ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

No. XV.—BYE-LAW TO REGULATE ALLUVIAL MINING IN THE ARARAT DIVISION OF THE ARARAT DISTRICT.—[8th December, 1859.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the mining board room, Ararat, in the said district, on the 8th day of December, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

PROSPECTING.

1. Interpretation clause.—In the interpretation of and for the purposes of the provisions of this bye-law, the following words

shall have the respective meanings hereby assigned them, that is to say:—The term "lead" shall mean the alluvial deposit or washdirt containing gold, running in a continuous course, or occurring successively and repeatedly in spots or pitches; the term "prospectors" shall mean persons engaged in searching for any new or lost lead or deposit of gold, and the act of so doing shall be considered prospecting.

2. *Marking claims.*—Claims must be marked by a conspicuous peg at each end (the upper and the lower) on the supposed course of the lead, and may be of any width not exceeding two hundred (200) yards until the lead be traced through the claim, when the width must be reduced in accordance with clause 4, and a peg must be placed at each corner of the claim, and such pegs shall be at right angles.

3. *Employment of party.*—In dry sinking a shaft must be sunk or worked on the same frontage by each two men in the party, who must have been employed on the claim from the commencement of the working thereof, and any party discovering a lead must report the same to the warden without delay.

4. *Size of claims.*—Prospectors having fulfilled the conditions specified in clause 3 shall be entitled to an extent of claim as provided in the following table:—

Surfacing and Dry Sinking.	Wet Sinking.
New lead within one mile of any previously worked lead, two (2) men, 100 x 200 feet. Four (4) men, 200 x 200 feet. Exceeding one mile 100 x 200 feet for each two (2) men in the party (not to exceed eight (8) men), the 200 feet in each case to be across the course of the lead. Discovering a lost lead, two (2) men, 100 x 100 feet.	New lead not to exceed twelve (12) prospectors, 60 feet for each man along the course of the lead by a width of 200 feet. Discovering a lost lead, four (4) men, 150 feet along the course of the lead by a width of 200 feet.

5. *Machinery.*—On new wet leads, when the amount of water necessitates the employment of steam machinery, parties of twenty-four (24) men shall be recognised, and they may hold ground in the proportion specified in that portion of clause 4 which refers to new leads; they shall also be entitled to hold an additional 10 feet of ground along the course of the lead for each nominal horse power of their engine. On lost leads, parties of twelve (12) men shall be recognised, and may hold ground in the proportion specified in that portion of clause 4 referring to lost leads, together with an additional thirty-five (35) feet along the course of the lead for each nominal horse power of their engine. Parties employing a horse whim on new or lost wet leads shall be entitled to an additional extent of ground equal to that allowed for two miners.

6. *Conditions.*—When prospecting claims have been granted, they shall be worked in accordance with the clauses regulating the class of mining under which they occur, except those which relate to the number of party and size of claim.

DRY SINKING.

7. *Size of claim.*—In surfacing (limited to a depth of eight (8) feet), one miner, 35 feet by 35 feet; in sinking exceeding eight (8) feet, two miners, 50 feet by 50 feet.

8. *Marking off claims.*—Miners marking off claims shall do so by fixing a conspicuous peg at each corner thereof, which must be kept visible during the working of the claim.

9. *Neutral ground.*—Not less than two, or more than three feet of neutral ground shall be left between the adjoining claim by the last party marking off, which may be worked by either of the adjoining claimholders, provided they securely timber the same; any party neglecting to timber the wall will be liable to the penalties specified in clause 69.

10. *Forfeiture of interest.*—All claimholders must be present on their claims every lawful day (after that on which it was taken possession of) two consecutive hours between Nine a.m. and Twelve noon; any miner not fulfilling this condition will be liable to forfeit his share, unless, in case of dispute, he can give sufficient reason to the warden for the same.

11. *Claims may be amalgamated.*—The holders of any two, three, or four adjoining claims may amalgamate them by posting a notice on their claim containing the name of each shareholder and the date and number of his miner's right; the sinking of the shaft shall be commenced within twenty-four (24) hours after amalgamation has been effected, and be continued day and night until bottomed or abandoned.

