N in quantities of not less than two gallons, upon which the
duty has been paid, unless registered in accordance with the
Acts 13 Victoria No. 26, and 20 Victoria No. 4, are liable to a
fine of £30.

Certificates of Registration will be granted by the clerk of
the bench at the place nearest to the residence of such dealer
at which a Court of Petty Sessions is established, within a
district duly proclaimed under the Act, or at the office of the
Chief Inspector of Distilleries, at the Immigration office, King
street; and any person who shall not have duly paid the legal
fees of registration into the Treasury, or to a receiver of
revenue, will be deemed or taken to be a person not registered
within the meaning of the Act.

NOTICE TO ROAD CONTRACTORS.

FURTHER REGULATIONS PASSED BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND
WORKS.

THE Board of Land and Works orders that from and after
the 1st July next, contractors tendering for works under
the Department of Roads and Bridges be required to attend the
opening of the tenders in the Board-room, at the Crown Lands
Office, either personally or by an authorised agent.

Immediately upon the conditional acceptance of a tender by
the Board, the accepted tenderer or his agent shall pay in cash
a preliminary deposit of £10 when the amount of the contract
is under £1000; or £25 when the amount of the contract ex-
ceeds £1000; such sum to be absolutely forfeited in the event
of his not entering into the requisite contract agreement within
one week.

Contractors will also be required to make such alterations in
the schedules to their tenders (not affecting the bulked sum in
the body thereof) as may be necessary to bring them into con-
formity with the specification and general conditions of the
contract, and as may be required by the Inspector-General of
Roads, failing which such deposit to be in like manner forfeited.

A letter, embodying the abovenamed condition, to be signed
by the contractor when paying the amount of the deposit.

POSTAGE STAMPS.

EVERY Officer in the department of the Attorney General,
in the receipt of postage stamps, is expected to keep an
account of them in the following form, namely:—

When an officer is removed from any station he is to balance
his account, and to take care that the quantity handed over to
his successor is correct.

In like manner the officer taking charge is to satisfy himself
that the balance he receives agrees in all respects with that
appearing in the account; and, should any discrepancies be
afterwards discovered, he will be held responsible.

The officer retiring and his successor should go through the
account together, and certify conjointly to its correctness.

All requisitions for postage stamps must be transmitted to
these offices for approval, and should show the balance in hand
on a certain day.

LICENSES FOR OTHER THAN PASTORAL PURPOSES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend the laws relative to the vending of fermented and spirituous liquors*, it was amongst

other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to declare the locality known as "The Reedy Creek Gold Field" to be a district for the purpose and within the meaning of the above recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter named and defined shall be a district wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors in quantities not less than two gallons may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the above recited Act, that is to say:—

REEDY CREEK GOLD FIELD.—Commencing at the most western source of Mollison's Creek in the Great Dividing Range; thence by Mollison's Creek and the Sugar Loaf Creek to a point due west of the junction of the Dabyminga Creek and the River Goulburn; thence east to the said River Goulburn; thence by the River Goulburn to the Muddy Creek; thence by the Muddy Creek to the Great Dividing Range; and thence westward by the Great Dividing Range to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of June, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MUNICIPALITY OF MALDON.

BYE-LAW No. 13.—TO CAUSE PROPER PRECAUTIONS TO BE USED IN THE ERECTION OF BUILDINGS AND OPENING OF EXCAVATIONS, AND TO CAUSE THE SAME TO BE LIGHTED DURING THE NIGHT.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any district is empowered to make bye-laws (*inter alia*) for the general good rule thereof: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Maldon aforesaid, that when any building materials, rubbish, or other things are laid, or any hole made in any of the streets, whether the same be done by order of the municipal council or not, the person or persons causing such materials or other things to be so laid, or such hole to be made, shall at his or their own expense cause a sufficient light to be fixed in a proper place upon or near the same, and continue such light every night from sunset to sunrise while such materials or hole remain; and such person or persons shall at his or their own expense cause such materials or other things and such hole to be sufficiently fenced and enclosed until such materials or other things are removed or the hole filled up or otherwise made secure. And every such person who fails so to light, fence, or enclose such materials or other things, or such hole, shall, for every such offence, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the said district, forfeit and pay a fine or sum of not exceeding Ten pounds.

And in no case shall any such building materials or other things, or such hole, be allowed to remain an unnecessary time, under a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds to be paid for every such offence, on conviction before two or more justices as aforesaid, by the person or persons who cause such materials or other things to be laid, or such hole to be made; and in any such case the proof that the time has not exceeded the necessary time shall be upon the person or persons so causing such materials or other things to be laid, or causing such hole to be made.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 13, made by the municipal council of Maldon, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF ST. KILDA.

BYE-LAW No. 25.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE FURTHER PREVENTION OF ACCIDENTS BY FIRES WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF ST. KILDA.

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by the municipal council of St. Kilda, in accordance with the provisions of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, to make further regulations for the prevention of accidents by fires: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the said municipal council:—

1. That no person shall be allowed to set fire to any stubble, furze, scrub, or other inflammable material, until notice in

writing be given to the parties owning or occupying property adjoining to the place when such fire shall be made, and to the town clerk or sergeant of police twenty-four hours previous to such fire being made, and that no fire shall be made and continued except between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Four o'clock p.m.

