BOARD OF NATIONAL EDUCATION.

THE additional Rules subjoined hereto, made by the Board of National Education for the Colony of Victoria, have been approved by the Governor in Council, and are now published in accordance with the Act 15 Victoria No. VII.

ADDITIONAL RULES.

1. *Training of teachers.*—With reference to paragraph 2, section III. of the General Rules and Regulations of the Commissioners of National Education, in which it is stated that the Commissioners have provided a normal establishment in Melbourne for training teachers and educating persons who are intended to undertake the charge of schools: The Commissioners hereby give notice, that, owing to the paucity of funds placed at their disposal for the service of the current year, they will be compelled to close the training establishment after the end of the present term, viz., 31st March next.

2. *Examination and salaries of teachers.*—With reference to rule 8, section III. of the Regulations of the Commissioners of National Education as to the examination and salaries of teachers: The Commissioners hereby give notice, that a reduction of £5 per centum will be made upon all salaries and allowances paid to teachers, workmistresses, pupil teachers, and paid monitors, during the nine months of 1859, commencing on the 1st April.

3. *Examination and salaries of teachers.*—With reference to the rule of the Board of the 17th July, 1858, rescinding paragraph 9, section III. of the Regulations as to examination and salaries of teachers: The Commissioners of National Education hereby give notice, that, from and after the 1st July next, teachers of non-vested schools will only receive allowances in lieu of house accommodation at one-half the rates granted to teachers of vested schools.

The allowance hitherto granted towards the rent of school-houses will cease from the same date.

4. *Numbers of teachers, &c., allowed to schools.*—With reference to the rules issued by the Board in July, 1858, specifying the numbers of teachers, &c., to be allowed to schools: The Commissioners of National Education hereby give notice, that where the average attendance continues below thirty, they will not ordinarily grant a salary above £50 a year.

5. *Pupil teachers.*—With reference to paragraph 17, section III. of the General Rules and Regulations of the Commissioners, in which it is stated that the Commissioners propose to establish a system of pupil teachers: Notice is hereby given, that it is the intention of the Board to bring this system into operation on the 1st July next; and the various assistant teachers employed under the Board are requested to take notice that their services may be dispensed with from that date.

FOOTSCRAY PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and seventy-two householders, resident at and near Footscray, in the county of Bourke, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are all householders within the meaning of the Act above referred to, and resident within the area hereinafter described; that such area is less than nine square miles, that no one point therein is distant six miles from any other point, and that it contains the number of householders required by the said Act.

They further state that they are desirous that the Government township of Footscray and the neighborhood should be constituted a municipal district, to be bounded in manner following, viz.:—"Commencing at a point being the intersection of the western boundary line of section 8 of the parish of Cut-paw-paw with the Stony Creek and the north-west corner of the municipal district of Williamstown, and thence bearing south to the south-east corner of section 9 of the said parish; thence in a line bearing west to the south-west corner of the said section 9; thence in a line bearing north to a point on the western boundary of section 16, at the south side of a certain street reserved out of the said section 16, known as Suffolk street; thence along the south side of Suffolk street bearing east to another reserved street called Church street; thence by Church street in a line bearing north-east and east to the western boundary line of section 15; thence in a line along the said western boundary line of section 15 to the north-west corner thereof; thence in a line bearing east along the northern boundary line of the said section 15 to the Saltwater River; thence by the Saltwater River to the south side of the railway; thence in a line to the north-east corner of the Government township of Footscray; thence by the eastern and southern boundary lines of the said township to the western side of the River Yarra; thence by the River Yarra and the Stony Creek to the commencing point."

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray your Excellency that the beforementioned boundaries may be declared the limits and constituted the municipal district of Footscray, and that your Excellency will be pleased to issue the necessary Proclamation for declaring it a municipality, and defining its limits accordingly."

MUNICIPALITY OF ARARAT.

BY-LAW No. 5.—FOR REGULATING AND LICENSING PUBLIC VEHICLES, PUBLIC CARTERS, WATER DRAWERS, AND NIGHTMEN.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of this Act, to make bye-laws for the regulation and licensing of public carriers, carters, water drawers and public vehicles, the restraining of noisome and offensive trades, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Ararat, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria:—

1. That no vehicle of any kind or description whatsoever, excepting stage coaches running long distances, shall carry any passengers for hire within this municipality unless the same be duly licensed.