12. *Ground proving wet.*—Any claims proving wet must be worked as provided in clauses 18, 19, and 20.

WET SINKING.—BLOCK CLAIMS.

13. *Interpretation clause.*—The term "wet sinking" shall mean where water occurs below the surface drift or gravel in sufficient quantities to render slaking necessary.

14. *Size of claims.*—The size of claim shall be as follows:—

4 men	70 feet square
6 men	85 feet square
8 men	100 feet square

15. *Marking off claims.*—Claims shall be marked as specified in clause 8.

16. *Neutral ground.*—Neutral ground must be left as provided in clause 9.

17. *Claims may be amalgamated.*—The holders of any two adjoining claims may amalgamate them by fulfilling the conditions specified in clause 11.

18. *Forfeiture of claims.*—Claimholders within three claims of any claim in which water has been struck shall, without delay, commence to sink their shaft, and must continue to do so during the usual working hours of every lawful day until the "well" is completed or the claim abandoned, except the water proves too heavy and work is struck with the consent of adjoining claimholders; provided that three days from the date of occupation shall have been allowed for making preparations for sinking. Non-compliance with this clause shall render the claim liable to forfeiture.

19. *Claims may be held unworked.*—Beyond the above limits, any party may hold their claim, unworked, by fulfilling the conditions specified in clause 10.

20. *Water baling.*—The owners of any claim neglecting or refusing to bale their fair proportion of water during the day or night, if ordered by the warden, shall render their claim liable to forfeiture.

21. *Removal of slabs.*—When slabs are removed from a shaft in which water has been struck, it must be immediately filled up above the level of the drift by the person or persons removing them.

FRONTAGE LEADS.

22. *Declaration of frontage leads.*—Whenever it may appear expedient to place any wet lead under the frontage system, any one or more miners holding claims on it, may call a public meeting of the claimholders, to be held on the lead in question, between the hours of Nine a.m. and noon; should a majority decide in favor of placing it under the frontage system, the chairman shall at once post a notice on the lead, in the following form:— "We, the undersigned miners, do hereby declare this (here insert name of lead) lead to be a frontage lead, and subject to the bye-laws relating thereto, from and after the date hereof." Such notice shall be signed by the chairman and not less than twenty (20) shareholders, and a copy shall be forwarded to the warden and mining surveyor without delay.

23. *Existing rights.*—Notwithstanding anything herein enacted, the existing rights of any claim owners enjoyed on any lead at the time when it is placed under the frontage system shall in no way be interfered with.

24. *Size of claim—number of party.*—All claims shall be numbered consecutively from No. 1, and shall be of one uniform length of one hundred (100) feet along the course of the lead by a width of one hundred and fifty (150) yards until the lead is struck in the claim; one month after which the width shall be reduced to two hundred (200) feet, and eight men shall constitute a party.

25. *Marking off claims.*—Parties marking out frontage claims shall do so by fixing a conspicuous peg in the ground at each end of the claim (the upper and the lower) on the supposed course of the lead. One month after the discovery of the lead in the claim a peg must be placed at each corner thereof, and such peg shall be at right angles.

26. *Registration of shares.*—Within three days after marking off a claim the owners shall register their names, together with date and number of their miners' rights, with the mining surveyor, or a deputy appointed by him; and the name of each shareholder, with the date and number of his miner's right, must be kept posted on some conspicuous part of the claim during the working thereof.

27. *Transfers.*—Any person to whom a share or interest is transferred must register the same with the mining surveyor or his deputy without delay.

28. *Forfeiture.*—Within four days from the date of marking out, the sinking shall be commenced, and continue all and every lawful day until water is struck, when it shall be proceeded with day and night until night baling becomes unnecessary, except the water proves too heavy, and work is struck with the consent of adjoining claimholders. Non-compliance with this clause will render the claim liable to forfeiture.

