NOTICE TO POUNDKEEPERS.

IT is pointed out for the guidance of Poundkeepers that no claim preferred by persons impounding cattle for damages in excess of the gazetted rates allowed by the Governor can be legally received or entertained by the poundkeeper.

Persons impounding cattle who claim damages in excess of the gazetted rates are to be informed that, under the 32 clause of the Impounding Act, they must elect either to claim the authorised rates only, or to sue the owner of the cattle by which the trespass has been committed for the special damage claimed.

SALE OF SPIRITS, ETC., BY WHOLESALE, AT AVENEL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend the laws relative to the vending of fermented and spirituous liquors*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to declare the township of Avenel to be a place for the purpose and within the meaning of the above recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the township hereinafter named and defined shall be a place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors in quantities not less than two gallons may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the above recited Act, that is to say:—

AVENEL TOWNSHIP RESERVE.—Commencing at the north-east corner of the township, near its intersection with the Sydney road; thence bearing west 113 chains 15 links; thence south and crossing Hughes's Creek 113 chains 15 links; thence bearing east and crossing Hughes's Creek 113 chains 15 links; and thence bearing north 113 chains 15 links to the point of commencement.

WATSON'S CREEK SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors and of refreshments in certain districts*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called a Special Licensing District, and to define the boundaries of such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the sixteenth day of January, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, the Watson's Creek Special Licensing District was proclaimed and defined: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the limits and boundaries of the said district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby annul the limits and boundaries specified in the said Proclamation; and I do hereby declare that the said district called and known as "The Watson's Creek Special Licensing District," shall comprise the piece or portion of the said colony hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Commencing at the junction of Arthur's Creek and the Sugar Loaf Creek; thence southwards by Arthur's Creek to the junction of a small creek at the south-western angle of section 8, parish unnamed; thence by a line south-easterly to the north-western angle of section xix., parish of Nillumbik; thence by a line south to the Mullum-mullum Creek; thence by the Mullum-mullum Creek and the Dividing Range to the western boundary of the parish of Mooroolbark; thence south to the south-western angle of the reserved section xi. in the said parish; thence by a line east to the Dividing Range; thence by the Dividing Range to the summit of Corranworabul; thence by the crest of the Dandenong Ranges, and by the Dividing Range forming part of the southern basin of the River Yarra to the most western source of Hoddle's Creek; thence north-westerly by the range separating the waters flowing to Hoddle's Creek and the Woori Yaloak, and by a line north to the River Yarra; thence by the River Yarra to View Hill Creek; thence by View Hill Creek to a point due east of the junction of Arthur's Creek and the Sugar Loaf Creek; and thence by a line bearing west to the commencing point aforesaid.

3. The funeral must take place punctually at the appointed hour.
4. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or whom they may appoint.
5. All vaults, graves, monuments, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owners.
6. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
7. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for approval.
8. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
9. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees.
10. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined on the payment of the charges according to schedule A.
11. Orders for interment to be given to the sexton or other person appointed by the trustees, between sunrise and sunset on the previous day.
12. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the orders.
13. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other months, except on Sundays, when the hours will be from Eight a.m. to Ten a.m., and from Three p.m. to Five p.m.
14. If an interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the consent in writing of the proprietor must be left with the orders.
15. A part or the whole of the charges for the burial of any person will be remitted on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.
16. All persons destroying the fences, or in any manner injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
17. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

BALLAARAT MINING DISTRICT.

BYE LAW IX.—WATER REGULATIONS OF THE MINING BOARD OF BALLAARAT.—[9th May, 1859.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ballaarat, begun and holden at Ballaarat, in the said district, on the 9th day of May, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. Any person or persons possessing a miner's right, applying to divert water, and to cut a race for the conveyance of water for mining purposes, shall conditionally register themselves with the district mining surveyor or registrar, and shall furnish a plan and report in writing to the warden stating the proposed course of the race for the conveyance of the water, the usual name of the river, creek, or other source from which it is intended to divert the water, particularising the exact spot whence such diversion is to be made, the number of sluiceways they require, and whether it is proposed to construct one or more dams, and if so, naming their situation; and all persons so diverting water, cutting races, and erecting dams, shall be subject to the following conditions:—