2. That any owner or owners of every public vehicle carrying passengers within this municipality shall register their names and addresses, and the names and addresses of their drivers, at the town clerk's office, and shall submit the vehicle, horses, and harness required to be licensed, to the inspection of the council or their inspector, and the council shall thereupon determine the number of passengers to be carried at any one time in or upon the said vehicle, and after satisfying themselves as to the good character of the person who shall be registered as the driver thereof, may grant a license in the annexed form (marked A.); and the owner or owners of every licensed vehicle shall cause to be conspicuously and legibly printed thereon the number of his or their license, and the number of passengers that such vehicle has been licensed to carry; and any owner of a licensed vehicle changing his place of abode, or selling such vehicle, shall give notice thereof in writing to the town clerk within three days of such change of residence or sale, or in default shall be liable to the penalty imposed by this bye-law; and every purchaser of such vehicle using the same for hire before having had his name endorsed on the license of such vehicle by the town clerk, shall be deemed and taken to be the owner of an unlicensed vehicle, and be subject to the penalty imposed by this bye-law.

3. Be it further enacted, that the owner of every cart, dray, or other vehicle plying for hire within the said municipality, shall register his name and place of abode in the town clerk's office, and shall thereupon receive a license, on which shall be written or printed his name and place of abode, and the number of his license; and the owner of every cart or dray plying for hire shall have the number of his license with his name legibly painted and conspicuously fixed to the right or off side of the dray or cart: Provided always, that in case the owner shall have more than one cart or dray plying for hire, he shall take out a license for each and every such cart or dray in the same manner as though they belonged to different owners.

4. Be it further ordered and directed, that every public water carter plying within the said municipal district shall register his name and place of abode in the town clerk's office, and shall

thereupon receive a license, on which shall be written or printed his name and place of abode, the number of his license, and also the reward and amounts which the council hold themselves bound to pay to water carters supplying water under their directions in case of fire; and the owner of every such water cart shall have the number of his license with his name legibly painted and conspicuously affixed to the right or left side of such water cart; and, further, every such public water carter shall have the words "water cart" and the number of his license legibly painted and fixed in a conspicuous manner on the outside of his residence or the premises where the said water cart is placed at night. And, further, be it ordered, the better to guard against accidents by fire, that the owner or owners of all public water carts shall keep them constantly loaded with water during the night, and also, if called upon by the council or any officer duly authorised by them, shall with all due diligence, and to the best of their ability, supply water for the extinguishing of any fire that may occur on property within the municipal boundary, and any water carter who shall fail, without reasonable cause, to keep his water cart so loaded, or shall refuse or neglect to supply water to fires when called upon as aforesaid, or fail to comply with the conditions herein imposed, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter mentioned.

5. Be it further ordered and directed, that the owner of any cart or dray engaged for hire in carting night-soil, or offal, or offensive refuse, shall register his name and place of abode, and also satisfy the council that he is a fit and proper person to carry on the trade of nightman.

The name and address of every nightman, together with the number of his license, and the words "licensed cart or dray," as the case may be, shall be legibly painted and affixed in a conspicuous position upon the cart or dray with which he shall ply for hire; and every such cart or dray shall have affixed thereto when employed in removing night-soil two colored lights (bull's-eyes), that on the off side to be green, and that on the near side to be red.

6. Any person who shall deposit night-soil on any other place than such as has been appointed for that purpose by the council, or who shall be found with any cart or dray with night-soil therein before ten o'clock p.m., or who shall be found with any cart or dray with night-soil therein within any part of this municipality after five o'clock a.m. of any day, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter mentioned.

7. Any person committing any act against the provisions of this bye-law, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions or conditions contained herein, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling.

MUNICIPALITY OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

BYE LAW No. 24.—FOR PRESCRIBING MATERIALS TO BE USED IN THEIR CONSTRUCTION, AND THE HEIGHT AT WHICH TO BE ERECTED AWNINGS SO REQUIRED, UPON AND OVER THE FOOTWAYS, AND FOR PREVENTING EXTERNAL PROJECTIONS FROM OR BEFORE BUILDINGS IN THE PUBLIC STREETS AND THOROUGHFARES OF THE MUNICIPALITY.

[Under the 18th Victoria No. 15.]