29. *Claims may be amalgamated.*—Parties desirous of amalgamating their claims for the purpose of working them by means of machinery, must post on some conspicuous part of their claim a notice in the following form:— "We, the undersigned owners of claims numbered respectively (here insert the number of each claim), hereby give notice that we wish to amalgamate them, and any person objecting to our doing so, must notify the same in writing to us and the warden within eight days from the date hereof." The notice must contain the name of each shareholder, and the number and date of his miner's right, and eight days after posting the notice, unless objected to, the amalgamation shall be allowed.

30. *Objections.*—If it can be proved that any proposed amalgamation would be injurious to the interests of adjoining claimholders, the warden shall disallow it, or allow only a smaller number of the claims to be amalgamated.

31. *Certificate.*—Within twenty-four hours after amalgamation has been effected, application must be made to the warden, who shall grant a certificate of the amalgamation specifying the time allowed for the erection of machinery.

32. *Machinery.*—Any party intending to erect a steam engine shall be entitled to an additional fifteen (15) feet along the course of the lead for each nominal horse power of the engine; provided that after a reasonable time has been allowed for the erection thereof it must be in work on the claim, or the additional ground shall be forfeited.

33. *Protection to furnishers of machinery.*—Any person supplying machinery for working a claim shall be protected in the interest he may hold by virtue of such machinery, and shall be entitled to the gold due to such interest.

34. *Owner of machinery may take possession of abandoned claim.*—Should any claim on which machinery has been erected be abandoned by the working shareholders, the owner of the machinery may take possession and continue the working thereof by means of hired labor or otherwise; provided that within one month from the date on which the working shareholders forfeited their interest the claim shall continue to be worked by the full number of men, and in the manner prescribed by this bye-law.

35. *Giving notice on striking the lead.*—Parties striking the lead must give notice thereof to the adjoining claimowners; any party neglecting to do so shall be liable to the penalties specified in clause 69.

36. *Other clauses applicable.*—Clauses 9, 20 and 21, shall apply to frontage leads.

OLD WORKINGS.

37. *Interpretation of clause.*—The term "old workings" shall mean ground on which a number of shafts have been sunk, and for the greater part undermined or worked out for at least three months.

38. *Size of claim.*—The extent of claim shall be for each man forty (40) feet along the course of the lead, with full width thereof.

39. *Tunnels and tramways.*—Any party cutting a tunnel or laying down a tramway not less than two hundred and fifty (250) feet in length, may hold possession of it, together with a wall of six (6) feet on each side thereof, and shall be entitled to an additional hundred (100) feet along the course of the lead, with full width thereof; any person injuring a tunnel or tramway while the owners are in possession, shall be liable to the penalties specified in clause 69.

40. *Right to cross other tramways or claims.*—A tramway may cross any other tramway or claim, unless valid objections be made by the owners thereof.

41. *Horse whims.*—Any party erecting a whim shall be entitled to an additional hundred (100) feet of ground along the course of the lead, with full width thereof.

42. *Steam power.*—Any party of not less than eight (8) men, intending to erect a steam engine, shall be entitled to an additional forty (40) feet of ground along the course of the lead, with full width thereof, for each nominal horse power of such engine. This clause shall only apply to wet leads that have been opened at least twelve months.

43. *Conditions on which claims may be held unworked.*—Extended claims may be held unworked while the owners are engaged in cutting their tunnel, constructing dam, puddling machine, or other casements in connection therewith; or if the supply of water be insufficient to carry on the working of the claim, the owners may, by posting a notice to that effect (containing their names and the date and number of their miners' rights) on their claim, hold it unworked until sufficient water be obtained, within four days after which work must be resumed, or their claim shall be liable to forfeiture.

44. *Extended claims must be registered.*—All extended claims must be registered with the mining surveyor, and the name of each shareholder, with the date and number of his miner's right, must be kept posted on the claim; and any miner may, by permission of the warden, take possession of any unoccupied share in any claim, subject to any reasonable amount of expense that may be due thereon, the amount if disputed to be settled by arbitration.

45. *Forfeiture of claims.*—Claims, if left unworked for four days without permission of the warden, will be deemed abandoned.

