RESERVATION OF LANDS AT BEECHWORTH.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor in Council, in exercise of the power vested in him by the Act for regulating the sale of Crown Lands, and by the regulations made thereunder, has reserved the undermentioned pieces or portions of land at Beechworth, viz:—

An area of one hundred acres for a reservoir, and another area of four thousand five hundred acres to form a gathering ground for feeding such reservoir, as delineated on plans deposited at the Surveyor General's Office, Melbourne.

Such areas are accordingly reserved from mining operations within the meaning of the 4th clause of the Gold Fields Act, 21 Victoria No. 32, save and except as to all existing privileges of miners or other persons.

LAND RESERVED AT SMYTHESDALE.

**DESCRIPTION OF THE SITE (4A. 2H. 21P.) APPROPRIATED FOR A HAY, CORN, AND GENERAL MARKET.**—Commencing on the east bank of the River Yarrowee, thence bounded on the north by a road 1 chain wide, bearing east 7 chains 2 links to a point 2 chains 50 links south of Mair street; thence south 1 chain;

thence by a road 1 chain wide, bearing east 3 chains 50 links to a point 3 chains 50 links west of Peel street; thence by a road 1 chain wide, bearing south 4 chains; thence on the south by a street 1 chain wide, bearing west 11 chains 2 links to the east bank of the said River Yarrowee; and thence by that river to the commencing point.
