VESSELS, ETC., FROM MAURITIUS RELIEVED FROM
QUARANTINE RESTRICTIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony, bearing date the fourteenth day of April now last past, it was notified that the Island of Mauritius was infected with the disease called Small Pox, and it was directed that no ships or vessels arriving in Port Phillip Bay from or having touched at Mauritius should be permitted to proceed to their destinations in Port Phillip Bay, and that no person or persons should be allowed to land from such ships or vessels, until the permission of the Health Officer at the Heads should have first been duly obtained: And whereas information has been received by the Government that the said Island of Mauritius is free from contagious disease of every kind: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this ninth day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.
