WILFUL MURDER.

TWO HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

HEREAS at about Ten o'clock on the night of Wednesday, the 1st of June instant, the Store of Thomas McElligott, situate at Ironbark Gully, in the district of Sandhurst, was entered by three Chinamen, armed with a sword and a butcher's knife, who attacked the said Thomas McElligott and his wife, and inflicted wounds upon them with intent to murder them: And whereas the said Thomas McElligott has since died from the effects of such wounds: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Two hundred pounds will be paid for such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the Offenders.

PARTICULARS.

The Murderers left behind them in the Store of the deceased the sword and a cabbage-tree hat, and shortly afterwards the butcher's knife was found covered with blood in the tent of a Chinaman, whose name and description are as follow:-

Chew A Keiz, about 25 or 30 years of age, middle-sized, stout, full round face, and black hair; dressed in a Chinese jumper, Bedford cord trousers, and black billycock hat.