2. A notice in writing shall be posted and kept legible at the place from which it is intended to divert the water, also, at intervals not exceeding half a mile along the proposed course of the race to be cut for the conveyance of the water, and at such places where it is proposed to erect dams, also at the office of the district surveyor or registrar, such notice to state the name or names and address in full of the person or persons who may have been conditionally registered for the diversion of such water, cutting such race, number of sluiceways, and erection of such dams, the said notices to be kept posted and legible for at least eight (8) days after having been conditionally registered for the same; and also a copy of the aforesaid notice must be inserted at least eight (8) clear days in one of the newspapers circulating in this mining board district before the commencement of any operations; and at the expiration of the said eight (8) days, should there be no valid objection, persons shall, upon the recommendation of the warden, be finally registered for any or all of the aforesaid privileges by the district mining surveyor or registrar, in a book kept for that purpose.

3. Any person having any objection to the diversion of any water, cutting a race, or the erection of dams, shall, within eight (8) days from the date of the notices as aforesaid, give notice of such objection in writing to the warden, to the applicant personally, or at his address as given in the notice posted, and to the surveyor or registrar, who shall withhold final registration until the warden shall have decided whether the parties shall be finally registered or not.

4. Persons diverting water for mining purposes shall use a gauge or measurement, and the gauge or measurement which shall be considered a sluichead shall be such a quantity of water as will pass through an aperture sixteen (16) inches wide and one (1) inch deep, with a pressure not to exceed six (6) inches, the gate or hatch to be placed in the head of the race, at the source from which the water is drawn, and the quantity of water allowed shall be in accordance with the number of men employed or amount of machinery used; and all water rights shall be founded on such measurement and regulation.

5. The minimum number of men to be employed shall be in the proportion of—

Number of Men.	---	Number of Sluicheads of water.

And in accordance with the following table for machinery:—

WATERWHEELS.

At the rate of half a sluichead for every twenty-five (25) feet measurement, thus multiplying the diameter of the wheel by the width and depth of the buckets.

Example.—Suppose a waterwheel 10 feet in diameter, width of buckets 2 feet 6 inches, depth of buckets 1 foot—

Diameter of wheel. Width of buckets. Depth of buckets.
10 feet × 2 feet 6 inches × 1 foot = 25 feet

And so on in like proportion for every additional twenty-five feet or fractional part thereof.

6. Any person or persons cutting a race for the conveyance of water for mining purposes shall be entitled to a width of ten (10) feet (measuring from the centre) on each side of the race, and should at any time any portion of the ground be required for mining it may be taken up for that purpose by obtaining a written authority from the district mining surveyor or registrar, and making and leaving the race equally available for the conveyance of water as it was previous to such ground being so taken up; and it shall be lawful at any time for any district surveyor or registrar to impose such conditions upon the person or persons so taking up such ground as he may deem necessary for the protection of such race.

7. Any person or persons cutting a race across roads or thoroughfares shall construct and keep in repair good and substantial and suitable crossings over the said race, and shall also construct suitable approaches, not less than six (6) feet in length, to said crossings on either side of said race; and any person or persons opening up new roads or thoroughfares across any race shall be at liberty to construct and keep in repair suitable crossings over and approaches (as above) to the same; provided such roads, thoroughfares, and crossings, shall not interfere with the security of the race.

8. No person shall be allowed to retain possession of any of the privileges herein mentioned unless he shall have been finally registered for the same in accordance with these regulations; and in all river beds and main creeks from which water is diverted for mining purposes there shall at all times be left running at least one sluichead of water for general use; and in all tributary creeks from which water is diverted for mining purposes there shall be left running in its natural channel such a quantity of water (and at such times) as the warden may deem absolutely necessary for general use, the maximum quantity not to exceed half a sluichead.

9. Persons shall take precedence of water rights or privileges in the order in which they are registered for the same; and if at any time the supply of water is insufficient, the party lastly registered shall cease to possess such right during such deficiency of water as against an antecedent registration; but in the event of there being at any time any waste or flood water, persons shall be allowed to construct dams for the purpose of conserving the same, provided no injury be done thereby to the holders of previous rights.

