CROWN LAND EXEMPTED FROM MINING OPERATIONS.

EAGLE HAWK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend the Laws relative to the vending of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first Schedule to the said Act annexed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to declare the township of Eagle Hawk to be a place for the purpose and within the meaning of the above recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the township hereinafter named and defined shall be a place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors in quantities not less than two gallons may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first Schedule to the above recited Act, that is to say:—

EAGLE HAWK TOWNSHIP RESERVE.—Commencing at a point bearing south 60 degrees east, and distant 24 chains (more or less) from the eastern angle of allotment 17 of section 3, in the hamlet of Eagle Hawk; thence south 30 degrees west 29 chains and 25 links; thence north 60 degrees west 60 chains; thence north 30 degrees east 60 chains; thence south 60 degrees east 60 chains; and thence south 30 degrees west to the commencing point.
