**QUEENSLIFF PUBLIC CEMETERY.**  
**REGULATIONS** made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery established at Queenscliff:—

1. All charges must be paid to the treasurer when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery, between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m. of the day previous to interment.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The usual hours for interment will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.
7. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees; a certificate of permission will be granted to the persons applying on payment of the charges set forth in the schedule marked A.
8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument, must be submitted to the trustees for their approval. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
12. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.
13. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the charge set forth in schedule A.
14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
15. Any person wilfully or wantonly destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof is liable to be punished as prescribed by the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria No. 12.
16. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
18. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.
19. No grave to be of a less depth than six feet.

FIRST HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF ARARAT, ENDING 23RD APRIL, 1859, MADE IN PURSUANCE OF THE 43RD SECTION 18 VICTORIA No. 15.

PROCLAMATION.

IN compliance with the petition of the inhabitants, Ararat was proclaimed a municipal district on the 20th day of September, 1858, under the governance of the municipal council of Ararat.

ELECTIONS.

A public meeting of the householders resident within the boundaries of the district as proclaimed, presided over by John Lamont, Esq., barrister-at-law, was held at the Bull and Mouth Hotel, Barkly street, on the 19th October, 1858, pursuant to the provisions of the beforementioned Act, at which meeting it was decided:—

1. That the municipal council should consist of seven members.

2. That their services should be unremunerated. Candidates were duly proposed and seconded, for whom a poll, upon being demanded, was taken on the 20th, when the following gentlemen were elected in the order named.

The first meeting of the council was held on the 23rd October, at which Frederick Lowe, Esq., was unanimously elected chairman.

The following committees were appointed, viz.:— Public works committee, councillors Davison, Chadwick and Wilson; Finance committee, councillors Gamson, Kerr and Chadwick.

MUNICIPAL OFFICERS.

On the 30th October, Mr. James Maclean was duly appointed town clerk and collector.

On the 24th November, Mr. Owen was duly appointed solicitor to the council.

On the 11th December, Mr. Michael Herbert was duly appointed town surveyor.

On the 26th January, 1859, Mr. John Gowers was duly appointed inspector of nuisances.

RESIGNATION AND ELECTION.

On the 12th January, Mr. Wm. Wilson resigned his seat as councillor, and on the 11th February, Mr. J. D. Smith was elected in his stead.

ASSESSMENT.

According to the returns made by the assessors, 352 house and landholders were duly assessed, the annual value of whose property amounted to £22,020 8s., which was reduced on appeal to £21,432 7s.

BYE-LAWS

The following bye-laws, passed by the council, have been assented to by His Excellency:—

No. 1. To regulate by means of standing orders the proceedings of the council.

No. 2. To compel observance to the surveyed lines of streets.

No. 3. To regulate the erection of shades or awnings, and prevent obstructions upon, over, or across the public footpaths.

No. 4. For the better prevention of fires.

No. 5. For regulating and licensing public vehicles, public carter, water drawers, and nightmen.

No. 6. For an assessment on house and land property within the district, for the year 1859.

No. 7. For imposing a rate of One shilling and threepence upon the rateable property within the district.

No. 9. For prohibiting the deposit of night soil or other offensive refuse, except at some public depot.

The following bye-laws made by the council have not yet received the assent:—

No. 8. To prevent the unauthorised cutting and felling of trees within the municipality.

No. 10. For the expenditure of the grant-in-aid.

No. 11. For the regulating of building operations and the licensing of builders thereon.

No. 12. For preventing the use of inflammable materials in the erection of buildings, and for the better prevention of fires.

No. 13. For preventing damage to footpaths and water-channels, and for the regulating the formation of private and common crossings.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The following public works have been completed:—

Grubbing stumps and filling all holes in Barkly street, from King street to View Point.