10. Any person holding water privileges under this bye-law shall not be allowed to run any water to waste, but shall shut off the same at all times when not using it for mining purposes.

11. Persons already in possession of water privileges shall retain the same, provided that within three (3) calendar months after these regulations shall have become a bye-law they shall apply to the district mining surveyor or registrar for the purpose

of being registered for the same, and such persons shall, after having been duly registered, take precedence according to the date and in the order in which such privileges have been originally obtained.

12. *Interpretation clause.*—In the interpretation of this bye-law nothing herein contained shall be construed to interfere with, set aside, or curtail existing rights and privileges possessed by any person or persons previous to the 23rd day of May, 1859, but that such privileges shall be and are hereby confirmed; provided that the owners of such rights and privileges shall be registered for the same as provided by the eleventh section of this bye-law; and further, that nothing herein contained shall preclude any person or persons from selling or otherwise disposing of any water privileges, or any portion thereof, which he or they may be in possession of previous to the 23rd day of May, 1859, or shall thereafter become possessed of, but the same, or any portion thereof may be sold or otherwise disposed of for mining purposes; provided that the number of men for which any such privileges have been obtained shall be employed in connection therewith.

MARYBOROUGH MUNICIPALITY.

FOURTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MARYBOROUGH MUNICIPAL COUNCIL, ENDING 4TH MAY, 1859.

AS the revenue of the municipality during the past half year has been solely derived from the rates collected during that period, the municipal council have necessarily been prevented from proceeding so extensively as they could have desired with the general public works and improvements of the district.

But although prudence has compelled the council to a great extent to limit their operations and expenditure, they have been enabled to maintain the streets, to form and kerb the footpaths, as well as partially to institute an improved system of drainage.

Those improvements which are more urgently demanded by the growing requirements of certain parts of the town will also receive immediate attention.

ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS.

Twenty-three general meetings and five special meetings (irrespective of committee meetings) have been held, at which the attendance of members was as follows:—

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been passed by the council:—

14. For levying a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current year.

15. For the management of the public cemetery established at Maryborough.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The following public works have been completed, or are in progress:—

1. Forming, gravelling, and kerbing portion of footpaths in High street.

2. Building stone culvert under High street, at Inkerman street.

3. Building stone culverts in Clarendon street and Hospital street, and pitching dish drain in Clarendon street.

4. Kerbing and forming part of footpaths in Clarendon street.

5. Forming and gravelling portion of footpaths in Hospital street.

6. Enclosing town hall reserve.

7. Erecting gates at old and new cemeteries.

8. Repairing road to Back Creek, and maintaining roads and crossings over the leads.

9. Fixing posts for defining municipal boundaries.

10. The completion of the fencing of the old and new cemeteries.

GAOL AND CIRCUIT COURT.

The Government, after a personal inspection of the district, decided upon this place as the most fitting town for the establishment of a circuit court, and having placed on the estimates the sum of £10,000 for the erection of a gaol in Maryborough, the opposition manifested by neighboring townships, and the interest brought to bear on the mind of the Government and Legislative Assembly to induce a transfer of the money, or a postponement of the vote, rendered it imperative that certain members of the council, with others resident in the district, should proceed to Melbourne for the purpose of resisting this attempt by furnishing the Government and the House with correct statistics and data in support of their claims.

The council, while congratulating the ratepayers on their complete success, have to regret, on the score of expense, that the adoption of such measures for the maintenance of their just rights should have been forced upon them.

WATER SUPPLY.

No plan has yet been devised by the Government for the supply of the gold fields with water, but the council, under a deep conviction of the importance of this question, have taken steps to ascertain the readiest mode of supplying this deficiency.

An engineer was recently despatched by the Government to test the practicability of Mr. English's scheme for bringing water from the Bullarook Creek.

This report is to the effect, "that probably no better line could be found for obtaining a supply of water by gravitation than the one selected by Mr. English," but no estimate of the cost is given.

A plan for the formation of dams to retain storm water has been favorably reported on by a committee appointed to suggest the most suitable sites, and a careful survey is recommended. This is at present under consideration of the council.
