## MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF FOOTSCRAY.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the householders and landowners at Footscray, in the county of Bourke, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF FOOTSCRAY.—Commencing at the intersection of the Stony Creek and the eastern boundary of section ix., in the parish of Cut-paw-paw, being the north-western angle of the municipal district of Williamstown; thence south to the south-eastern angle of the said section; thence west to the south-western angle of the aforesaid section; thence north to the south side of a street passing through section xvi. in the parish of Cut-paw-paw, called and known as Suffolk street; thence east by the south side of the said street to a street called and known as Church street; thence north-east and east by the south-eastern and southern sides of the last named street to the eastern boundary of the aforesaid section xvi.; thence north to the north-western angle of section xv., in the parish of Cut-paw-paw; thence east to the Mari-

byrnong or Saltwater River; thence southerly by that river to the south side of the Melbourne and Mount Alexander Railway; thence by a line to the north-eastern angle of the town reserve of Footscray; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of the said town reserve to the western bank of the Yarra Yarra River; and thence by the said river and the Stony Creek to the commencing point.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Footscray."

### PROPOSED ROAD.

#### MAIN GIPPS LAND ROAD.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a road proposed to be made by the Board of Land and Works (being a deviation on the Main Gipps Land road, near Berwick), together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the name of the owner and occupier thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited at the Surveyor General's Office, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

MAIN GIPPS LAND ROAD.—DESCRIPTION OF A PIECE OF LAND REQUIRED FOR ROAD PURPOSES NEAR BERWICK.—The piece of land required for a deviation of the Main Gipps Land road is a part of portion number nineteen, in the parish of Berwick, in the county of Mornington; it is bounded by a line commencing at the north-east corner of portion number nineteen, and running thence due west three thousand three hundred links; thence by a circular curve line, having a radius of twelve chains, running in a south-easterly direction one thousand and eight links; and thence by a line running in a north-easterly direction two thousand three hundred and eighty-five links to the commencing point.

It is the property of Robert Allan, Esq., and contains five acres two roods and twenty-seven perches, the estimated value of which, at Ten pounds (£10) per acre, is Fifty-six pounds thirteen shillings and ninepence: the cost of fencing is estimated at £25 2s.

All persons affected by the proposed road are requested to set forth in writing, addressed to the President of the Board of Lands and Works, Office of Roads and Bridges, Melbourne, within forty days from the first publication of this notice, any well-grounded objections that they may have to the said road, failing which they will be thereafter precluded from making any such objections or claiming any compensation whatsoever.

MADDINGLEY PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery established at Maddingley, parish of Parwan, county of Grant:—

1. The burial ground will be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.
2. All charges must be paid when the orders are given.
3. A plan of the cemetery, and a register, will be kept, and may be inspected at the charges set out in schedule A. The register of said grounds is kept by the secretary.
4. By the 8th section of Act any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.
5. Applications for such permission to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying on payment of the charges in schedule A.
6. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person died in indigent circumstances, and that the relations of the deceased are unable to pay the charges.
7. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will require to construct them under the direction of the trustees, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and fences, to be kept in repair at the expense of the owners.
9. Every coffin in a vault or bricked grave to be cemented closely and covered by a slab of stone or iron, to the satisfaction of the trustees.
10. The plans of all monuments, tombstones, and fences, must be submitted to the trustees for approval.
11. Any person wantonly and wilfully destroying or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, fence, tree, or plant, in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof is liable to be punished by the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria No. 12.
12. Sunday interments to be charged double unless the order is accompanied with a certificate from a medical practitioner stating that such is the work of necessity.
13. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alterations from time to time in the charges and regulations.

**MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.**

**BYE-LAW No. 19.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE FURTHER REGULATION OF THE SANDHURST GENERAL MARKET.**

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18th Victoria No 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings, the collection of their rates, regulating the killing and sale of butchers' meat, the regulation of markets, market dues, fairs, and sales, the restraining of noisome and offensive trades, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: And whereas by a bye-law of the municipality of Sandhurst numbered 11, intituled, a bye-law for the regulation of the Sandhurst General Market, and assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, according to the Act of Council in that case made and provided, it was amongst other things enacted, that the portion of the market between Mundy street and Bull street shall be appropriated for the sale of fruit, vegetables, esculent roots, poultry, eggs, butter, and cheese; and the portion between Bull street and Williamson street for the sale of hay, corn, straw, green fodder, and firewood; and that such produce specified and named in the annexed schedule only shall be sold or exposed for sale in the market and subject nevertheless to the payments of such tolls and dues as are now made and expressed, and shall from time hereafter be made and approved of by the municipal council: And whereas no penalty for the infringement of such portion of the said bye-law was provided by the same: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Sandhurst, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of the colony of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act:

