CAULFIELD ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the colony, bearing date the fifteenth day of October, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, the boundaries of "The Caulfield Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable to vary and alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the boundaries specified in the said Proclamation, and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the boundaries of the said Caulfield road district shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the south side of the Main Dandenong road, being 50 links west of the north-western angle of the Cemetery Reserve in the parish of Prahran; thence on the west by the centre line of a Government road bearing south to the Main Brighton road; thence south-easterly by the Main Brighton road to the northern boundary of the parish of Moorabbin; thence east by the northern boundary of the said parish of Moorabbin to the parish of Mulgrave; thence north by the western boundary of the said parish of Mulgrave to the Main Dandenong road; and thence north-westerly by the said Main Dandenong road to the commencing point.

TOLLS ON THE MOUNT DUNEED ROAD WITHIN THE BARRARBOOL ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare the rates of tolls to be collected by any district road board, as therein mentioned: And whereas the Barrarbool District Road Board deem it advisable that money should be raised by tolls on the Mount Duneed road, within their district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and proclaim that it shall be lawful for the Barrarbool District Road Board to direct tolls to be paid for all animals and vehicles

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passing or repassing through or by any toll-bars, toll-gates, or toll-houses, now or hereafter erected and built by the said board in and upon the Mount Duneed road within the said Barrarbool Road District, at rates not exceeding the rates hereinafter declared, that is to say:—

NOTICE TO POUNDKEEPERS.

IT is pointed out for the guidance of Poundkeepers that no claim preferred by persons impounding cattle for damages in excess of the gazetted rates allowed by the Governor can be legally received or entertained by the poundkeeper.

Persons impounding cattle who claim damages in excess of the gazetted rates are to be informed that, under the 32 clause of the Impounding Act, they must elect either to claim the authorised rates only, or to sue the owner of the cattle by which the trespass has been committed for the special damage claimed.

MUNICIPALITY OF AVOCA.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF AVOCA.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Avoca, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of this colony, the proceedings and business of the said council shall be conducted according to the following regulations, to be called the standing orders of the said council, that is to say:—

CHAP. I.—*Order of Proceedings.*

1. That the sittings of this council shall on all ordinary occasions be open to the public, but any councillor may require the exclusion of strangers while the sense of the council is taken as to whether the question proposed shall be discussed with closed doors.
2. No business shall be transacted without a quorum; and if at the expiration of thirty minutes after the time of meeting there is no quorum, the meeting shall be adjourned, and such circumstance and the names of the members present recorded in the minutes.
3. The first business of each meeting of the council shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting; and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to the accuracy thereof.
4. At all meetings of the council the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions, and the bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of all motions.
5. On the presentation of petitions no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only question that may be entertained on presentation shall be that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.
6. No motion shall be decided on at any meeting of the council unless notice in writing, signed by the councillor proposing the same, shall have been given at the previous meeting of the council; nor shall any reports of committees be decided on unless similar notice be given, unless in committee of the whole council, or the whole council be present.
7. The order of the day shall include all business of which due notice has been given, and all matters arising out of former meetings of the council.
8. Notices of motion shall come on after the order of the day, when only the member giving notice may speak, and only in explanation of the motion.
9. Any motion entered on the notice paper, and the councillor having given notice of the same being absent, and no other councillor deputed to bring forward such motion when the business is called in order, such motion shall be struck out of the paper.
10. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be (*pro hac vice*) a member of such committee.
11. All communications intended for the council shall be addressed to the town clerk, and all petitions and memorials shall be addressed to the chairman and council under cover to the town clerk.
12. No bye-law shall be adopted at any meeting without due notice, as in cases of motion, and a copy of such bye-law shall in the interim remain open in the town clerk's office for the inspection of ratepayers free of charge.

CHAP. II.—*Order of Debate.*

1. Any member of council proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the chairman, and no member when speaking shall be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down, and the member calling to order shall be heard thereon, and the question of order decided before the subject is resumed or any other business entered upon.
2. Any councillor proposing a motion or amendment shall put it in form in writing, and shall sign and deliver the same to the town clerk, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the council.
3. Any councillor proposing a motion or amendment shall state the nature of it before addressing the council thereon.
4. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation or in reply, as the mover of any original motion or amendment, and after such explanation or reply the question shall be forthwith put to the vote.
5. If more than one member rise at one time, the chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to precedence.
6. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives, and all personal reflections shall be deemed highly disorderly.
7. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively, or which may be construed as offensive to any other member, shall, if required by the council,

withdraw such expression, and make an apology satisfactory to the council, under a penalty if he refuse or neglect to do so before the rising of the council, of not more than Five pounds; the amount of the fine to be fixed by the council.

8. Any member may require the town clerk to take down any particular words used by a member immediately on the same being used.

9. The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final.

10. The chairman shall arise when addressing the council in discussion of any question.

11. Any councillor may require the production of any of the documents of the council relating to the subject of discussion.

12. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, and upon the adoption of any amendment the original motion shall be held to be rejected, and the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

13. The chairman shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative, and the votes of all the members shall be entered on the minutes.