46. *Other clauses applicable.*—Clauses 8, 9, 20, 33 and 34, shall apply to old workings.

WATER PRIVILEGES.

47. *Application for water privilege.*—Any person or persons desirous of obtaining a grant for the exclusive right to any site for a water privilege shall make application to the warden in the following form:—"I (or we) hereby request that you will grant to me (or us) the possession of (specify the site applied for) as a water privilege for puddling purposes, in accordance with the bye-law of this district relating thereto" (names in full of the whole party, together with the date and number of their miners' rights). A copy of the above notice, legibly written, must be kept posted on the site applied for seven days prior to the granting of the application; if no valid objection (in writing) be made within the seven days, the site applied for may be granted, and any transfer must be registered with the mining surveyor.

48. *Extent of dams.*—The extent of dam, where machinery is used, shall not exceed two hundred and fifty (250) feet square above the main embankment; where machinery is not employed, the extent shall be one hundred (100) feet.

49. *Sludge.*—Where machinery is employed, a second embankment for the purpose of retaining the sludge shall be constructed not more than one hundred and fifty (150) feet below the main embankment, except it can be more conveniently carried off by drainage without injuring other persons, or running into old ground.

50. *Injury to property by dams.*—Any dam breaking away and injuring the property of others, the owner or owners of such dam shall be liable for any injury sustained thereby, unless it can be proved to the satisfaction of the warden that such breaking away did not result from the faulty construction of the dam.

51. *Site proving auriferous.*—When the site occupied by a dam shall prove auriferous, the warden may order it to be mined upon, and parties benefited shall, before breaking the ground, compensate the owners for any injury sustained.

52. *Drains.*—When a sludge or water drain is made across any road in general use, a substantial bridge, not less than fourteen (14) feet in width, must be constructed and kept in repair by the owner of the drain.

53. *Penalty for defiling or carting away water.*—Any person driving cattle into or in any way defiling or carting away the water from any dam without the consent of the owner, shall be liable to the penalties specified in clause 69.

54. *Forfeiture of dams.*—The site of any dam not commenced within seven (7) days from the date of grant, or not completed in a reasonable time, or any dam unoccupied for a month during sufficient supply of water, shall be deemed forfeited, and may be taken possession of by any person by permission of the warden.

55. *Waterholes reserved.*—Waterholes, reservoirs, or springs, may be reserved by the warden for domestic purposes, but no monopoly of any spring shall be allowed.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

56. *Forfeiture of claims.*—Claims bottomed and left unworked for forty-eight (48) hours without permission of the warden (except where specially provided for) shall be deemed abandoned.

57. *Effacing notices or removing pegs.*—Any person who shall efface, alter, remove, or destroy any notice posted on a claim, or willfully remove the pegs thereof, shall be liable to the penalties specified in clause 69.

58. *Injury to claims.*—Any person cutting a drain into a shaft, or removing earth from around it, without making a sufficient embankment to prevent water running into it, shall be liable for all damages resulting therefrom.

59. *Oversized claims.*—Any miner may measure the surface area of any claim, and should there be too much ground may take possession of the excess on either side he may prefer.

60. *Disputed shares or claims.*—Any miner intending to take possession of a disputed claim or share in a claim, must first obtain the authority of the warden.

61. *Slabs.*—Any person or persons removing slabs from, or taking possession of, a shaft abandoned less than a month, shall be liable to the owners for the value of the slabs; slabs left more than one month in an abandoned shaft shall be deemed forfeited.

62. *Absence from claim.*—Any miner leaving his share unrepresented by a competent miner, may have his place supplied by a majority of the other shareholders, and shall be responsible for any reasonable wages due to the person employed.

63. *Justifiable absence.*—Any miner whose absence from his claim is caused by illness, or attendance on a sick person, or court of justice, or by urgent business, may hold his share unworked for any reasonable time.

64. *Holidays.*—Miners may be absent from their claims on all the following days, viz.:—Good Friday to Easter Tuesday both inclusive, 24th December to 2nd January both inclusive, any day on which the election of a member for the legislative or mining board of this district may take place, the day before and the day after such election, and any day proclaimed a holiday by the warden.