That if any person shall sell or offer or expose for sale any fruit, vegetable, esculent roots, butter, cheese, hay, corn, straw, fodder, firewood, or charcoal, or other produce specified and named in the schedule annexed to the aforesaid bye-law No. 11, in any place within the municipality of Sandhurst other than in such place as is appointed respectively for the sale thereof by the aforesaid bye-law, shall on conviction thereof, before any two or more justices of the peace having jurisdiction within the said municipal district, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:

Provided, always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to extend to prevent any person selling or exposing for sale any of the articles aforesaid in his or her dwelling house or shop within the municipal district of Sandhurst.

**BYE-LAW No. 34.—FOR REGULATING THE KILLING AND SALE OF BUTCHERS' MEAT, AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SLAUGHTER-HOUSES UNDER CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS, WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.**

WHEREAS by an Act of 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act to make bye-laws for the regulating the killing and sale of butchers' meat, and the establishment of slaughter-houses, the restraining noisome and offensive trades, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Williamstown, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, that before any premises within this municipal district shall be licensed as a place where butchers' meat may lawfully be slaughtered and sold, the owner or occupier shall produce to the council a certificate under the hand of the health officer, declaring the premises to be so situate as not injuriously to affect the health of the neighborhood, and shall further satisfy the council that the premises proposed to be

licensed have been properly paved and fitted up: that every premises licensed as a place where butchers' meat may be slaughtered or sold should be provided with tubs, bins, or other vessels, in which shall be deposited all blood, offal, skins, or other offensive matter; and every such premises shall be cleared of such blood, offal, or other offensive matter, and the yards, floors, implements, and utensils thereof, be washed and cleansed at least once in every twenty-four hours, and be at all times open to the inspection of the council or any person authorized by them: that no animal weighing more than 200 pounds shall be slaughtered on any premises where butchers' meat is sold in less quantities than sides or quarters of an animal: that henceforth any person found slaughtering or selling butchers' meat on unlicensed premises, or who shall sell any tainted or unwholesome butchers' meat for human food, or who knowingly shall commit a breach of any of the provisions of this bye-law, shall on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace be liable to be fined in any sum not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling.

**BYE-LAW No. 41.—TO ALTER AND AMEND CLAUSES NOS. 2 AND 9 OF THE BYE-LAW No. 36 OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF WILLIAMSTOWN, AND FOR INTRODUCING NEW CLAUSES THEREIN.**

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary to alter and amend clauses Nos. 2 and 9 of the aforesaid bye-law of the municipal council of Williamstown, "to regulate the conducting of the election of members of the municipal council:" Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the said council, in conformity with the 18th clause of the said recited bye-law, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, pursuant to the 18 Victoria No. 15, section 33, &c.—

1. That the clause No. 2 shall be and is hereby repealed, and the following clause substituted:—

If at any election the chairman of the municipal council for the time being shall be a candidate for re-election, or shall be incapacitated from presiding at such election either from illness, absence from the district, or any other cause, it shall be competent for the council to appoint some one of themselves to act as chairman for the purpose of carrying out such election; and it shall be lawful for the chairman so elected to appoint, under his hand and seal, such and so many persons as to him may seem necessary to act as deputy chairman or chairmen, poll clerk or poll clerks, in such and so many places within the municipal district as may have been appointed by the council as the polling place or places.

2. That in clause No. 9, the words, "amongst the records of the council" shall be and are hereby repealed, and the following added thereto:—For a period of fourteen days, after which they shall be destroyed by the town clerk, in the presence of the chairman, deputy chairman, officers of the election, and scrutineers, or of such and so many of them as may desire to be present, three days' notice of the time and place having been given in a local newspaper, or in its absence, in one or more newspapers published in Melbourne; and a certificate setting forth the names of the successful candidates, and the number of votes recorded for each of them, shall be prepared and signed by the chairman and others the officers of the election and the scrutineers, and shall be safely preserved amongst the records of the council.

3. That no person shall be permitted to vote at any municipal election who shall not have paid all the rates due on any property or properties, in respect of which he shall have been liable to be rated in the municipal district previous to the commencement of a term of four months preceding any such election.