14. The council shall vote by show of hands, except in cases of election.

15. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed before the question of adjournment be again entertained; but if the motion of adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

16. Any member may enter his protest against any resolution of the council, provided such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the council—notice, however, of such intention must be given on the adoption of the resolution: and a notice in writing, signed by the protesting member, and specifying his reasons for so protesting, must be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose in the town clerk's office, the same to be considered as part of the minutes.

17. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole council shall have been duly made for that purpose, and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the council which shall have been negatived by the council shall be again entertained during the same municipal year.

CHAP. III.—*Elections.*

1. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until four clear days notice shall have been given in one or more local newspaper inviting applications from candidates, and the salary for such office shall in all cases be fixed for the municipal year before proceeding to such election.

2. No member or officer of the council shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any contract or work to be performed or done for the council; and in all cases in which surety for the due and faithful performance of any duty, contract, or work is required, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

3. At all such elections, and on all occasions of taking tenders or contracts, the voting of the council shall be on cards or paper to be provided for the purpose, on which each councillor shall write the name of the party or candidate he supports, and sign his own name thereto. No other votes shall be taken, and the town clerk shall preserve the same as a record. On the votes being so taken, the chairman shall declare the result of such voting.

CHAP. IV.—*Miscellaneous Regulations.*

1. Every application for appointment or tender for work shall be delivered, sealed, and endorsed outside, "Application," or "Tender," stating also the office or work applied or tendered for, and no application or tender shall be received after the time specified in any advertisement inviting the same, and the number received shall be declared by the town clerk before they are opened.

2. All contracts, bonds, specifications, or other documents relative to works to be done by or for the municipal council, shall be brought up and approved by the council before they be signed and executed.

3. For the consideration of any bye-law, or for the raising or appropriating of money, or for the objects contemplated in the standing order, No. 17, chap. II., it shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any such subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given in the notice paper for the day, or notice of motion for which such call was made, is set down for consideration; and any member not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question, or any amendment thereon, whether of adjournment or otherwise, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten shil-

lings, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council.

4. Any one or more of the standing orders of the council, except No. 17, chap. II., or No. 1, chap. IV., may be suspended *pro tempore* in case of emergency, provided that the majority present vote it necessary.

The foregoing By-law, No. 1, made by the municipal council of Avoca, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

RICHMOND MUNICIPALITY.

THE SIXTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT OR STATEMENT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF RICHMOND FOR SIX MONTHS FROM THE 2ND DAY OF MAY, 1859.

THE council have maintained a correspondence with the various departments of the Government on important public questions affecting the interests of the municipality, with the following results:—

Arrangements have been made with the Government that the sum of £1000 be paid by the Government for the kerbing and channelling of the western portion of Hoddle street, between the Napier Hotel and the Yarra; that a moiety of the tolls received at the Punt be paid to the council; that the council undertake the sole maintenance of that street from the Yarra to the Napier Hotel, and the eastern moiety from the Bridge road to Victoria street east.

That the southern portion of Hoddle street, known as the Punt road, be increased in breadth by 33 feet.—Under consideration.

That Church street Bridge be proclaimed a free bridge.—Refused.

That land be granted at Kew as a cemetery for Richmond.—Under consideration.

That land abutting on Church street north be granted as a site for a market.—Under consideration.

That the revenue received from the pumps on the banks of the Yarra be granted to the council.—Declined.

That the projected sale of land in the Survey Paddock be withdrawn.—Granted.

That all moneys received from the Quarries be paid to the council, in order to keep the roads leading to the Quarries in repair.—Declined.

That a site be granted in the Richmond Paddock for the erection of public baths and washhouses.—Site to be granted when plans and specifications are approved of.

That Swan street east be proclaimed as far as the River Yarra.—Declined.

That the north bank of the Yarra be preserved by piles.—Under consideration.

That the sum of £436 10s. 3d. be appropriated for widening the north-western portion of the Bridge road.—Promised.

That a sum be placed on the Estimates for the ensuing year for the purchase of land necessary to the improvement of Victoria street east.—Promised.

MISCELLANEOUS.

13. Petitions and memorials have been presented to the council on various local subjects.

Deputations from the council have waited on the heads of the different departments, urging on them the necessity of aiding in the various improvements necessary in the district.

An election was held in the month of January, caused by the resignation of Henry Johnson and Thomas Lambert, when Edward Hill and Hutton Oddy were returned.

At the annual election, held on the 25th day of April, councillors Thomas Taylor, George Hardy, and Daniel Stodart Campbell were elected to fill the vacancies caused by the retirement, through fluxion of time, of councillors Campbell, Hill, and Oddy.

The Honorable George Coppin was elected chairman for the current year.

The public works committee consists of D. S. Campbell, Esq., M.L.A., chairman; councillors Egan, Burnley, Johnson, Taylor, and Hardy.

The finance and legislative committees consist of the Honorable George Coppin, chairman; councillors Campbell, Johnson, and Taylor.

The auditors for the last half-year were Messrs. Nicholls and Little.