2. That no person shall light or have any fire burning within or upon any yard or premises, whether enclosed or not, for any purpose whatsoever, without first having obtained license or permission from the said council or their duly authorised officer, except such fire be made in a properly constructed fire-place.

3. That no person shall be permitted to keep any stacks of hay, corn or straw, of any description, on premises within the boundary of this municipal district, unless the same be under cover of a shed or building of which no exterior part or covering shall be of canvas, calico, or any other textile fabric, or at a distance of twenty feet from any adjoining building, or three feet from any property not belonging to, or in the occupation of, the owner of such stack or stacks of hay, corn or straw.

4. That it shall be lawful for the said council, or their duly authorised officer, upon complaint, in writing, of any ratepayer, that any chimney, flue or vent, is constructed of improper materials, or that the top of such chimney or flue is not sufficiently elevated or removed from any inflammable materials of which the roof or other portion of the building, or of any adjoining building, is constructed; or that any such chimney or flue is not so constructed as properly to carry up the smoke, so that it becomes a nuisance or dangerous to the neighbors; or if it shall appear to the council or their duly authorised officer necessary at any time, he shall and may, at any reasonable time, proceed to inspect any such chimney or flue, and if he shall find that there is proper ground of complaint, or reasonable cause of danger or nuisance, he or they shall forthwith serve a notice upon the owner or occupier of such premises, calling upon him to alter such chimney, flue or vent, so as to abate and remedy any such danger or nuisance; and it shall not be permitted hereafter to alter, repair, or erect any chimney, flue or vent, of any dangerous or inflammable material, nor of any other than brick, stone, or earthwork of sufficient solidity and proper construction.

5. Any person committing any act against any of the provisions of this bye-law, or refusing or neglecting to comply with directions or regulations contained herein, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

BYE-LAW No. 26.—A BYE-LAW TO PREVENT NUISANCES ARISING FROM BADLY CONSTRUCTED CESSPOOLS, FOR THE PROPER ERECTION OF PRIVIES, AND OTHER REGULATIONS CONNECTED THEREWITH, WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ST. KILDA.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, the preservation of the public health, and the general good rule and management of such municipal district: And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law for the prevention of nuisances arising from badly constructed cesspools, for the proper erection of privies, and other regulations connected therewith: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of St. Kilda, that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, pursuant to said recited Act, that all dwelling-houses now or hereafter to be erected within the municipal district shall be provided with a properly constructed privy and cesspool, the cesspool to be placed at a distance of not less than fifteen feet from any dwelling-house, except by special permission in writing from the said council, or their duly authorised officer; and when such cesspool is sunk below the surface, it shall be built with approved material, closely set so as to prevent the contents from percolating through the walls and saturating the adjoining grounds; that previous to such privies and cesspools being erected, permission in writing shall be obtained from the said council, or their duly authorised officer; and any owner, occupier, or other person erecting any privy or cesspool without obtaining such permission, or refusing or neglecting to erect a properly constructed privy and cesspool for the use of any dwelling-house, now or hereafter to be erected, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds: provided that no proceedings shall be taken under this bye-law unless by the authorized officer appointed by this council.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 25 and 26, made by the municipal council of St. Kilda, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

FIRST HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF AMHERST.

BY clause 43 of the Municipal Institutions Act, 18 Victoria No. 15, it is directed that every municipal council shall within one month from and after the lapse of each six months from the election of chairman of such council publish a full statement in detail of their proceedings, together with a certified account of the receipts and expenditure for the preceding six months, in accordance with which the following, being the first half-yearly report of the municipal council of Amherst, is submitted. The period of this report extends from 19th November, 1858, to 18th May, 1859, both inclusive.

PROCLAMATION.

A petition numerously signed by the householders in the district of Amherst having been duly presented to His Excellency the Governor, praying that the district might be raised into a municipality. His Excellency, by proclamation dated 22nd October, 1858, declared such district a municipal one, under the governance of the municipal council of Amherst.

ELECTIONS.

The district having been duly proclaimed, a public meeting of the householders and residents, presided over by George Chapman, Esq., was held at the Amherst Hotel, on the 17th November, 1858, pursuant to the provisions of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, section 15, at which it was decided—

1st. That the municipal council should consist of seven members.

2nd. That the municipal council should not receive any remuneration.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The council having been informed that the miners in the district were destroying the large waterhole reserved as the only permanent supply of water that can be depended upon by the inhabitants of Amherst and Back Creek, took immediate steps to prevent the destruction thereof, and after some delay succeeded. The feeling of opposition which existed at the time on the part of the miners the council cannot but attribute to their want of information respecting the reservation of the waterhole, and of the great boon which it has been to the district on the occasion of former rushes, particularly in the summer of 1855, when no water for domestic purposes was to be had nearer than the waterhole in question.

A memorial was presented to the council from residents on the Ballaarat and Maryborough road at Back Creek, complaining of the obstruction thereof by parties erecting tents, &c., thereon, and praying that the council would take steps to clear the same, in which they succeeded, and have to thank the parties complained of for the promptitude with which they obeyed the order to remove, and also for the good feeling manifested by them on the occasion.

In conclusion, the council have to anticipate much activity for the ensuing half-year; their organization having become systemized, and their work fairly commenced, they hope shortly to secure to Amherst all the advantages of municipal institutions.