Clearing away all stumps, rubbish, &c., and filling and graveling all holes in Vincent street, Ligar street, High street, from Pleasant Creek road to View Point, three rights-of-way running south from Barkly street, one right-of-way running north, and one right-of-way from Vincent to Ligar street north of Barkly street.

Forming and metalling Barkly street from five chains east of King street to View Point, fifty-four chains.

Forming and graveling one hundred and five chains of footpaths in Barkly street.

Forming and metalling View Point street from High street to its intersection by Taylor street.

Forming and graveling fifteen chains of footpaths in View Point street.

Forming and metalling Taylor street from Barkly street to its intersection by View Point street.

Forming, graveling, and kerbing the whole of the footpaths in Taylor street.

Laying down nine hundred and ninety lineal yards kerbing of three inch red gum planking in Barkly street.

Making three hundred and thirty lineal yards of kerbing of three inch sawn planking in View Point street.

Laying down one pitched crossing at Ligar street.

Making one box culvert of three inch red gum planking across Barkly street at the gradient west of King street.

Forming three chains of Vincent street.

Forming three chains of Queen street.

Forming and metalling three chains of Ingor street.

Forming one chain and a half of Ligar street.

Making a wooden bridge at the junction of View Point with the Pleasant Creek road.

Forming six chains of footpaths in Vincent street.

Forming six chains of footpaths in Queen street.

The following contracts are entered into:—  
 For fencing the present cemetery.  
 For making twenty-two chains of road to Commissioner's Hill, New Rush.  
 For pitching with bluestone the water channels of Barkly street, from Vincent street to Taylor street.  
 For erecting wooden council chambers.

## MISCELLANEOUS.

In consequence of the many written applications the council had made to Government without any satisfactory result, they, on the 18th March, appointed the chairman and councillor Davison a deputation to wait on and bring before the notice of the Government some of the most urgent requirements of the district. They are glad to be able to report that the Government considered their requests so reasonable and necessary, as to grant them in every instance.

The following are some of the most important items:—

1. That twenty acres would be granted for a cemetery.
2. That ten acres would be granted for a manure depot.
3. That sites would be granted for reservoirs.
4. That Ararat would be proclaimed a separate survey district, and a district surveyor appointed.
5. That the building of the gaol at Ararat would be proceeded with as soon as the necessary plans and specifications had been prepared.
6. That Ararat may, if required, be proclaimed a separate road district.
7. That £10,000, the third of the sum voted for Ararat, Warrambool, and Belfast, will be appropriated where directed by this council.
8. That a quarry would be granted for municipal purposes.

For a proportion of the amount of supplementary aid voted by the honorable the Legislative Assembly to municipalities, £2459 15s.—Granted.

A petition addressed to His Excellency the Governor, praying that an amount may be placed on the Estimates every year for the purpose of rewarding individuals who have been instrumental in saving human life.—Under consideration.

A memorial to His Excellency the Governor and Executive Council, for the chairman to act as a justice of the peace for the territory of the colony of Victoria.—Refused.

A memorial to the Honorable the Legislative Assembly was presented by George Board, Esq., M.L.A., requesting that the scheme for the better supplying the town of Geelong and suburbs with water, as recommended by the select committee appointed by the Honorable the Legislative Assembly, may be supported.

A deputation, consisting of the chairmen and councillor Scott, waited on the Treasurer to ascertain the amount of supplementary aid this council would receive during the present year.

A deputation, consisting of the chairman and councillor Garrett, waited on the Attorney General respecting the decisions of the police magistrate on certain cases brought before him by the town inspector, under the council's bye-laws, the police magistrate having considered such bye-laws illegal.

A conference was held by the chairmen of the South Barwon and Newtown and Chilwell municipalities, with the mayor of Geelong, for the purpose of reducing the present amount paid for licenses by carters, and to establish one uniform system of fees and registration by the three councils.

Bye-law No. 8.—For regulating the laying of drains and opening footpaths.

A bye law for regulating the killing and sale of butchers' meat was refused as *ultra vires*.
