NOTICE TO ROAD CONTRACTORS, AND TO TRADESMEN AND LABORERS EMPLOYED BY THEM.

EACH contractor will be required to sign the following declaration, in accordance with the terms of the 15th clause of the General Conditions of the Contract (a copy of which is at foot), before any payment of works is made to him:—

I do hereby declare that, to the best of my knowledge and belief, the tradesmen and laborers of every kind employed on the works under the within contract, for

whether the same have been employed by me directly, or indirectly through my agents and sub-contractors, have been paid their wages in full, in money, being the current coin of the realm, up to the latest date at which such wages or claims were due, and in accordance, in every respect, with the provisions of clause No. 15 of the General Conditions of the Contract.

Copy of the 15th clause of the General Conditions of Contract.

"TRUCK SYSTEM NOT ALLOWED.

"15. The workmen, tradesmen, and laborers of every class, employed on the works of this contract, shall be paid their wages in full, in money, being the current coin of the realm, at least once in every fortnight; and no ticket or other system of payment by provisions, liquors, or goods, will on any pretence be allowed; nor shall the contractor, or any person or persons employed by him, or in any way connected with him, establish any shop for the supply of provisions, liquors, or goods; nor shall the contractor oblige his workmen to take provisions, liquors, or goods of any kind from any person appointed by him. The workmen of every class shall be paid on the works, if it be possible, or in a building adjoining; and in no case shall they be paid at a public-house, or other place where liquors are sold. Any violation, either direct or indirect, of this clause, will be treated and considered as a breach of contract."

NOTICE TO AGENTS AND MASTERS OF VESSELS.

THE Government being desirous to afford every facility for the engagement and discharge of seamen at the port of Melbourne, have determined that on and after 1st April, 1859, the licensed shipping agents shall no longer be employed in this duty, but that the entire work shall be performed in the Government Shipping Office.

Under this arrangement it is believed that great saving of expense will be effected to masters and owners of vessels.

The attention of masters of vessels and other persons is directed to the following extract from the 147th section of the *Merchant Shipping Act, 1854*, relative to receiving seamen on board who may have been illegally engaged.

Clause 3, sec. 147.—"If any person knowingly receives or accepts to be entered on board any ship any seaman or apprentice who has been engaged or supplied contrary to the provisions of this Act, he shall for every seaman or apprentice so engaged or supplied incur a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds."

CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

THE subjoined Despatch and Notification of the conditions under which Candidates for the Civil Service of India will be examined in July, 1859, are published for general information.

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.
REGULATIONS.

1. In July, 1859, an examination of candidates will be held in London. Forty candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified; of these, twenty-five will be selected for the presidency of Bengal, eight for that of Madras, and seven for that of Bombay. Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any natural-born subject of Her Majesty, who shall be desirous of entering the civil service of India, will be entitled to be examined at such examination, provided he shall, on or before the 1st May, 1859, have transmitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, London, S.W.—

- (a) A certificate of his birth, showing that his age on the 1st May, 1859, will be above eighteen years and under twenty-three years;
- (b) A certificate, signed by a physician or surgeon, of his having no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him for the civil service of India;
- (c) Satisfactory proof of good moral character;
- (d) A statement of those of the branches of knowledge hereinafter enumerated in which he desires to be examined.

3. In any case in which a doubt may arise as to the eligibility of a candidate in respect of age, health, or character, such inquiries as may be necessary will be instituted by the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:—

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks, and the numbers set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denote the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination unless he shall be considered to possess a competent knowledge of that subject.

7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visu voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the forty candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the civil service of India. They shall be permitted to

choose, according to the order in which they stand, as long as a choice remains, the presidency to which they shall be appointed.

9. In July, 1860, a further examination of the selected candidates will take place in the following subjects:—

In this, as in the preceding examination, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the numbers set opposite to each subject denote the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visu voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary.

10. No candidate will be permitted to proceed to India until he shall have passed the further examination, or after he shall have attained the age of twenty-five years.

11. The selected candidates who at the further examination shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, shall be adjudged to have passed, and to be entitled to be appointed to the civil service of India.

12. The seniority of the civil service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the further examination.

13. No person will, even after passing the further examination, be allowed to proceed to India unless he shall comply with the regulations in force at the time for the civil service of India, and shall be of sound bodily health and good moral character. The Civil Service Commissioners will require such further evidence on these points as they may deem necessary before granting their certificate of qualification.

14. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, London, S.W.

NOTE.—The Secretary of State for India in Council has authorized the Civil Service Commissioners to state that, with the view of meeting the expenses to be incurred by selected candidates during the interval which must elapse before they can proceed to India, it is his Lordship's intention to allow the sum of £100 to each selected candidate who shall have passed the further examination in July, 1860, to the satisfaction of the commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

COUNTY OF BOURKE.

ARARAT GENERAL SESSIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace should be established and holden in certain places therein named, and such other places and districts within the said colony as the Lieutenant Governor thereof should appoint; and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony from time to time to define and appoint by Proclamation the limits and boundaries of such places or districts within which all such courts should have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts should be holden, and such limits, districts, places, and times respectively to revoke, alter, or vary, as the said Lieutenant Governor should think fit: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and appoint that a Court of General Sessions of the Peace, to be called the Court of General Sessions for Ararat, shall be established and holden in and for the district of Ararat, having jurisdiction within the said district, the boundaries whereof are hereby defined to be as follow, that is to say:—

ARARAT GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of the Emu Creek; thence by that creek to the southern boundary of the county of Ripon; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that county to the River Glenelg; thence by that river and a line north to Norton Creek; thence by Norton Creek and the River Wimmera to the southern shore

of Lake Hindmarsh; thence by a line easterly to the River Avoca; and thence by that river and the Dividing Range to the commencing point.

And with the advice aforesaid I do hereby appoint that the place and times at which the said court shall be holden in each year shall be as follow until otherwise ordered, that is to say:— At Ararat, on the first day of March, the first day of June, the first day of September, and the first day of December.

And I do hereby further declare and appoint that if any of the aforesaid days shall happen to fall on a Sunday or on Good Friday, the said court shall commence on the day next following.

GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT OF BUNINYONG AND BALLAARAT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighth day of April, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, the district in and for which the Court of General Sessions of the Peace of Buninyong and Ballaarat was appointed to be holden was altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed expedient again to alter such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby appoint that the limits and boundaries hereinafter mentioned shall be the limits and boundaries within which the Court of General Sessions of the Peace of Buninyong and Ballaarat shall have jurisdiction, that is to say:—

Commencing at the source of the Emu Creek; thence by that Creek to Bailie's Creek; thence by Bailie's Creek to the town of Carngtham; thence by a line south-easterly to the junction of Williamson's Creek and the River Yarrovec; thence by a line easterly to the junction of the Lal-lal Rivulet and the River Moorabool; thence by the River Moorabool to its source; thence by the Main Dividing Range to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence by that creek to the Deep Creek; thence by the Deep Creek to its source; and thence by the Main Dividing Range to the source of the Emu Creek, the commencing point aforesaid.

MURDER.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCES-
SORY.
