth.

**MUNICIPALITY OF KYNETON.**

**BYE-LAW No. 5.—FOR MAKING AN ASSESSMENT AND IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE YEAR 1859.**

**WHEREAS** by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is authorised and required to assess all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district (except property belonging to Her Majesty) according to its fair average annual value, and to impose a rate on all such properties for the current year: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the said municipal district of Kyneton, That all the several properties in houses and lands within the limits of the said municipal district be and the same are hereby assessed, for the current municipal year 1859, according to the several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the same in the assessment roll made by William Donnelly, the town surveyor, and confirmed by the said council, on the 31st day of January, 1859, amounting to the sum of Twenty-four thousand five hundred and ninety-four pounds (£24,594), subject, however, to reduction or alteration on appeal to a court of petty sessions as provided by the said Act; and that a rate for the current municipal year 1859 of One shilling in the pound on the said annual value be and the same is hereby imposed and levied on all the said properties respectively, the first moiety thereof to be due and payable on the 1st day of April, 1859, and the other moiety thereof on the 1st day of October, 1859.

**MUNICIPALITY OF PRAHRAN.**

**BYE-LAW No. 61.—A BYE-LAW TO COMPEL OBSERVANCE TO BE PAID TO THE SURVEYED LINE OF STREET IN THE FUTURE ERECTION OF BUILDINGS AND FENCES; ALSO TO PROVIDE FOR THE REMOVAL OF BUILDINGS AND FENCES NOW STANDING IN ANY WAY ON THE STREETS.**

**BE** it ordered and directed by the municipal council of Prahran, in accordance with the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, That, from and after this bye-law shall have received the assent of His Excellency the Governor, the owners or occupiers of any house or building, or of any land where the fence in any way encroaches on the boundary line of any street within the said municipality, shall be required to move such house, building, or fence back to the surveyed line of such street, or streets, and if any house, building, or fence shall, in the opinion of the municipal council or their authorised

officer, encroach so far on any street as to prevent, interfere with, or hinder the making or repairing of any of the surveyed roads or streets within the said municipality, then it shall be lawful for the municipal council, by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of any house or building, or of any land where the fence encroaches as aforesaid, to order the removal of such house, building, or fence, within fourteen days from the date hereof. And be it further ordered and enacted as aforesaid, that any person failing or neglecting or refusing to comply with the provisions of this bye-law, on the expiration of the term abovenamed in such notice as aforesaid, shall be liable and subject to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for the first offence and a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds for any second offence, and for any succeeding offence against this bye-law a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, such penalty or penalties to be recovered and recoverable in the manner provided by the said Act.