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act to provide for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that "every such municipal council (the council of any municipal district) shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, wharves, jetties, piers, and public thoroughfares, and shall also adopt such means as may seem to them desirable for the*** preservation of the health of the public***, and shall and may make such bye-laws for carrying out these objects, as also for the lighting, drainage, and sewerage of the municipal district, as shall to such council seem fit." And whereas in numerous public streets in the municipality awnings are erected of unsuitable materials and of different widths and heights, by which ingress, egress, and regress to shops in such streets are impeded and the ventilation thereof rendered defective, and public health and convenience thereby unfavorably affected: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of the municipality of East Collingwood, from and after the date hereof, by and with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria and his Executive Council, That no person be permitted to erect or fix any external projection from or before any building in, upon, or over the footways of the public streets of the municipality of East Collingwood without first obtaining leave so to do, subject to such conditions as are set forth in schedule A, hereunto appended. That no such awnings shall be made of any material or sustained by supporters but those which shall be authorised, in writing, by the council of the said municipality, through their legal representative the town clerk, who shall sign such authority on their behalf. After such authority shall have been given as aforesaid, such awnings may be erected or fixed, but the pillars or supports thereof shall not be fixed except on the outer line or kerb of the footways, so as to leave the entire width the same as proclaimed from time to time in the *Government Gazette*, by or with the authority of His Excellency the Governor, and the said pillars or supports shall not be of a less height under the lowest part of the awning than nine feet above the surface of the footway upon or near which such pillars or supports may be fixed. That awnings previously erected, if hereafter altered or taken down to be erected, shall be re-erected in conformity with the provisions herein enacted, in either case after six days clear notice to that effect, by the said council, through the town clerk. That persons offending against any of the provisions of this bye-law, shall on conviction thereof be fined a sum not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

SIXTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BALLAARAT, FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING THE 16TH JANUARY, 1859.

PUBLIC WORKS.

Water-works.

THE municipal council have, during the past half-year, laid down pipes from Yuille's Swamp, and erected stand pipes at the junction of Sturt and Lydiard and Sturt and Lyons streets. The advantages which will result by the completion of these works can only at present be anticipated. Irrespective of the saving annually in the maintenance of the roads from the swamp, caused by the water carts, the inhabitants in the populous portion of the township are now supplied with water at very reduced prices.

Gas.

The municipal council have to congratulate the inhabitants of this district on the successful accomplishment of the Ballarat Gas Company; and the council have availed themselves of the advantages which accrue to any town by being properly lighted, and wherever the company have laid down mains, the municipal council have erected lamp-posts, and arranged for the lighting of the streets.

Railway Terminus.

The municipal council, finding that efforts were being made by the residents on Ballarat East to have the Geelong and Ballarat Railway to terminate on Bakery Hill, sent a deputation from this council, accompanied by a deputation from the resident merchants of this district, and although nothing definite was promised by the Government, they ascertained the contract accepted included that portion between Bakery Hill and Soldier's Hill, and taking into consideration the necessity of providing for a further extension of the railway into the agricultural districts, the municipal council feels assured that the chief terminus for the Ballarat district will be on Soldier's Hill.

Maintenance of the Streets.

Under the supervision of the town surveyor, hired labor has been employed for cleansing and repairing the roads and streets, and also for collecting and breaking the stone necessary for keeping the roads in repair during the ensuing winter, and for that purpose the municipal council have on hand 2553 cubic yards of broken quartz, and 1234 cubic yards of gravel.

Botanical Gardens.

The municipal council offered a premium for the best design for laying out the grounds, and have had the grounds surveyed according to the most approved plan, and should the Government grant a fair proportion of the revenue, as compared with Melbourne and Geelong, towards improving public gardens, the Ballarat Botanical Gardens will, it is to be hoped, become a source of attraction and enjoyment to the inhabitants of Ballarat.

BYE-LAWS.

No. 18.—A bye-law for the conducting of public meetings of the ratepayers, and of elections of members of council, and also for regulating the proceedings at the election of chairman.—Gazetted.

ELECTIONS.

At a public meeting of the ratepayers, held at the Council Chambers on the 14th day of January, to elect three members in the place of Councillors Oddie, R. Smith, and W. C. Smith, who retired by rotation, but were eligible for re-election, the following gentlemen were proposed:—Messrs. W. C. Smith, Robert Smith, James Oddie, Bendon S. Hassell, Walter Craig, and John Smith Carver. A poll was taken on Saturday, the 15th of January, and the following gentlemen were declared duly elected members of the municipal council of Ballarat:—Messrs. Robert Smith, Bendon S. Hassell, and W. C. Smith.

MALDON MUNICIPALITY.

FIRST HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF MALDON.

IN pursuance of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, clause 43, the Municipal Council of Maldon makes the following report of its proceedings for the half-year ending 10th March, 1859.

On the 10th September, 1858, the council held its first meeting, at which the whole of the members were present. Councillors Wright and Cooper were nominated as candidates for the chair, and on the votes being taken, the result was, that councillor Wright was elected and declared to be the chairman for the ensuing year.

The council at the same meeting appointed the following committees for the year, all the members of the council being placed on each committee:—

Finance Committee. Legislative Committee.
Public Works Committee. Rate Committee.

