**NOTICE TO WHOLESALE DEALERS IN WINE, SPIRITS, OR FERMENTED MALT LIQUORS, AND BREWERS.**

NOTICE is hereby given that all persons dealing as above, in quantities of not less than two gallons, upon which the duty has been paid, unless registered in accordance with the Acts 13 Victoria No. 26, and 20 Victoria No. 4, are liable to a fine of £30.

Certificates of Registration will be granted by the clerk of the bench at the place nearest to the residence of such dealer at which a Court of Petty Sessions is established, within a district duly proclaimed under the Act, or at the office of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, at the Immigration office, King street; and any person who shall not have duly paid the legal fees of registration into the Treasury, or to a receiver of revenue, will be deemed or taken to be a person not registered within the meaning of the Act.

**NOTICE TO ROAD CONTRACTORS.**

**FURTHER REGULATIONS PASSED BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.**

THE Board of Land and Works orders that from and after the 1st July next, contractors tendering for works under the Department of Roads and Bridges be required to attend the opening of the tenders in the Board-room, at the Crown Lands Office, either personally or by an authorised agent.

Immediately upon the conditional acceptance of a tender by the Board, the accepted tenderer or his agent shall pay in cash a preliminary deposit of £10 when the amount of the contract is under £1000; or £25 when the amount of the contract exceeds £1000; such sum to be absolutely forfeited in the event of his not entering into the requisite contract agreement within one week.

Contractors will also be required to make such alterations in the schedules to their tenders (not affecting the bulked sum in the body thereof) as may be necessary to bring them into conformity with the specification and general conditions of the contract, and as may be required by the Inspector-General of Roads, failing which such deposit to be in like manner forfeited.

A letter, embodying the abovenamed condition, to be signed by the contractor when paying the amount of the deposit.

**POSTAGE STAMPS.**

EVERY Officer in the department of the Attorney General, in the receipt of postage stamps, is expected to keep an account of them in the following form, namely:—

And to balance the account at the end of every month.

When an officer is removed from any station he is to balance his account, and to take care that the quantity handed over to his successor is correct.

In like manner the officer taking charge is to satisfy himself that the balance he receives agrees in all respects with that appearing in the account; and, should any discrepancies be afterwards discovered, he will be held responsible.

The officer retiring and his successor should go through the account together, and certify conjointly to its correctness.

All requisitions for postage stamps must be transmitted to these offices for approval, and should show the balance in hand on a certain day.

NOTICE TO POUNDKEEPERS.

IT is pointed out for the guidance of Poundkeepers that no claim preferred by persons impounding cattle for damages in excess of the gazetted rates allowed by the Governor can be legally received or entertained by the poundkeeper.

Persons impounding cattle who claim damages in excess of the gazetted rates are to be informed that, under the 32 clause of the Impounding Act, they must elect either to claim the authorised rates only, or to sue the owner of the cattle by which the trespass has been committed for the special damage claimed.

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

BYE-LAW No. 20.—A BYE-LAW FOR SUPPRESSION OF NUISANCES.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances and houses of ill-fame, compelling residents to keep their premises free from offensive matters, the restraining noisome and offensive trades, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it enacted by the council of the municipal district of Sandhurst, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of the colony of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act:—

1. That if any person or persons carrying on the business of a butcher, soap boiler, tallow melter, candle maker, starch manufacturer, bone boiler, tripe boiler, boiler of refuse, tanner, currier or fellmonger, brewer, innkeeper, or any other person, shall permit or suffer any noisome or offensive matter or refuse to run or escape into the formed channels of any street, he or they shall, on conviction thereof before any two justices of the peace having jurisdiction within the said municipality, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

2. That if any person or persons carrying on the business of a soap boiler, tallow melter, candle maker, or boiler of refuse, or any other noisome or offensive trade, business, or manufacture, in any building or premises, shall permit or suffer any stench to arise therefrom, such person or persons shall, on conviction thereof before any two justices of the peace having jurisdiction within the said municipality, forfeit and pay a penalty of Five pounds, if a first offence; and for a second offence, not committed on the same day, a penalty of Ten pounds; and for any subsequent offence, not committed on the same day as any prior offence, a penalty of not less than Twenty pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 20, made by the municipal council of Sandhurst, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

SEYMOUR PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery established at Seymour:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the charges set forth in the schedule A.
3. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.
4. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them.
5. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
6. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
7. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
8. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
9. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees.
10. Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton or other person appointed by the trustees; such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and sunset the previous day.
11. In case an interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the consent in writing of the proprietor must be left with the order.
12. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
13. The processions to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
14. The usual hours for interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months of the year.
15. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the charges set forth in schedule A.
16. The trustees reserve the right to recommend any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