65. *Partnership.*—Whenever two or more miners join for the purpose of obtaining gold, they shall be deemed partners, and each member of such partnership shall be protected in any interest he may hold in any claim they may occupy until the partnership be dissolved by mutual consent, or any act that shall make it null and void.

66. *Presence of partners.*—It shall not be necessary for all partners to be present at the marking out of claims, or at the commencement of any work deemed to be to the interest of such partnership; their being previously associated for mining purposes shall entitle each member to a full share in any claim marked out by any of the partners, provided no agreement has been made for any unequal distribution.

67. *Forfeiture of interests.*—Any miner forfeiting his interest in a claim shall not be entitled to any portion of his former partners' interest therein.

68. *Deceased partners.*—The surviving partners of any deceased miner may hold and work his interest for the benefit of his representative.

69. *Penalty for breach of bye laws.*—In accordance with the provisions of the Gold Fields Act, any person who shall infringe any bye law of this mining board shall be liable for every such offence to be fined in any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

70. *Repeal of former bye laws.*—From and after the date on which this bye-law shall come into operation, the bye laws of the Ararat mining board mentioned in the schedule hereunto an-

nixed, shall be, and the same are hereby repealed, so far as they relate to the Ararat division.

MUNICIPALITY OF KYNETON.

FOURTH REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 10TH DECEMBER, 1859, INCLUSIVE.

MEETINGS.

DURING the half-year the council have held twenty-three general and two special meetings; and three meetings lapsed for want of a quorum. The late chairman, councillor Kenworthy, attended twelve meetings; councillors Bland, twenty; J. Thomson, twenty-five; Kelly, twenty-three; Fitzgerald, twenty-three; Healy, nineteen; R. D. Thompson, five; and Dickinson and Douglas (elected to supply vacancies) eight each out of ten meetings.

PUBLIC WORKS.

Completed.—Two miles of footpaths, making in all nearly seven miles of footpaths now completed.—Eleven chancelled street crossings—two chains of road in Epping street, and a culvert at the junction of Mollison and High streets.

In Progress.—Metalling of thirty-two chains of road in Baynton street, and twenty chains in Ebdon street.—Formation of about twenty-three chains of road in Hutton street, and twenty-one chains in Hutton street, and placing quarry rubbish thereon as a temporary substitute for metal; and fencing the Botanical Garden Reserve.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

Renewed applications for Gaol, Post Office, Money Order System, &c.—A Government Post Office has been opened in Mollison street, and the Money Order System established.

For the Mollison street bridge, over the Campaspe River.—£2500 placed on the estimates.

For grant in aid of Mechanics' Institute.—To be considered when estimates prepared.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The office of inspector of nuisances has been abolished, as being unnecessary.

The various unproclaimed streets in the municipality have been gazetted.

The council have used every endeavor to bring the north deviation railway question to a successful issue, by deputations to the Government and otherwise, and with every prospect of the wishes of the inhabitants being granted.

On the 1st September last B. Kenworthy, Esq., resigned the chair and his seat in the council. Councillor Kelly was appointed chairman in his stead.

On the 3rd of October last councillors Dickinson and Douglas were elected to fill the vacancies in the council occasioned by the absence of councillor R. D. Thompson, and the resignation of the late chairman, councillor Kenworthy.

Mr. Praagst having failed to carry out an agreement, the terms of which had been definitely arranged for lighting the town with gas, a fresh treaty has been commenced with the directors of the gas company for the like purpose, but the agreement has not yet been concluded.

The council has been in communication with Mr. Hadley, M.L.A., with a view to induce the Government to establish waterworks for the town, and also to obtain its proper share of the Government grants for 1857 and 1858, of which it was unjustly deprived. The result is not yet known.

The annual election in the place of councillors J. Thomson, Dickenson and Douglas retiring by rotation, took place on the 10th instant, when councillors Menzies, Dickenson, and Kenworthy were elected.

The half-yearly statement of receipts and expenditure duly audited appears at foot.