The council, on the 17th September last, appointed Mr. Young as town clerk, at a salary of £200 per annum, who acted as such until the 24th November, when, on his resignation, Mr. Bailey was appointed to the joint offices of town clerk, municipal inspector and rate collector, at a salary of £300 per annum.

The council also appointed a town surveyor at a salary of £100 (since increased to £200) per annum; and an inspector of nuisances at £30 per annum.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been approved of by His Excellency the Governor, and are now in operation, namely:—

1. For standing orders.
2. To enforce the cleansing of chimney flues.
3. To prevent the nuisance arising from cattle wandering in the streets.
4. To prevent the erection of tents in the principal streets in the township.
5. For an assessment on the annual value of property for the year ending 10th September, 1859.
6. To impose a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound for the current year ending 10th September, 1859.
7. For the prevention of nuisances arising from the deposit of offensive matters in any street or public place.
8. For conducting public meetings and elections.
9. For the control over and cleansing of places used for slaughtering small animals.
10. To compel persons keeping swine to pave or flag their swine styes.

And the following bye-laws have been made by the council, but have not yet received the assent of His Excellency:—

11. To prevent the erection of calico buildings in certain parts of the district.
12. For the expenditure of the sum of £1000, grant-in-aid for 1858.

The council has also passed a code of regulations for the * The members whose names are thus marked were absent on two meetings owing to their being appointed on deputations.

management of the General Cemetery, but the same has not yet been approved of.

DEPUTATIONS.

There has been four deputations appointed by the council during the past half-year.

First.—To wait upon the Government with respect to a portion of the grant for 1853 being paid as early as possible. The sum of £1000 was at once granted and paid into the bank.

Second.—A deputation to wait upon the Honorable the Chief Secretary, at Maryborough, during his tour, in September last, for the purpose of inducing him to visit Maldon, when he stated that his engagements would not allow him to do so at present, but that he would endeavor to make an early visit, and that in the meantime he would give every attention to any representation in writing forwarded by the council.

Third.—A deputation to meet the municipal council of Dunolly with respect to making a direct road through Maldon to that place. This matter still remains in abeyance.

Fourth.—A deputation to Melbourne to wait upon the heads of government departments, to represent the requirements of the district, more especially with respect to the appropriation of £4200 for making the main road through the township. Owing to the application being made at so late a period in the session, it was refused, but a promise was given that the amount should be included in the next estimates.

WATER SUPPLY.

Owing to the serious inconvenience arising from the want of water, the question of a permanent water supply has employed much of the attention of the council. Advertisements offering a premium for the best mode of obtaining water were issued, but as no plan sent in was considered to meet the requirements of the district, the amount has not been awarded. Many places have been visited, and the quantity of water obtainable in twenty-four hours tested, but without arriving at any satisfactory result. The council has therefore concluded to wait until some step shall be taken by the Government with respect to a supply of water for the gold fields generally. The council, however, hopes to obtain an available supply of water in case of fire in the meantime.

Mr. David Morgan has been duly elected in the place of Mr. Wm. Fox, resigned, and Mr. David Ronayne in the place of Dr. Southee, resigned.

On the 6th January, Mr. Hy. Meadway resigned the office of chairman of the council, and Mr. Councillor W. A. Smith was elected in his place.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The bridge has been put into a state of repair, and the town hall has been nearly completed. The council congratulate the inhabitants on having so large and commodious a building, which can be applied to various public uses in advancing the progress of the town.

APPLICATIONS.

The council have urged upon the Government the necessity for making the Government roads through the town, namely, Simson street and Bucknall street, frequently during the last half-year, but without effect.

For apportioning a portion of the cemetery for the use of the Wesleyan congregation.—Granted.

For a new bridge in a central part of the town.—Not granted.

For liberty to appoint a town herdsman.—Declined.

For reserving a portion of land for depasturing impounded cattle.—Declined.

For plastering the Court House.—Granted.

For declaring this a polling place.—Granted.

For having the Government land in the neighborhood sold here instead of at Maryborough.—Not answered.

For a further grant-in-aid.—Granted.

PETITIONS.

The council have, during the last half-year, forwarded petitions to the various heads of departments, requesting that a gaol for the district might be erected here, and also for a new bridge; but although the commission appointed to consider the best site for the gaol recommended Carisbrook, the same is to be built at Maryborough. The bridge was also considered necessary, but on the vote coming before the House the same was lost by a majority of one.

DEPUTATIONS.

Deputations have attended on the heads of departments and members of the Legislature, for endeavoring to obtain for Carisbrook those privileges which the council conceive the town to be entitled to, but without effect.
