INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF MINING SURVEYORS.

AT a meeting of the Mining Committee of the Board of Science, held on the 14th October, 1858, the following Instructions for the guidance of Mining Surveyors were approved:—

INSTRUCTIONS.

Mining surveyors will be required to forward to the secretary of the Board of Science on the 14th day of each month, a Report, with plans and sections made up to, and inclusive of the last day of the preceding month.

In his Report the surveyor will be required to give—1st, A very brief, general description of his district, shewing the condition and character of the mines; the state of the population, whether settled or unsettled; the general progress of mining operations—with such other remarks as he may think necessary. 2nd, Tables shewing the number and description of machines at work and idle; the approximate number of persons engaged in mining—distinguishing when possible the employments, as alluvial digger, quartz miner, quartz crusher, &c. 3rd, Explanations of the plans and sections. 4th, Information with respect to quartz claims; and facts (coming under the personal observation of the surveyor) relative to the yield of gold at different depths. 5th, A list of the common mining terms in use in his district.

The plans required are as follows:—

1st. A general plan or tracing on a scale of half an inch to one mile, shewing the boundaries of the mining surveyor's district, the gold workings, distinguishing the alluvial workings by a blue color and the quartz mines by red, the position of the main street or places occupied by the population, the position of the camp or head quarters of the warden, and such natural features as hills, creeks, outcropping rocks, &c., as can be supplied without occupying time that should be employed on more immediate and pressing duties.

2nd. A plan of each main AURIFEROUS CREEK OR GULLY on a scale of four chains to one inch, shewing the position of the
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claims, the place of each shaft, distinguishing each by a number having reference to the description in the report, the sites occupied by machinery, reservoirs, &c., and the course of races, drains, &c.

Where the shafts have been sunk to the auriferous drift (washing stuff) vertical sections of the ground sunk through, on a scale of eight feet to one inch, will be required, sufficient in number and so distributed as to shew the character of the lead.

It will in some cases be necessary to have a complete section of a creek or gully, and in making such sections the surveyor must use a datum line referable to some well known bench mark where such exists, and where none exists he must establish one. Such sections must be on the same scale as the plan of the lead for both horizontal and vertical distances.

Where diggings are isolated, the surveyor will fix their position by a traverse line from the main diggings, or from some fixed point on his general plan, and shew the trend of the watercourses, the main lines of road, &c.

Where there are QUARTZ MINES the surveyor will be required to furnish, 1st, a plan of each important group of shafts, on a scale of four chains to one inch; 2nd, a detail-plan of each important mine on a scale of eight feet to one inch, shewing the underground workings, each gallery being distinguished by a number having reference to the descriptions in the report. He will be required to describe, and to illustrate his descriptions by sketches if necessary, the usual methods of timbering the shaft and galleries, the modes of ventilation, and the provisions for disposing of the non-auriferous quartz, stating whether it is all brought to the surface, leaving the galleries clear, or whether any and which of the galleries are stowed.

For the sake of uniformity, it is desirable that all the above plans be laid down in reference to the magnetic meridian, and that the variation of the needle be given on each plan.

After the surveyor has sent in all the plans above mentioned it will not be necessary to send copies of each with each succeeding report, but only tracings or plans of new works, with the needful connections.

In the event of minerals, rocks, or fossils of an interesting character being found in the mines, it will be to the advantage of science to forward them with the plans and other documents which they would illustrate. Each contributor's name will be recorded and attached to the specimens he sends.

Should any new modes of ventilation, or new machines, be brought into use, and approved of, though not generally adopted, the surveyor might send descriptions or sketches illustrative of their character.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS a certain building has been erected at Omeo, in the district of the Murray, at the public expense, as and for a lock-up for police purposes: And whereas it is deemed expedient to proclaim such building to be a gaol, prison and house of correction, within the meaning of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the said colony, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said building, called and known as the Police Lock-up, situated at Omeo aforesaid, as and to be a public gaol, prison and house of correction, within the meaning of the said Act.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend the Laws relative to the vending of Fermented and Spiritous Liquors*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first Schedule to the said Act annexed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to declare the township of Euroa to be a place for the purpose and within the meaning of the above recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the township hereinafter named and defined shall be a place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors in quantities not less than two gallons may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first Schedule to the above recited Act, that is to say:—

EUROA TOWNSHIP RESERVE.—Commencing at a point 1 chain due south from the south-western angle of allotment IX. of section A, in the parish of Euroa; thence east 113 chains and 15 links; thence south 113 chains and 15 links; thence west 113 chains and 15 links; and thence north 113 chains and 15 links to the commencing point.

BYE-LAWS.

During the half-year the following bye-laws have received the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, viz. :—

1. To regulate, by standing orders, the proceedings of the municipal council of Dunolly.

No. 3. For preventing the kindling of chimneys.

No. 4. To provide for the cleansing of footways and water channels.

No. 6. To compel observance to be paid to the surveyed line of street in the future erection of buildings; also, to provide for the removal of houses and buildings now standing in any way on the streets.

No. 8. A bye-law for levying a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current year.

The following bye-laws now await the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, viz. :—

No. 2. To prevent the nuisances arising from cattle being at large within the municipal district of Dunolly.

No. 5. For the better prevention of fires, and the danger to life and property arising therefrom.

No. 7. For the expenditure of the first moiety of £1000, granted out of the public revenue for the year 1858 to the municipal district of Dunolly.

No. 9. For regulating the mode of voting at the elections of councillors.

No. 10. To regulate the erection of shades or awnings, and prevent any obstruction upon, over or across the public footpaths in the Main street of Dunolly.

ASSESSMENT AND RATES.

The council met on Friday, the 24th September last, for the purpose of hearing and determining any objections to the list of ratepayers, but no objections were made, and the list was confirmed.

A court of petty sessions was held on the 3rd December for hearing appeals, but no parties appeared. The amount of assessment was at the rate of one shilling per pound, and represents a value of £11,984. A voluntary rate of sixpence in the pound, approved at a public meeting of ratepayers, to cover the item of £283 10s., under the head of "Deputation Expenses," &c., is in course of collection.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The following works have been completed, viz. :—
The formation of the footpaths in Broadway, on which 3700 loads of stuff have been expended.

The kerbing of the footpaths in Broadway between Tweedale and Thompson streets (882 yards).

The formation of barrel drains in Bull street.
